

Recommendation: Suggest add as (s) "not to be subject to an increase in punishment upon appeal of a conviction or sentence."

Reason: Although Micronesia may adopt criminal procedures similar to those in the U.S., Micronesia could ultimately opt for civil law procedures. If the latter occurs, a prohibition against increase of punishment on appeal might well be necessary.
