

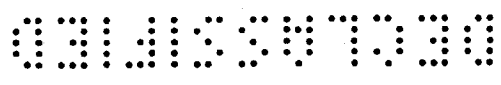

A HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

Repealing Senate Joint Resolution No. 32 of the Third Congress of Micronesia relative to the appointment and retention of Professor Harrop A. Freeman of New York.

1 WHEREAS, Senate Joint Resolution No. 32 adopted on August
2 23, 1969, did appoint and retain Professor Harrop A. Freeman to
3 "represent, defend and enforce the rights and interests of the
4 people of Micronesia"; and

5 WHEREAS, in a letter dated October 18, 1971, said Professor
6 Harrop A. Freeman stated that he wished to resign his appointment
7 as per Senate Joint Resolution No. 32; now, therefore,

8 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Fourth
9 Congress of Micronesia, Second Regular Session, 1972, the Senate
10 concurring, that Senate Joint Resolution No. 32 of the Third
11 Congress of Micronesia, Second Regular Session, 1969, relative to
12 the appointment and retention of Professor Harrop A. Freeman of
13 New York be and it hereby is repealed; and

14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this House
15 Joint Resolution be transmitted to Professor Harrop A. Freeman,
16 the President of the Security Council of the United Nations, the
17 President of the United States, the President of the Senate and
18 the Speaker of the House of Representatives of the United States
19 Congress, the United States Secretaries of Defense, State, and
20 the Interior, and the High Commissioner of the Trust Territory.

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A HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

Respectfully requesting the Secretary of the United States Department of Defense through the High Commissioner to release the present Mobil Bulk Plant site on Saipan Island, Mariana Islands District, from its current retention area status under the United States Navy and to allow Mobil Oil Micronesia, Incorporated to construct additional tanks and other facilities on this site in order to efficiently serve the Micronesian people.

1 WHEREAS, in 1966 Mobil Oil Micronesia, Inc. by contract with
2 the Trust Territory Government agreed to provide petroleum products
3 to all of the districts of the Trust Territory and to meet the
4 petroleum requirements of the Government and people of Micronesia;
5 and

6 WHEREAS, in 1967 and in 1970 additional tankage has been
7 constructed on this bulk plant site in order to meet the growing
8 petroleum requirements of the Government and private individuals
9 and corporations on Saipan; and

10 WHEREAS, in May of 1970, Mobil Oil Micronesia, Inc. was
11 informed that additional construction on this site must be
12 approved by the United States Navy through the High Commissioner;
13 and

14 WHEREAS, Mobil requested Navy approval to construct an
15 additional 420,000-gallon tank for the storage of jet fuel needed
16 to satisfy the requirements of the additional flights expected to
17 come into Saipan during 1971; and

18 WHEREAS, the original request was followed by several
19 repeated requests for approval through the High Commissioner's
20 office as well as one request for approval made directly to the
21 Navy; and

22 WHEREAS, all requests for approval have been refused by the

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1 Navy who have indicated that Mobil may not construct additional
2 tankage or other facilities on this site; and

3 WHEREAS, Mobil may be forced to refuse jet fuel to the
4 additional flights expected in Saipan if Mobil is not permitted
5 to construct this additional 420,000-gallon tank to provide the
6 necessary stock cover; and

7 WHEREAS, the rapidly developing economy of all of Micronesia
8 requires a dependable and adequate supply of petroleum products
9 in order to sustain and spur this economic development so vital
10 to the future of Micronesia; and

11 WHEREAS, Mobil Oil Micronesia, Inc. has made every effort to
12 provide the petroleum products in every district of the Trust
13 Territory necessary to meet all demands for such products by the
14 public and private sectors of the economy of Micronesia; now,
15 therefore,

16 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Fourth
17 Congress of Micronesia, Second Regular Session, 1972, the Senate
18 concurring, that the Secretary of the United States Department
19 of Defense through the High Commissioner be and is hereby respect-
20 fully requested to release the present Mobil Bulk Plant site on
21 Saipan Island, Mariana Islands District, from its current status
22 as a United States Navy Retention Area and to allow Mobil Oil
23 Micronesia, Inc. to erect a 420,000-gallon tank and such other
24 tankage and facilities on this site as Mobil may deem necessary
25 to meet the needs of the Micronesian people; and

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1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Joint
2 Resolution be transmitted to the Secretaries of the United States
3 Departments of Defense, State, and the Interior and to the High
4 Commissioner.

A HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

Respectfully urging the United States Congress to amend the United States Code and the Secretary of the Interior to amend Secretarial Order No. 2913 to require that the Congress of Micronesia be included in the process of selecting the High Commissioner, the Deputy High Commissioner, the Chief Justice, and Associate Justices of the Trust Territory.

1 WHEREAS, it is the internationally recognized responsibility
2 of the United States in its Trusteeship Agreement with the United
3 Nations to promote the political development of the Trust Territory
4 of the Pacific Islands which by consequence includes greater
5 participation of Micronesians in the decision-making processes;
6 and

7 WHEREAS, the High Commissioner has before the United Nations
8 Trusteeship Council and before joint sessions of the Congress of
9 Micronesia repeated the theme that "major decisions affecting
10 the present and future welfare of Micronesia shall be made in the
11 Trust Territory by Micronesians"; and

12 WHEREAS, the High Commissioner, pursuant to Title 48, Section
13 1681a of the United States Code, is appointed by the President by
14 and with the advice and consent of the Senate of the Congress of
15 the United States; and

16 WHEREAS, the Deputy High Commissioner and the Chief and
17 Associate Justices of the Trust Territory, pursuant to Secretarial
18 Order No. 2918, are appointed by the Secretary of the Department
19 of the Interior of the United States; and

20 WHEREAS, selection of the aforementioned officials of the
21 Trust Territory is considered a major decision affecting the
22 present and future interests and welfare of the Territory in which

1 Micronesians, through their elected representatives, have never
2 been and are not at present included; and

3 WHEREAS, it is the sense of the Congress of Micronesia that
4 Micronesians ought to be consulted and their advice, opinions, and
5 experiences should be taken into consideration in the process of
6 selecting said chief officials of the Executive and Judicial
7 Branches of the Trust Territory Government; now, therefore,

8 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Fourth
9 Congress of Micronesia, Second Regular Session, 1972, the Senate
10 concurring, that the Congress of the United States be and is hereby
11 respectfully urged to amend Title 48, Section 1681a of the United
12 States Code to require that the Congress of Micronesia be included
13 in the process of selecting the High Commissioner; and

14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Department
15 of the Interior also be and is hereby respectfully urged to amend
16 Secretarial Order No. 2918 for the same purpose regarding the
17 selection of the Deputy High Commissioner, the Chief and Associate
18 Justices of the Trust Territory; and

19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this House
20 Joint Resolution be transmitted to the President and to the
21 Secretaries of the Departments of the Interior and State of the
22 United States; to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of
23 the House of Representatives and to the Chairmen of the Senate
24 and House Committees on Interior and Insular Affairs of the Congress
25 of the United States; to the Secretary General and the Presidents

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1 of the Security and the Trusteeship Councils of the United Nations
2 and to the High Commissioner, and the Chief Justice of the Trust
3 Territory.

A HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

Respectfully requesting the Secretary of the Department of State through the High Commissioner and the Secretary of the Department of the Interior to seek associate membership for the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands into the Economic Commission of Asia and the Far East.

1 WHEREAS, Micronesia has been placed by the United Nations
2 under the United States of America as set forth in the Trustee-
3 ship Agreement for the Former Japanese Mandated Islands; and

4 WHEREAS, the Charter of the United Nations specifically
5 recognizes the sacred trust of Members of the United Nations which
6 have assumed responsibilities for the administration of terri-
7 tories whose peoples have not yet attained a full measure of
8 self-government "to ensure . . . their . . . economic . . .
9 advancement . . ." and "to promote constructive measures of
10 development, . . . and to cooperate with one another and, when
11 and where appropriate, with specialized international bodies with
12 a view to the practical achievement of the social, economic, and
13 scientific purposes set forth" in Chapter XI of the Charter of
14 the United Nations; and

15 WHEREAS, the Economic Commission of Asia and the Far East
16 (ECAFE) is widely known for its outstanding efforts in assisting
17 and in promoting economic development in countries in the Far
18 East and the Pacific; and

19 WHEREAS, increased assistance and technical expertise is
20 needed for accelerated economic development for Micronesia as
21 noted in the Report on Economic Development in the Trust Territory
22 of the Pacific Islands prepared by the House of Representatives

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1 Standing Committee on Resources and Development of the Congress
2 of Micronesia; and

3 WHEREAS, the Trust Territory of Papua-New Guinea has set a
4 precedent for the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands for
5 seeking assistance and technical expertise from the specialized
6 "international bodies" of the United Nations by becoming an
7 associate member of ECAFE through the efforts of its Administer-
8 ing Authority; now, therefore,

9 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Fourth
10 Congress of Micronesia, 1972, the Senate concurring, that the
11 concepts and principles governing the operations and functions of
12 the Economic Commission for Asia and the Far East be and are here-
13 by endorsed by the Congress of Micronesia as essential for the
14 economic development of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands;
15 and

16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Department
17 of State of the United States of America acting in behalf of the
18 Administering Authority for the Trust Territory of the Pacific
19 Islands, through the High Commissioner of the Trust Territory of the
20 Pacific Islands and the Secretary of the Department of the Interior
21 be and is hereby respectfully requested to request the Economic
22 Commission for Asia and the Far East to admit the Trust Territory
23 of the Pacific Islands into their membership as an associate mem-
24 ber; and

25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this House

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1 Joint Resolution be transmitted to the President of the United
2 States of America, the Secretary of the Department of State, the
3 Secretary of the Department of the Interior, the Secretary General
4 of the United Nations, the President of the Trusteeship Council,
5 the Secretary General of the Economic Commission for Asia and
6 the Far East, and the High Commissioner.
