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(ENIWETOK RETURN)

SAIPAN, APRIL 18, (MNS) --- HIGH COMMISSIONER EDWARD E. JOHNSTON AND U.S. AMBASSADOR FRANKLIN HAYDN WILLIAMS HAVE ISSUED A JOINT ANNOUNCE MENT INDICATING THAT THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT IS PREPARED TO RETURN ENIMETOK ATOLL TO THE TRUST TERRITORY AT THE END OF \$973.

ENIMETOK ATOLL IS ONE OF THE AREAS OF THE MARSHALL ISLANDS DIS-

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WHERE THE UNITED STATES HAS BEEN INVOLVED IN DEFENSE RESEARCH AND
DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS SINCE 1946. THE PEOPLE OF THE ATOLL WERE RELOCATED TO OTHER ISLANDS IN THE MARSHALLS. AND HAVE RECENTLY ANNOUNCED
THEIR INTENTION TO RETURN TO THEIR HOME ISLANDS BY THE END OF THIS
YEAR.

IN THE STATEMENT ISSUED TUESDAY (APRIL 18), HIGH COMMISSIONER JOHNSTON AND AMBASSADOR WILLIAMS SAID THAT FUTURE MICRONESIAN LAND NEEDS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE WERE SET FORTH IN THE THIRD ROUND OF STATUS NEGOTIATIONS WHICH TOOK PLACE IN HAWAII LAST YEAR. "THERE AMBASSADOR WILLIAMS STATED THAT IN REGARD TO...SECURITY RELATED LAND REQUIREMENTS IN THE MARSHALLS, THE NEED FOR RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES AT KWAJALEIN WOULD NOT DISAPPEAR IN THE FORESEEABLE FUTURE." THE STATEMENT ADDED, HOWEVER, THAT AMBASSADOR WILLIAMS FURTHER NOTED THAT "IT MAY SOMEDAY BECOME POSSIBLE TO CONSOLIDATE OUR TESTING ACTIVITIES IN THE PACIFIC AND CONCURRENTLY REDUCE OUR LAND INTERESTS IN THE MARSHALLS."

THE ANNOUNCEMENT SAID THAT "THE STATUS OF ENIMETOK HAS BEEN UNDER STUDY BY THE VARIOUS DEPARTMENTS AND AGENCIES IN THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT EVER SINCE THE POSSIBILITY OF RETURNING BIKINI ATOLL WAS FIRST CONSIDERED. OVER THE YEARS, THE DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE HAS

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BEEN STRIVING TO BRING ITS WORK ON ENIWETOK TO A CLOSE. (NOW) THE
UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT HAS IN FACT BEEN ABLE TO STRUCTURE ITS RE-



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SEARCH PLANS AND PROGRAMS IN SUCH A WAY TO PERMIT AN EARLY RETURN OF THE ATOLL TO THE PEOPLE OF ENIMETOK."

HIGH COMMISSIONER JOHNSTON TELEPHONED MARSHALLS DISTRICT ADMINISTRATOR OSCAR DEBRUM LATE TUESDAY AFTERNOON TO ANNOUNCE THE RETURN OF THE ATOLL, AND INDICATED THAT THE U.S. GOVERNMENT AND THE TRUST TERRITORY ADMINISTRATION WILL BEGIN IMMEDIATELY TO WORK WITH THE PEOPLE OF ENIWETOK ON A TIMETABLE AND OTHER PLANS FOR A REHABILITATION PROGRAM.

IN THIS REGARD, THE HICOM NOTED THAT DEPUTY HIGH COMMISSIONER PETER T. COLEMAN WILL ACCOMPANY AMBASSADOR WILLIAMS ON HIS TRIP THROUGH THE EASTERN DISTRICTS, ENDING IN MAJURO WHERE HE WILL BEGIN MEETINGS WITH ENIWETOKESE AT THE DISTRICT CENTER. COLEMAN ALSO PLANS TO OVERFLY THE ENIWETOK COMPLEX ON HIS WAY TO AN INSPECTION OF BIKINI ATOLL, WHERE THE AGRICULTURAL REHABILITATION OF THAT FORMER ATOMIC TESTING SITE IS NOW BEING CLOSED OUT.

THE HICOM SAID THAT! AT SOME FUTURE DATE THE LEADERS OF ENIMETOK WILL BE INVITED TO BIKINI TO OBSERVE THE REHABILITATION PROGRAM THERE IN ACTION. HE SAID FURTHER THAT THE PEOPLE OF ENIMETOK WILL BE

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CONSULTED AT EVERY STEP ALONG THE WAY IN THE REHABILITATION PROGRAM.

DISTAD DEBRUM SAID THAT HE WAS DEEPLY GRATEFUL TO THE HIGH COMMISSIONER AND AMBASSADOR WILLIAMS FOR THEIR LONG AND HARD EFFORTS TO
EXPEDITE THE RETURN OF THE ATOLL TO THE PEOPLE. HE SAID HE LOOKED
FORWARD TO MEETING WITH DEPUTY HICOM COLEMAN LATER IN THE WEEK AND
TO BEGINNING THE PLANNING FOR THE REVERSION OF ENIWETOK TO THE TRUST
TERRITORY SO THAT THE REHABILITATION PROGRAM COULD GET UNDERWAY.

ACCORDING TO THE JOINT ANNOUNCEMENT RELEASED TUESDAY, IT WILL BE NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT THE SAME TYPE OF SURVEY, CLEANUP AND REHABILISTATION PROCEDURES THAT HAVE BEEN USED AT BIKINI. "AS AN INITIAL STEP, THE ANNOUNCEMENT SAID, "THE U.S. PLANS TO COMMENCE THE SURVEY OF THE ATOLL PROBABLY LATE THIS SUMMER. THE CLEANUP AND REHABILITATION OF THE THREE ISLANDS---PARRY, JAPTAN AND ANIYAANII---IN THE SOUTHEASTERN PART OF THE ATOLL, WILL RECEIVE FIRST PRIORITY."

PRIOR TO THE RETURN OF ENIMETOK TO TRUST TERRITORY JURISDICTION BY THE END OF 1973. THE ANNOUNCEMENT SAID: "THE UNITED STATES IS COMPLETING SOME RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT TESTING ON THE ATOLL WHICH WILL NOT INVOLVE NUCLEAR DETONATIONS OF ANY TYPE. THESE TESTS WILL IN NO WAY INTERFERE WITH AN EARLY COMMENCEMENT OF THE REHABILITATION PROCESS AND WILL BE COMPLETED BY THE END OF 1973."

SAIPAN, APRIL 18, (MNS) -- MARIANAS SENATOR OLYMPIG T. BORJA HAS BEEN APPOINTED CHAIRMAN OF THE SPECIAL JOINT COMMITTEE CONCERNING RONGELAP AND UTIRIK ATOLLS. OTHER MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE ARE RE-PRESENTATIVE HANS WILLIANDER OF TRUK AND REPRESENTATIVE TIMOTHY OLKERIIL OF PALAU.

THE SPECIAL JOINT COMMITTEE CONCERNING RONGELAP AND UTIRIK WAS CREATED UNDER PUBLIC LAW 4C-33, WHICH AUTOMATICALLY BECAME LAW MARCH 26. THE COMMITTEE IS CHARGED WITH THE RESPONSIBILITY TO INVESTIGATE THE EFFECTS OF IRRADIATION ON THE PEOPLE OF RONGELAP AND UTIRIK ATOLLS

AND WILL ATTEMPT TO SECURE ANY AND ALL MEDICAL ASSISTANCE POSSIBLE FOR

THE PEOPLE OF THE AFFECTED ATOLLS. IT IS ALSO CHARGED WITH THE RESPONSIBILITY FOR OBTAINING COMPENSATION FOR THE PEOPLE OF RONGELAP AND UTIRIK FOR THE INJURIES WHICH THEY SUFFERED DUE TO EXPOSURE TO IRRADIATION.

ACCORDING TO SENATOR BORJA. THE SPECIAL COMMITTEE HAS BEGUN INITIAL

HEARINGS INTO THE RONGELAP AND UTIRIK SITUATION ON SAIPAN. ON MONDAY THE COMMITTEE CALLED ON DR. WILLIAM PECK, IT HEALTH SERVICESDIRECTOR,

AND DR. HAYAKAWA OF JAPAN FOR SOME BACKGROUND INFORMATION ON THE OVER

ALL SITUATION OF THE AFFECTED PEOPLE.

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CGFMPAC COMCBPAC NAVFACENGCOM HDQTRS PACDIVNAVFACENGEOM HICOM LNO HONOLULU

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(SPECIAL COMMITTEE CHAIRMAN CONTO)

BOTH MEN ACCOMPANIED THE RECENT AEC MEDICAL TEAM TO RONGELAP. THAT

TEAM WAS NOT ABLE TO CONDUCT ITS EXAMINATIONS.

BORJA INDICATED THAT THE ADMINISTRATION PLANS TO SEND A NEW MEDICAL

TEAM CONSISTING OF A DOCTOR FROM THE WORLD HEALTH ORGANIZATION: ONE FROM JAPAN AND ONE FROM THE U.S. ATOMIC ENERGY COMMISSION. HE ALSO NOTED THAT THE COMMITTEE IS SERIOUSLY CONSIDERING A TRIP TO JAPAN TO

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OBSERVE RADIATION VICTIMS AND SEEK POSSIBLE ASSISTANCE FROM CONSULTANTS IN JAPAN. HE SAID IF THERE SHOULD BE A TRIP, IT COULD BE IN THE EARLY PART OF JUNE.

THE SENATOR FURTHER STATED THAT ACTUAL INVESTIGATION AND OTHER COMMITTEE WORK RELATING TO RONGELAP AND UTILITY ATOLLS WILL COMMENCE FOLLOWING THE SUBMISSION OF AN INTERIM REPORT TO THE CONGRESS ON MAY 10, 1972. THE FINAL REPORT WILL BE SUBMITTED DURING THE NEXT REGULAR SESSION OF CONGRESS, EARLY NEXT YEAR.

BORJA SAID REPRESENTATIVES ATAJI BALOS AND CHARLES DOMNICK OF THE MARSHALLS WILL BE ACCOMPANYING THE SPECIAL COMMITTEE AS RESOURCE PEOPLE AND INTERPRETERS, IN ADDITION TO BRYAN FARLEY, CONGRESS OF MICRONESIAN RESEARCHER.

(BOY DROWN ON SAIPAN)

SAIPAN, APRIL 18, (MNS) -- A FIVE-YEAR-OLD BOY DROWNED SOMETIME MONDAY EVENING (APRIL 17) IN THE OCEAN OFF CHALAN KANDA ON SAIPAN, THE YOUNGSTER WAS IDENTIFIED AS JOSEPH C. AGUON, SON OF MR. AND MRS. JUAN AGUON OF CHALAN KANDA DISTRICT TWO.

ACCORDING TO A POLICE REPORT, JOSEPH AND TWO OTHER YOUNGSTER WERE BOATING AND SWIMMING IN THE LAGOON, JUST OFF THE AREA KNOWN AS "SUGAR DOCK" AT ABOUT 4:00 P.M. THEY WERE USING A MAKESHIFT TIN BOAT,

THE BOY'S BODY WAS FOUND TUESDAY MORNING IN DEEP WATER, BEYOND THE LAGOON REEF, BY TWO FISHERMEN.

FREE ASSOCIATION WITH THE UNITED STATES. WITH THE END OF THIS ROUND OF TALKS, WE FIND OURSELVES CLOSER THAN WE HAVE EVER BEEN TO SELF-GOV

ERNMENT IN MICRONESIA.

ESSENTIAL PARTS OF ANY FUTURE STATUS. AT HANA, THE TWO DELEGATIONS ARRIVED AT SUBSTANTIAL AGREEMENT ON THE FIRST THREE OF THESE FOUR

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CRUCIAL ISSUES. FIRST, THE DELEGATIONS AGREED AT HANA -- AND REAFFIRM-

ED AT KOROR -- THAT THE COMPACT WE NEGOTIATE IS AN EXPRESSION OF MICRO-

NESIAN SOVEREIGNTY, OF OUR PEOPLE'S RIGHT TO SELF-DETERMINATION, THE RIGHT TO FREELY CHOOSE OUR POLITICAL FUTURE. SECONDLY, THE DELEGA-TIONS

AGREED THAT MICRONESIANS HAD THE RIGHT TO ADOPT A CONSTITUTION AND LAWS.

WHICH ARE CONSISTENT WITH THEIR OWN NEEDS. THIRD, THE DELEGATIONS AGREED THAT THE PEOPLE OF MICRONESIA SHOULD HAVE CONTROL OF THEIR LAND.

ONLY THOSE BASES AND OPTIONS WHICH WERE NEGOTIATED AS PART OF THE COMPACT WOULD FALL UNDER U.S. AUTHORITY. OTHERWISE, ONLY MICRONESIAN

WOULD OWN MICRONESIAN LAND AND ONLY MICRONESIANS WOULD EXCERCISE THE

POWER OF EMINENT DOMAIN.

"THE PROGRESS MADE AT HANA IN SECURING RECOGNITION OF MICRONESIA'S RIGHT TO SELF-DETERMINATION, TO CONTROL OF LAWS, TO BASIC OWNERSHIP OF

LAND, LEFT ONE LARGE AREA OF DISAGREEMENT TO BE SETTLED IN PALAU.
THIS

WAS THE ISSUE OF TERMINATION, OF HOW -- AND BY WHOM 4- ANY FUTURE COM

PACT BETWEEN THE UNITED STATES AND MICRONESIA MIGHT BE ENDED. AT WARLA

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THE UNITED STATES PROPOSED THAT TERMINATION REQUIRE THE CONSENT OF BOTH SIDES. AT HANA, AND AT KOROR, THE MICRONESIAN DELEGATION MAINTAINED THAT UNILATERAL TERMINATION -- BY EITHER SIDE, WITHOUT THE OTHER SIDE'S CONSENT -- WAS AN ESSENTIAL SAFEGUARD OF MICRONESIAN'S RIGHTS.

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"WHILE INSISTING ON MICRONESIA'S NEED TO CONTROL ITS POLITICAL
DESTINY, THE MICRONESIAN DELEGATION ALSO RECOGNIZED THE UNITED STATES
NEED TO BE ABLE TO MAKE PLANS ON A LONG-RANGE BASIS AND TO BE CONFIDENT OF A STABLE PRESENCE IN THE PACIFIC.

"THE MICRONESIAN DELEGATION PRESENTED AN APPROACH DESIGNED TO

MODATE THE INTERESTS OF BOTH SIDES. IN ITS ESSENTIAL PRINCIPLES IT WAS ACCEPTED BY BOTH SIDES. AS SLIGHTLY MODIFIED DURING NEGOTIATIONS

THE TERMINATION PROPOSAL HAS FOUR MAIN FEATURES.

"ONE: TO ENSURE THAT THE RELATION OF FREE ASSOCIATION IS GIVEN A FAIR TEST, THE COMPACT BETWEEN THE UNITED STATES AND MICRONESIA WILL BE

TERMINABLE BY MUTUAL CONSENT ONLY DURING AN INITIAL PERIOD OF YEARS. THE MICRONESIAN SIDE PROPOSED THAT THIS PERIOD SHALL LAST FIVE YEARS. THE UNITED STATES PROPOSED A PERIOD OF FIFTEEN YEARS. FURTHER NEGOTION.

TIONS ON THIS POINT WILL BE NECESSARY.

"TWO: AFTER THE INITIAL PERIOD HAS PASSED, THE COMPACT WILL BECOME UNILATERALLY TERMINABLE BY EITHER THE UNITED STATES OR MICRONESIA. "THREE: IN MICRONESIA, TERMINATION WOULD REQUIRE A VOTE OF THE

CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA AND THE PEOPLE OF MICRONESIA.

"FOUR: IF THE COMPACT IS TERMINATED AND THE RELATIONSHIP OF FREE

ASSOCIATION BETWEEN THE UNITED STATES AND MICRONESIA IS ENDED,

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A SECURITY TREATY WILL SPECIFY THE TERMS OF CONTINUED AMERICAN PRESENT

CE IN MICRONESIA. THIS SECURITY TREATY WILL HAVE BEEN NEGOTIATED PRIOR

TO THE BEGINNING OF THE COMPACT.

"MANY DETAILS OF TERMINATION REMAIN TO BE NEGOTIATED, BUT THE MICRONESIAN DELEGATION WELCOMED THE UNITED STATES ACCEPTANCE OF MICRONES

NESIAN DELEGATION WELCOMED THE UNITED STATES ACCEPTANCE OF MICRONESIA

BASIC RIGHT DULY TO TERMINATE ANY COMPACT IT ENTERS.

"THE MICRONESIAN DELEGATION BELIEVES THAT UNITED STATES ACCEPTANCE OF MICRONESIA'S RIGHT OF UNILATERAL TERMINATION, COMBINED WITH PRE-

ACCEPTANCE OF MICRONESIA'S RIGHT TO SELF-DETERMINATION AND MICRONESIA

CONTROL OF LAWS AND LANDS, CONSTITUTE THE BASIS OF AN EVENTUAL AGREES MENT WITH THE UNITED STATES. MICRONESIA'S FOUR BASIC PRINCIPLES AND LEGAL RIGHTS HAVE BEEN RECOGNIZED.

"BOTH DELEGATIONS RECOGNIZED THE NEED FOR A SMOOTH AND ORDERLY TRAN-

SITION FROM THE CURRENT TRUST TERRITORY GOVERNMENT TO THE NEW GOVERNMENT OF MICRONESIA. IT WAS AGREED THAT AN EARLY STEP IN TRANSITION WOULD BE THE CALLING OF A CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION TO DETERMINE THE FORM OF FUTURE GOVERNMENT. A NUMBER OF INTERIM STEPS OVER THE TRANSI

TION PERIOD: WOULD PROVIDE: FOR THE GRADUAL PHASING OUT OF THE CURRENT GOVERNMENT AND THE ORDERLY ASSUMPTION OF EXECUTIVE POWER BY THE NEW GOVERNMENT.

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THE UNITED STATES DELEGATION DID NOT BELIEVE DETAILED DISCUSSION OF THE

LEVEL OF SUPPORT AND COMPENSATION TO BE GRANTED MICRONESIA BY THE UNITED STATES WOULD BE APPROPRIATE AT THIS STAGE OF NEGOTIATIONS.

MICRONESIAN DELEGATION PROPOSED THAT THE FINANCING FURNISHED BY THE UNITED STATES MIGHT BE DIVIDED INTO FOUR BASIC AREAS. THESE WERE:
"ONE: THE CONTINUING ECONOMIC SUPPORT TO BE PROVIDED MICRONESIA DURING ITS TRANSITION FROM TRUSTEESHIP TO ECONOMIC INDEPENDENCE.



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"TWO: COMPENSATION FOR THE AGREEMENT BY MICRONESIA TO DENY THE USE OF ITS LAND AND WATERS TO MILITARY FORCES OF ANY NATION OTHER THAN THE UNITED STATES.

"THREE: PAYMENT FOR THE CONTINUING RIGHT TO USE SPECIFIED LAND

WATERS FOR U.S. MILITARY BASES AND OPERATIONS, AND "FOUR: PAYMENT FOR SPECIFIC RENTALS FOR MILITARY USE OF LAND AND TERRITORIAL WATERS, AND OPTIONS ON SPECIFIC LAND AND TERRITORIAL WATERS.

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"MANY DETAILS, AND SOME LARGE ISSUES, REMAIN TO BE DEALT WITH INFUTURE MEETINGS WITH UNITED STATES REPRESENTATIVES. IT IS CLEAR, FOR INSTANCE, THAT ALL OF THE ABOVE UNDERSTANDINGS DEPEND ON AGREEMENT OF THE NATURE OF FINANCING.

"APART FROM THE MATTER OF FINANCING, THERE REMAIN SOME QUESTIONS ABOUT THE UNITED STATES ATTITUDE TOWARD MICRONESIAN SOVEREIGNTY. THE UNITED STATES POSITION APPEARS TO RECOGNIZE MICRONESIAN SOVEREIGNTY ONLY INSOFAR AS IT RELATES TO THE MAKING OF THIS COMPACT. THE UNITED STATES DECLINES TO ACKNOWLEDGE ANY INHERENT SOVEREIGNTY ON THE PART OF

EITHER THE PEOPLE OR THE FUTURE GOVERNMENT OF MICRONESIA. THIS RESERV

VATION ON THE PART OF THE UNITED STATES MAY YET CREATE SERIOUS PROBLEMS
FOR THE NEGOTIATIONS. ALSO, WHILE IT WAS GENERALLY AGREED BY BOTH SIDES THAT THE UNITED STATES SHOULD HAVE BROAD AUTHORITY IN THE FIELDS

OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS AND DEFENSE, THERE REMAIN SERIOUS PROBLEMS WITH RE

FERENCE TO THE EXACT SCOPE AND NATURE OF SUCH AUTHORITY -PARTICULARLY
IN THE FIELD OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS.

"DESPITE THE WORK THAT REMAINS AHEAD, HOWEVER, THE MICRONESIAN

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DELEGATION BELIEVES THAT SOME BASIS FOR AGREEMENT HAS ALREADY BEEN ESTABLISHED. WHEN THESE NEGOTIATIONS BEGAN, MICRONESIA WAS A TRUST TERRITORY AND THERE WERE THOSE WHO WOULD HAVE HAD IT REMAIN SO.

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THE FIRST SUBSTANTIAL UNITED STATES OFFER WOULD HAVE MADE MICRONESIA A

TERRITORY: THE NEXT WOULD HAVE MADE IT A COMMONWEALTH. THESE WERE NOT ACCEPTABLE PROPOSALS. BUT NOW, AT LAST, WE SEE THE EMERGENCE OF A NEW

AND UNIQUE POLITICAL STATUS: A SELF-GOVERNING MICRONESIA IN FREE ASSO-

CIATION WITH THE UNITED STATES. IT IS A STATUS THE MICRONESIAN DELEM-GATION BELIEVES CAN BE RECOMMENDED TO THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA AND THE UNITED STATES AND TO THE REOPLE OF BOTH NATIONS & AN HONORABLE END TO THE TRUSTEESHIP AND THE BEGINNING OF A NEW NATIONAL LIFE IN MICRONESIA."
