COMTWELVE FOR AMBASSADOR WILLIAMS SECSTATE PASS TO DEPT INT/SEC INTERIOR/DASTA OSN. (CONGRESS OPENS PONAPE SESSION)

PONAPE, AUGUST 14, (MNS) --- ONCE AGAIN, FOR THE FOURTH TIME IN LESS THAN TWO YEARS, THE FOURTH CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA IS IN SESSION. THE GAVELS CAME DOWN IN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND THE SENATE SHORTLY AFTER FIVE P.M. MONDAY (AUGUST 24), TO MARK THE OPENING OF 20-DAY SPECIAL SESSION, THE FIFTH THAT HAS BEEN HELD SINCE THE INCEP-TION OF THE CONGRESS, AND THE SECOND FOR THE FOURTH CONGRESS.

THE SCENE OF THIS SESSION IS THE CAMPUS OF THE PONAPE ISLANDS

CENTRAL SCHOOL (PICS), IN KOLONIA, PONAPE, THE FIRST TIME THE CON-GRESS HAS EVER MET IN THE PONAPE DISTRICT. THUS IT WAS WITH A SPECIAL FEELING OF PRIDE THAT HOUSE SPEAKER BETHWEL HENRY OF PONAPE DELIVERED HIS OPENING REMARKS IN THE HOUSE.

"IT IS WITH A SENSE OF DOUBLE HONOR THAT I PARTICIPATE IN THIS MEETING OF THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA WITH THE PEOPLE OF MICRONESIA HERE IN PONAPE DISTRICT," SPEAKER HENRY SAID. "I SAY DOUBLE, BE • CAUSE AS A MEMBER OF CONGRESS IT IS AN HONOR TO MYSELF AND TO THE OTHER MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND SENATE FOR HAVING BEEN INVITED TO HAVE OUR SESSION IN THIS DISTRICT. AND IT IS ALSO VERY MUCH A PLEASURE FOR ME AS A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE HOST DISTRICT, TO WELCOME MY COLLEAGUES TO PONAPE."

SPEAKER HENRY CALLED ATTENTION TO SOME OF THE IMPORTANT ITEMS FACING THE CONGRESS DURING THIS SESSION. AS DID HIS COLLEAGUE IN THE SENATE, PRESIDENT AMATA KABUA OF THE MARSHALLS. BOTH MEN HIGHLITED PARTICULARLY THE PRESENCE ON THE AGENDA OF MATTERS RELATING TO FUTURE POLITICAL STATUS.



AFFAIRS, STANLEY S. CARPENTER, WAS IN ATTENDANCE AND WAS INTRODUCED. THERE WERE ALSO INTRODUCTIONS IN BOTH HOUSES OF LOCAL PONAPE LEADERS FROM SEVERAL MUNICIPALITIES. AND BOTH INSIDE THE SMALL CLASSROOMS THAT ARE SERVING AS MEETING CHAMBERS, AND OUTSIDE ON THE GRASS LOOKING IN THE WINDOWS. DOZENS OF PONAPE CITIZENS WIT-NESSED THE HISTORIC OPENING DAY OF PONAPE'S FIRST CONGRESS 0F

THE OPENING SESSIONS WERE TAKEN UP LARGELY WITH THE TRADITIONAL CEREMONIES OF OPENING DAY. PAGE SIX RUHGSAA4456 UNCLAS OF THE NOVEMBER GENERAL ELECTION (SB 226), AND ONE THAT WOULD PROVIDE FOR THE TAKING OF AN OFFICIAL CENSUS IN 1973 IN THE TT (SB 228).

IN THE HOUSE, TWO BILLS AND TWO JOINT RESOLUTIONS WERE INTRODUCED. ONE BILL WOULD APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A BUSINESS ADVISORY PROGRAM IN THE TT (HB 255), AND THE OTHER IS A SMALL AP\* PROPRIATION MEASURE TO TAKE CARE OF A NUMBER OF RELATIVELY MINOR ITEMS OF FUNDING NEEDED TO COMPLETE CERTAIN PROJECTS IN THE TT (HB 256). THE JOINT RESOLUTIONS INCLUDE ONE CALLING FOR TWO ADDITIONAL CIVIC ACTION TEAMS IN THE TRUST TERRITORY, AND THE TRADITIONAL JOINT RESOLUTIONS WHICH CALLS FOR A JOINT SESSION OF THE CONGRESS AND WHICH INVITES HIGH COMMISSIONER JOHNSTON TO SPEAK.

THAT SESSION IS TENTATIVELY SET FOR 10:00 A.M. WEDNESDAY, WITH BOTH THE HOUSE AND SENATE ADJOURNED UNTIL THAT TIME TUESDAY MORNING, WHEN EACH WILL HOLD A REGULAR WORKING SESSION.
