SAIPAN, MAY 100 (MNS) --- A JOINT-USE AGREEMENT FOR SAIPAN'S ISLEY AIRFIELD WAS OFFICIALLY SIGNED TUESDAY (MAY9) ON SAIPAN. THE AGREEMENT, BETWEEN THE U.S. MILITARY AND TRUST TERRITORY GOVERNMENT, OPENS THE WAY FOR THE GOVERNMENT TO BEGIN MAJOR REHABILITATION WORK ON THE OLD BOMBER STRIP. PLANS CALL FOR ISLEY TO EVENTUALLY BECOME THE PRINCIPLE COMMERCIAL AIRPORT

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FOR SAIPAN, WITH THE PRESENTLY-USED KOBLER FIELD TO BE ABANDONED ISLEY FIELD WAS TURNED INTO A B-29 BOMBER BASE BY THE U.S. FOLLOWING THE CAPTURE OF SAIPAN DURING THE SECOND WORLD WAR. IT HAS BEEN THE SITE OF A SMALL JAPANESE FIGHTER STRIP, BUT THE AMERICANS, IN A MAJOR CONSTRUCTION OPERATION, TURNED THE FIELD ALMOST OVERNIGHT INTO A COMPLEX OF TWO, 8,700 FOOT RUNWAYS AND ADJACENT TAXIWAYS AND PARKING AREAS. THE BASE WAS ONE OF TWO DEVELOPED AT THE SOUTH END OF SAIPAN BY THE U.S. MILITARY, THE OTHER BEING KOBLER, WHICH IS A SINGLE, 7,000 FOOT RUNWAY ORIGINALLY BUILT AS A FIGHTER STRIP.

IN 1949 THE MILITARY PHASED ISLEY FIELD OUT OF USE, AND OVER A PERIOD OF YEARS THE AREA HAS SLOWLY REVERTED BACK TO THE JUNGLE. MOST OF THE PAVEDAREAS ARE OVERGROWN NOW, BUT THE TWO RUNWAYS REMAIN REMARKABLY CLEAR AND ONE WOULD BE USED AS THE BASE FOR THE NEW AIRPORT RUNWAY, WHICH UNDER PRESENT PLANS WOULD BE EXTENDED TO AN ULTIMATE LENGTH OF 10,600 FEET. THIS WOULD GIVE SAIPAN AN AIRPORT CAPABLE OF HANDLING THE LARGEST COMMERCIAL AND MILITARY PLANES.

THE AGREEMENT SIGNED THIS WEEK IS A MODIFICATION OF THE ORIGINAL "USE AND OCCUPANCY AGREEMENT" DATED JULY 9, 1944. IT

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WILL PERMIT THE TRUST TERRITORY GOVERNMENT AND THE UNITED STATES,
AS CO-TENANTS, TO USE JOINTLY THE ISLEY FIELD FACILITIES FOR

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MILITARY, CIVILIAN, COMMERCIAL AIR CARRIER AND/OR GENERAL AVAIATION SERVICE OPERATIONS AND FOR RELATED COMMERCIAL AND

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INDUSTRIAL PURPOSES.

A PUBLIC HEARING IS SCHEDULED TO BE HELD ON SAIPAN NEXT MONTH TO CONSIDER THE ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT OF THE ISLEY FIELD REHAPILITATION PROJECT. THIS IS A NECESSARY STEP IF THE GOVERNMENT IS TO OBTAIN U.S. FEDERAL AIRPORT CONSTRUCTION FUNDS TO AIDE IN FINANCING THE WORK. THE ADVERSE ENVIRONMENTAL EFFECTS APPEAR TO BE MINIMAL, HOWEVER, ACCORDING TO A STATEMENT PREPARED BY THE RALPH M. PARSONS COMPANY OF HONOLULU AT THE REQUEST OF THE GOVERNMENT.

THE CONCLUSION OF THE REPORT IS THAT THE MAJOR IMPACT ON THE PHYSICAL ENVIRONMENT WILL BE THE LOSS OF TANGAN-TANGAN. OTHERWISE. THERE IS LITTLE OF AGRICULTURAL VALUE WITHIN THE AREA PROPOSED FOR THE NEW AIRPORT, NOR ARE THERE ANY MAJOR HISTORICAL SITES, FARMS OR VILLAGES. THOSE ACCESS ROADS TO SUCH PLACES AS OBYAN BEACH AND THE ANCIENT ORYAN CHAMORRO SETTLEMENT WHICH WILL HAVE TO BE CLOSED WILL BE COMPENSATED FOR BY OPENING UP NEW ROADS.

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THE REPORT SAYS "THE REDEVELOPMENT AND ACTIVATION OF ISLEY FIELD WILL ALLOW SAIRAN TO MEET THE DEMANDS OF THE AIR TRANSPORTATION INDUSTRY THROUGH THE YEAR 1990. THE REMOVAL OF AIR TRAFFIC FROM KOBLER AIRFIELD TO ISLEY FIELD WILL REDUCE NOISE LEVELS NEAR THE HEAVIER POPULATED AREA OF SAIRAN." AND THE REPORT POINTS OUT THE ALMOST SELF-EVIDENT IMPACT THE PROGRAM WILL HAVE ON SAIRAN'S FASTEST GROWING INDUSTRY. TOURISM.

"THE MAJOR IMPACT ON THE HUMAN ENVIRONMENT WILL BE THE INCREASED NUMBER OF TOURISTS VISITING SAIPAN," THE REPORT SAYS. THE NEW ISLEY FIELD FACILITIES WILL ALLOW A PEAK OF 240 PASSENGERS AN HOUR TO BE COMFORTABLY HANDLED. THE REPORT NOTES THAT IN 1971, JUST UNDER SEVENTY THOUSAND PASSENGERS WERE MOVED THROUGH KOBLER FIELD, ALONG WITH NEARLY A MILLION TONS OF AIR CARGO. BY 1975 THIS IS EXPECTED TO INCREASE TO 221,000 PASSENGERS, AND TWO AND A HALF MILLION TONS OF CARGO, AND BY 1985 TO MORE THAN 600,000 PASSENGERS AND 15 MILLION TONS OF CARGO.

THE ISLEY FIELD REHABILITATION WORK IS TO BE DONE IN FOUR PHASES. WORK UNDER PHASE ONE, WHICH INCLUDES THE CLEARING AND IMPROVING OF ACCESS ROADS. IS ALREADY UNDER WAY. SLATED FOR



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NEXT FISCAL YEAR IS REHABILITATION OF ONE OF THE RUNWAYS, WHICH WILL BE USED AS AN INTERIM RUNWAY WHILE THE OTHER RUNWAY IS
RECONSTRUCTED AS THE PERMANENT STRIP. INSTALLATION OF A
BOUNDARY FENCE, AND CONSTRUCTION OF APRONS, TAXIWAYS AND A
DRAINAGE SYSTEM ARE ALL SLATED FOR STAGE ONE OF PHASE ONE.
STATE TWO OF THIS PHASE WILL INCLUDE THE CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW
PASSENGER TERMINAL, AND THE REHABILITATION OF ONE OF THE OLD

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JAPANESE BUILDINGS AT THE LOCATION FOR USE AS OFFICE SPACE.

AT THE END OF THIS PORTION OF THE WORK, IN ABOUT TWO YEARS, THE FIELD WOULD BE READY FOR USE.

PHASES TWO, THREE AND FOUR INCLUDED ADDITIONAL DEVELOPMENT WORK, INSTALLATION OF LIGHTS AND NAVIGATIONAL AIDES, PAVING OF ACCESS ROADS, AND EVENTUAL EXTENSION OF THE PERMANENT RUNWAY TO 10,600 FEET.
