Morton Says He Plans Steps To Ease Micronesia Problem

WASHINGTON, March 11—Secretary of the Interior Rogers C. B. Morton told Congress today that the United States had "dragged its feet" in relations with Micronesia and that he intended to take "new initiatives" to resolve differences with the sprawling Pacific Territory.

Micronesia is made up of more than 1,000 tiny islands and atolls and is inhabited by about 100,000 people. The territory was taken from Japan in World War II and is officially a United Nations Trust Territory administered by the United States through the Interior Department.

Reflecting concern over deteriorating relations between the United States and Micronesia, Mr. Morton said that he hoped to develop a "consortium" within the Government that was not dominated by the Departments of Interior, Defense and State. He told the House Interior Committee, "It seems to be a problem we can't get a handle on."

He said he hoped to meet with territorial leaders and get an agreement that would settle the future political status of the strategic area and to step up economic development of the islands. Conflicts among the three departments over the future of Micronesia have risen in the past and had to be settled by the White House.

He also indicated that he wished to bring Congress closer to the problem of Micronesia. The Micronesians have rejected a United States offer of commonwealth status, and the Uni-

ted States has turned down a self-governing "free association" with the Federal Government. The Departments of Interior, State and Defense have also rejected independence as an alternative.

The question of Micronesia arose several times as the Secretary was questioned by committee members after outlining his plans for reorganization of the Interior Department to make it more "dynamic," upgrade its personnel and make it more responsive to the public interest. It was his first appearance before the committee on which he served for six years as a Representative from Maryland.

He indicated later in his first news conference as Secretary that there would be personnel changes in various areas, and some promotions. He told newsmen that he intended to pay "a great deal of attention to personnel" and to "recruit young people."

He also told the House committee that he planned to ask Congress to create the post of Assistant Secretary for Indian Affairs, a move that also would take in the Office of Territories, which deals with Micronesia. In less than 10 days, he said, he will send to Congress the Administration's bill to settle the land claims of Alaskan natives. This will be done, he said, after further review with Vice President Agnew and the White House staff.

He declined to go into details of the Administration bill, saying, "If we get into details we'll be here until the cows gives beer."

California Computer Off
Six of the ten most heavily traded stocks declined; three advanced and one was unchanged. The biggest loser in the active list was California Computer Products, which dropped 2 1/2% to 28 1/2 on 67,300 shares.

Suave Shoe fell a point to 23 1/2. The company announced a secondary offering of 433,700 common shares at 22 1/2 a share for the account of certain stockholders.

Another weaker issue was Certron Corporation, which dropped 3/4 to 6 1/2. The maker of magnetic tape products reported a loss for the January quarter of \$680,000, compared with a \$338,000 profit, including a special gain, for the corresponding period the year before.

E. T. Barwick dipped 1/2 to 57 1/2. The carpet manufacturer said it lost \$1,288,000 in the January quarter, contrasted to a profit of \$1,080,368 in the year-ago period. The most recent quarter excludes a special credit of \$687,175.

Among the other losers, LaMaury fell 1 1/2 to 2 1/2 and Kleinert's dropped 3/4 to 28 3/4. Resisting the downward pressure, Trans-Lux Corporation advanced 3/4 to 26 3/4. The company said its directors approved a two-for-one stock split to be paid May 28 to holders of record as of May 14.

Other gainers included The New York Times, which rose 1 1/2 to 26 1/2, and Angelica, which added 3/4 to 30 3/4.

The over-the-counter market finished mixed in moderate trading.
