a house joint resolution

Requesting the High Commissioner, through the Secretary of the Department: Interior, to petition the President of the United States of America to establish a Concision to ascertain the political desires of the people of Micronesia, and to develop and reconrend procedures and courses of political education and action, with such alternatives as may be applicabile and appropriate, to lead to the attainment of such desires and determination of the political status of Ucronesia.

WHEREAS, the Micronesian people should freely excercise their sovereign right of self-determination as set forth in the Trusteeship Agreement between the United Nations and the government of the United States of America; and

WFERISAS, the Congress of Micronesia believes that this generation of Micronesian should have an early opportunity to determine the ultimate constitutional and political status of Micronesia; and

WHERI:AS, such determination should be made on the basis of meaningful proposals of the political and constitutional alternatives open to the people of Micronesia; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Congress of 仿cronesia, Second Regular Session, 1966, the Senate concurring, that the High Commissioner, and through him the Secretary of the Department of the Interior, be and are hereby enjoined to use their good offices to petition the President of the United States of America to establish a commission to consult the popple of Micronesia to ascertain their wishes and views, and to study and critically assess the political alternatives open to Micronesia; and,
 to the President of the United States of America no later then December 31, 1968.
