Subject: Micronesian Status Negotiations

On November first, Dr. Kissinger requested that

Ambassador Franklin Haydn Williams submit to the President through the Under Secretaries Committee a reassessment of the U.S. negotiating position on the Micronesian status question.

Recent developments in Micronesia have made it clear that the Congress of Micronesia's Joint Future Status Committee is in considerable disarray, and will not be able to meet with the American negotiators until late March or early April. Since the time factor is no longer as pressing as appeared likely in November, I have requested that Ambassador Williams and the Inter-Agency group which he heads prepare two new studies, to be submitted to the Under Secretaries Committee in February for transmittal to you for decision.

I attach a copy of the terms of reference of the new studies.

SUBJECT: Micronesian Status Negotiations

Pursuant to your memoranda of November 22 and

December 7, 1972, I request that you instruct the

Inter-Agency Group to prepare and submit to the Under

Secretaries Committee by February 15, 1973 the following

studies:

- (1) Definitive recommendations for the negotiation of a permanent association with the Marianas, together with a negotiating strategy and recommendations for necessary legislation and necessary executive action.
- (2) A full study of all the options open to the United States with regard to the negotiations on the future status of Micronesia. Inter alia, this study should consider the question of continued negotiations with the Joint Future Status Committee of the Congress of Micronesia and the advisability of agreeing to negotiate an independence option. In addition to developing the pros and cons of the several courses of action open to us under

these headings, the study should recommend a U.S. negotiating procedure and strategy.
