Respectfully requesting the Secretary of the United States Department of Defense through the High Commissioner to release the present Mobil Bulk Plant site on Saipan Island, Mariana Islands District, from its current retention area status under the United States Navy and to allow Mobil Oil Micronesia, Incorporated to construct additional tanks and other facilities on this site in order to efficiently serve the Micronesian people.

- WHEREAS, in 1966 Mobil Oil Micronesia, Inc. by contract with
- 2 the Trust Territory Government agreed to provide petroleum products
- 3. to all of the districts of the Trust Territory and to meet the
- 4 petroleum requirements of the Government and people of Micronesia;
- . 5 and
  - 6 WHEREAS, in 1967 and in 1970 additional tankage has been
- 7 constructed on this bulk plant site in order to meet the growing
- 8 petroleum requirements of the Government and private individuals
- and corporations on Saipan; and
- . 10 WHEREAS, in May of 1970, Mobil Oil Micronesia, Inc. was
- 11 informed that additional construction on this site must be
- approved by the United States Navy through the High Commissioner; 12
- 13 and
- 14 WHEREAS, Mobil requested Navy approval to construct an
- 15 additional 420,000-gallon tank for the storage of jet fuel needed
- 16 to satisfy the requirements of the additional flights expected to
- 17 come into Saipan during 1971; and
- 18 WHEREAS, the original request was followed by several
- 19 repeated requests for approval through the High Commissioner's
  - 20 office as well as one request for approval made directly to the
- 21 Navy; and
- 22 WHEREAS, all requests for approval have been refused by the

- 1 Navy who have indicated that Mobil may not construct additional
- 2 tankage or other facilities on this site; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Mobil may be forced to refuse jet fuel to the
- 4 additional flights expected in Saipan if Mobil is not permitted
- 5 to construct this additional 420,000-gallon tank to provide the
- 6 necessary stock cover; and
- WHEREAS, the rapidly developing economy of all of Micronesia
- 8 requires a dependable and adequate supply of petroleum products.
- 9 in order to sustain and spur this economic development so vital
- 10 to the future of Micronesia; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Mobil Oil Micronesia, Inc. has made every effort to
- 12 provide the petroleum products in every district of the Trust
- 13 Territory necessary to meet all demands for such products by the
- 14 public and private sectors of the economy of Micronesia; now,
- 15 therefore,
- BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Fourth

- 12 . WHEREAS, the High Commissioner, pursuant to Title 48, Section
- 13 1681a of the United States Code, is appointed by the President by
- 14 and with the advice and consent of the Senate of the Congress of

- 16 WHEREAS, the Deputy High Commissioner and the Chief and
- 17 Associate Justices of the Trust Territory, pursuant to Secretarial

Respectfully requesting the Secretary of the Department of State through the High Commissioner and the Secretary of the Department of the Interior to seek associate membership for the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands into the Economic Commission of Asia and the Far East.

- 1 WHEREAS, Micronesia has been placed by the United Nations
- 2 under the United States of America as set forth in the Trustee-
- 3 ship Agreement for the Former Japanese Mandated Islands; and
- 4 WHEREAS, the Charter of the United Nations specifically
- 5 recognizes the sacred trust of Members of the United Nations which
- 6 have assumed responsibilities for the administration of terri-
- 7 tories whose peoples have not yet attained a full measure of
- 8 self-government "to ensure . . . their . . . economic . . .
- 9 advancement . . . " and "to promote constructive measures of
- 10 development, . . . and to cooperate with one another and, when
- 11 and where appropriate, with specialized international bodies with
- 12 a view to the practical achievement of the social, economic, and
- 13 scientific purposes set forth" in Chapter XI of the Charter of
- 14 the United Nations; and
- WHEREAS, the Economic Commission of Asia and the Far East
- 16 (ECAFE) is widely known for its outstanding efforts in assisting
- 17 and in promoting economic development in countries in the Far-
- 18 East and the Pacific; and
- 19 WHEREAS, increased assistance and technical expertise is
- 20 needed for accelerated economic development for Micronesia as
- 21 noted in the Report on Economic Development in the Trust Territory
- 22 of the Pacific Islands prepared by the House of Representatives

- 1 Standing Committee on Resources and Development of the Congress
- 2 of Micronesia; and
- 3 WHEREAS, the Trust Territory of Papua-New Guinea has set a
- 4 precedent for the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands for
- 5 seeking assistance and technical expertise from the specialized
- 6 "international bodies" of the United Nations by becoming an
- 7 associate member of ECAFE through the efforts of its Administer-
- 8 ing Authority; now, therefore,
- 9 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Fourth
- 10 Congress of Micronesia, 1972, the Senate concurring, that the
- 11 concepts and principles governing the operations and functions of
- 12 the Economic Commission for Asia and the Far East be and are here-
- 13 by endorsed by the Congress of Micronesia as essential for the
- 14 economic development of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands;

- 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Department
- 17 of State of the United States of America acting in behalf of the
