SUBJECT: Legal Education

Some three months ago we were in on the legal education workshop in Guam, at which time certain assignments for legal education were made. With several of our colleagues preparing to depart this summer we wanted to get a reading on what has been happening. Particularly, since the International Legal Committee is interested in our efforts and is standing ready to assist, if needed.

Would you please be kind enough to give us the feedback on:

1. The extent of legal education you are engaged in presently, and/or have prepared to offer in the near future.
2. The personnel, the functions and the numbers of persons involved.
3. The curriculum used. Is it standardized for all districts?
4. The materials or outlines that need to be compiled and made available.
5. The materials and/or outlines you have developed.
6. The response and problems you are meeting.
7. Assistance you would appreciate receiving.
8. The support of the TI legal offices (courts, public defender, attorney general).
9. The legal scholarship prospects in your district.

Your response to this request for information, gentlemen, will assist us in moving beyond the Guam conference in plans for the legal needs in Micronesia and how Peace Corps can assist in a more developmental manner.
