SUBJECT: Justice Burnett's Visit to Washington

Enclosed is a copy of a letter that was sent to Joe Kennedy as well as a brief proposal developed by the Judicial Branch to cover [REDACTED] job as a Volunteer.

Mel Mirkin had all of the documentation. I will assume nothing further needs to be done in this area.

Chief Justice Burnett has worked very well with Peace Corps and has been very supportive of our programs. Possibly Dana would be interested in talking with him as well as Joe. Possibly all three of you could get together if Chief Justice Burnett is able to make it to the Peace Corps office. I know he is very interested in doing so, but he is unaware of his obligations as far as Interior is concerned.

He may request other Volunteers to expand this program as legal education seems to be a greater felt need by the people of Micronesia at this time.

Possibly you could contact [REDACTED] once Chief Justice Burnett makes an appointment with Peace Corps and try to find out where you may reach him during the time Chief Justice Burnett will be in the Peace Corps office. Chief Justice Burnett said it might be feasible to stop by [REDACTED] on his way back. I am not sure if this would be necessary unless he raises the possibility while in Washington.
