
Dear Haydn:

On February 22nd, I sent you a letter for which I have not received any reply. In case the letter failed to reach you, I am enclosing a copy herewith.

Paul Warnke has informed me that you are considering Monterey as the site of the next round of status talks. We had suggested Washington for obvious reasons, i.e., close proximity to our Counsel's office and the ease with which your delegation could consult with your principals should the need arise during the course of the talks. I personally have no objection to Monterey. As you know, I am familiar with the area and would like the opportunity to visit it once again, but I am concerned about the possible accusations our Committee might receive for selecting such a plush place to meet. May I suggest that you give some thoughts to San Francisco as an alternate site.
