Dear Governor Daniel:

I have your letter of April 16 and its attachment which reflect your strong views on continuance of security restrictions in Guam.

You have my full assurance that these measures will be removed at the earliest moment they prove no longer essential to national safety. In this, however, we must be satisfied beyond doubt. As you know, the subject is under careful evaluation in the Department of Defense and its conclusions will be reviewed by my staff. I know that you will have the same confidence in their collective judgment that I have.

Your impatience to relieve the Territory of Guam from an infringement on personal freedom is fully appreciated. I can only counsel that you recognize the serious responsibilities imposed on our fellow public servants to assure that our defense posture is fully protected.
