

VIRST REQUIAR SESSION

ACT NO. 25-1966 INTRODUCED BY HON. DANIEL T. HUMA, SAIPAN

AN ACT TO MEQUIRE AN OFFICIAL PLENESCITE THEOGENOUT THE MARIANA ISLANDS DISTRICT TO ASCERTAIN THE WIGHES OF THE PROPLE NELATIVE TO THE FUTURE POLITICAL STATUS OF THE MARIANA ISLANDS DISTRICT

IN IT MACTED BY THE 20D. MARIANA ISLANDS DISTRICT LEGISLATURE, THAT:

Scotion 1. Purposes. It is the declared purpose of this Act to have the people of the Mariana Islands District determine the future political status they desire on or before December 31, 1967, as between integration, independence or free association. It is believed that time has some when the "pres" and "cons" of the alternatives regarding our future should be openly discussed in order that a meaningful decision might be made. It is the purpose of this Act to invalidate the Trustocship Agreement as it relates to the Mariana Islands District, no later than January 1, 1969.

Socian 2. An efficial plobincite shall be conducted throughout the Mariana Islands District no later than December 31, 1967, to be administored under the jurisdiction and control of the District Administrator. The District Administrator shall transmit a certified copy of the results of this plobiscite to the United Matians and the United States Department of State.

Section 5. The seculte of the official plotiscite required horounder shall be the final future political status of the Mariana Islands District, and the people thereof, shall not be governed under any different political system.

- Section 4. The District Administrator shall be responsible for preparing all tally abouts, ballots, lists of qualified voters, and other materials necessary to earry cut the purposes of this Ast. He shall also have the power to make such rules and regulations as he doesn necessary for the orderly conduct of this plebiscite.
- Section 5. There is hereby appropriated out of any unappropriated surplus of the General Fund the sum of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars to earry out the purposes of this Act.
