The High Commissioner of the Trust Territory of the Pacific has complete responsibility for governing the Territory. Delegation of statutory authority from the Secretary is complete. The Territory has more than 80,600 inhabitants on small islands spread ever an area equivalent to that of the U.S. The immediate tank is to bring off a complete social, political and economic revolution in the Islands without compromising the U.S. security interest in the area.

Immediate goals for the High Commissioner are:

- 1. To provide basic benefits of education, health, housing and ecommunity services for all or most of the scattered population.
- 2. Develop the political climate for an affirmation plebiscite on personnent affiliation with the 3.5.
- 3. Bevelop economy of the area so that it will be an self-difficient as possible.

He will have to:

- 1. Recruit and hold a competent staff.
- 2. Set a \$100 to \$200 million capital improvement program through Congress and constructed in the next five years.
- 3. Sovers the Marritory justly and fairly, mining the support of the population for a permanent affiliation with the U.S.
- 4. Find new fast solutions for old insoluble economic and social problems of the Islands because of the heterogenity, reparation and spathy of the native population.
