

"(1) A government of a foreign country and a foreign political party;... (3) A partnership, association, corporation, organization, or other combination of persons organized under the laws of or having its principal place of business in a foreign country."1/

There is no definition for "foreign country or foreign political party." Moreover, the Act was originally passed in 1938 and the Pacific Trusteeship was not established until 1947. There have been amendments to the Act, especially in 1966, but the sparse legislative history which the firm has does not cast any light on the meaning of the critical phrase. There is no case law on these phrases within this Act.

1/ There is another subsection (2) which talks about a person "outside the United States." That subsection seems clearly not to apply since United States is defined as

"(M) the term "United States", when used in a geographical sense, includes the several States, the District of Columbia, the Territories, the Canal Zone, the Insular Possessions, and all other places now or hereafter subject to the Civil or Military jurisdiction of the United States;"
