In response to Mr. Rommel's communication of December 11, 1970, we have examined enrolled bill 8 3479 "to amend section 2 of the Act of June 30, 1954, as amended, providing for the continuance of civil government for the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands."

Although the Department of State defers to Interior for detailed comments as to the size and duration of the increased appropriation necessary to achieve the goals which Interior has set for its administration of the Trust Territory, we fully and enthusiastically endorse those goals and would approve enactment of S 3479.

From a foreign policy standpoint, the improvements made possible by the increased appropriations will not only help fulfill our obligations as the Trust Territory Administering Authority, but will help erase long-standing and acknowledged weaknesses in our administration which have been the subject of international attention. The statement of the US Special Representative to the 37th session of the UN Trusteeship Council that, on the basis of advanced planning, increased appropriations were being sought from the United States Congress was welcomed by the Council in the conclusions and recommendations adopted by it and forwarded to the Security Council.

# An Act

To amend section 2 of the Act of June 30, 1954, as amended, providing for the continuance of civil government for the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That section 2 of the Act of June 30, 1954 (68 Stat. 330), as amended, is amended by deleting "for fiscal year 1969, \$5,000,000 in addition to the sums heretofore appropriated, for fiscal year 1970, \$50,000,000 and for the fiscal year 1971, \$50,000,000, and inserting in lieu thereof the following: "for each of the fiscal years 1971, 1972, and 1973, \$60,000,000."
