# Apollo 15 Heads For Moon--A-OK

CAPE KENNEDY, Florida, (UPI)—Apollo 15 rocketed toward the moon today in man's most ambitious deep space expedition, a 45 million dollar, 12-day adventure towering mountains and a deep canyon in quest of elusive evidence to the lunar beginning.

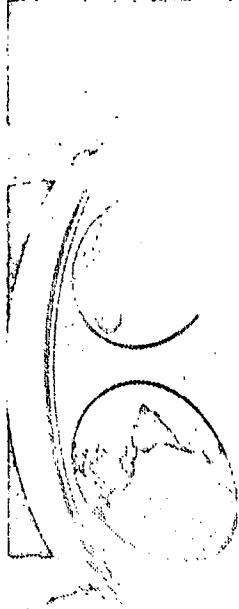
Col. David R. Scott, Maj. Alfred M. Worden and Lt. Col. James B. Irwin took off in the name of science on the 11th anniversary of the Saturn 5 rocket's first flight. The engines generating 160 million horsepower.

Apollo 15 left Earth scheduled at 9:34 a.m. sending a thundering roar as it climbed the marshlands as it climbed slowly into the partly cloudy sky toward a preliminary orbit around earth.

Scott, veteran of two space flights, coolly reported "Rolling on" as the 363-foot space module started its initial climb.

Brilliant orange flames from the rocket as it curved over the Atlantic. The Space Shuttle is an estimated 1 million feet above the ground on hard to watch.

At two minutes after launch, the main stage fell away and the engines on the
