

**PROPOSED PROVISIONS FOR CITIZENS
OF THE TRUST TERRITORY OF THE PACIFIC ISLANDS**

I. We should extend to citizens of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands most of the rights and privileges of non-citizen nationals of the United States without according them exact political status. This means exempting them from the following sections of the Immigration and Nationality Act:

- (a) All quota restrictions;
- (b) Visa and passport requirements;
- (c) Inadmissibility provisions;
- (d) Limitations on period of residence;
- (e) Limitations on employment;
- (f) Limitations on entry and exit;
- (g) Registration and periodic reporting requirements.

II. We should accord products of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands duty-free entry. This might be done by considering the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands, for purposes of the tariff act, "an insular possession."

III. We should permit citizens of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands to become licensed radio operators on ships registered in the United States.

As early determination should be made as to which of the above
provisions should be given priority.
