## 2. Project Descriptions

## Motor Vehicle Repair - 6 Volunteers

The six motor mechanics will be assigned one each to the six districts and will be working under the district public works officer. The public works officer is responsible for the maintenance, overhaul, and repair of all mechanical and electrical equipment in the district. Each district has a mepair shop and facilities for field maintenance of heavy equipment such as bulldozers, cranes, compressors, generators, etc. The Volunteer mechanic will be working primarily on this type of equipment both on the construction site and in the district maintenance facility.

The Volunteers will serve as regular heavy equipment mechanics and will be supervised by and will report to the public works officer. The hand tools and other equipment required by the mechanics are available at the district repair shops and the need for Peace Corps purchase of any job related equipment is not apparent at this time.

The Volunteers should have either (a) some formal vocational training in motor mechanics plus at least two years of on-the-job experience, or (b) have at least two years of college and extensive experience in either hot rod or other amateur automotive experience. A mix of about half of the motor mechanic Volunteers Volunteers with the experience listed in (b) would be most desirable.

# <u>Volunteer Secretaries</u> - 3 Volunteers

Volunteer secretaries must have the following qualifications:

- 40-60 words per minute typing speed.
- 2. Some formal vocational training in clerical work above the high school level or at least two years of on-the-job experience.
- 3. A shorthand speed of 80 words per minute is desirable but not mandatory. Volunteers over the age 21 are preferred.
