REPRESENTATIVES OF THE TERRITORIAL POLITICAL STATUS QUESTIONS. REPRESENTATIVES OF THE TERRITORIAL POLITICAL PARTY IN THE MA-RIANAS DISTRICT ARE ALSO PLANNING TO ATTEND THE HEARINGS OF THE TRUSTEESHIP COUNCIL. FORMER CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA REPRESENTA-TIVE FELIX RABAULIMAN, WHO IS ALSO PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED CARO-LINIAN ASSOCIATION ON SAIPAN, AND TERRITORIAL PARTY PRESIDENT JESUS MAFNAS, BOTH DEPARTED FOR THE US MAINLAND OVER THE PAST WEEKEND TO ATTEND THE COUNCIL SESSION. MAFNAS INDICATED THAT HE AND RABAULIMAN ARE GOING TO NEW YORK TO OBSERVE AND LISTEN TO THE TESTIMOMY OF MARIANAS DISTRICT LEGISLATURE PRESIDENT VICENTE N. SANTOS WHO IS TO PRESENT A POSITION OF THE DISTRICT LE-GISLATURE REGARDING LAND PROBLEMS IN THE MARIANAS.

MAFNAS ADDED, "IF SANTOS SEEMS TO BE PUSHIJG CESSATION OF THE MARIANAS (FROM THE TRUSTEESHIP) WE WILL ASK IF WE CAN BE ALLOWED TO SPEAK. WE WILL INFORM THE UN COUNCIL THAT SANTOS IDEAS DO NOT REFLECT THE WISHES OF ALL OF THE PEDPLE OF THE MARIANAS."

SAIPAN MAY 24 (MNS)---THE TRUST TERRITORY IS WELLION ITS WAY TOWARD MAKING ITS DECISIONS ON TOURISM DEVELOPMENT WITHIN EACH DIS-TRICT. THIS IS THE REPORT OF MIKE ASHMAN, TT TOURISM SPECIALIST, FOLLOWING A SERIES OF MEETINGS IN THE TERRITORY'S SIX ADMINISTRATIVE DISTRICTS,

IN AN INTERVIEW WITH MICRONESIAN NEWS SERVICE, ASHMAN NOTED THAT THE MARSHALL ISLAND NITIJELA THIS MONTH BECAME THE FOURTH DIS-TRICT TO ESTABLISH A TOURIST COMMISSION TO GUIDE THE DEVELOPMENT OF

TOURISM. THE MARIANAS, YAP: AND: PALAU DISTRICTS ALREADY HAVE OFFI-CIAL TOURISM ORGANIZATIONS: AND THE TRUK AND PONAPE LEGISLATURES ARE EXPECTED TO CONSIDER SUCH LEGISLATION DURING THEIR NEXT REGULAR SES-SIONS.

"THIS WILL PLACE THE DECISIONS SQUARELY IN THE HANDS OF THE PEOPLE OF THE DISTRICTS," HE SAID, ADDING, "THIS IS IMPORTANT BECAUSE IT APPEARS EACH DISTRICT VIEWS TOURISM DIFFERENTLY. WITH ACTIVE TOURIST COMMISSIONS, THE DIRECTION AND THE AMOUNT OF TOURIST DEVE-LOPMENT CAN BE TAILOR-MADE FOR EACH AREA."

"THERE IS GREAT OPTIMISM CONCERNING HOTEL DEVELOPMENT," THE TOURISM OFFICIAL OBSERVED. "WHERE WE NOW HAVE SOME 433 HOTEL ROOMS IN ALL OF THE TRUST TERRITORY, IF EVERYONE WHO IS CONSIDERING BUILD DING A HOTEL FOLLOWS THROUGH WITH CONSTRUCTION, WE WOULD HAVE OVER 2,000 ROOMS. THAT'S MORE THAN TWICE AS: MANY HOTEL ROOMS: AS: GUAM HAS AT THE PRESENT TIME."

ASHMAN SAID HE CAUTIONED BUSINESSMEN AGAINST OVERLOOKING THE ECONOMIC POTENTIAL OF MARINE RESOURCES AND AGRICULTURE.

"IN EACH DISTRICT I WAS: ASKED BY PEOPLE: "HETHER TOURISM IS GO ... ING TO DESTROY THE CULTURE OF MICRONESTA," HE REPORTED. "I TRIED TO POINT OUT THAT THE WORLD'S CULTURES: ARE CONTINUALLY CHANGING
