SUBJECT: VIEWS FROM TINIAN.

1. VISIT TO TINIAN MARCH 29-30 AFFORDED ME OPPORTUNITY TO MEET WITH DISTADREP FRANCISCO CHONG, MAKE COMPLETE TOUR OF ISLAND UNDER GUIDANCE OF HIS ASSISTANT LINO LIZAMA, SEE FORMER USAF AIRFIELDS INCLUDING A-BOMB PITS, VISIT VILLAGE SCHOOL AND MEET TEACHERS, OBSERVE SOMETHING OF LOCAL VEGETABLE FARMING AND IRRIGATION SYSTEM, AND NOTE EXTENT AND NATURE OF 8,00 AERE "BAR K RANCH" OPERATED BY FORMER SEABEE KENNETH JONES WHO HAS EXTENSIVE RANGE OF BUSINESS INTERESTS IN MARIANAS INCLUDING GUAM. VISIT PROVIDED INSIGHT INTO TINIAN'S VIEWS OF ITS FUTURE DEVELOPMENT.

OF THE AMERICAN MILITARY. "WHEN WILL THEY BE HERE?" WAS THE GIST OF EAGER QUESTIONS. CHONG SEEMED TO DESCRIBE GENERAL HALCYON: VIEW OF THE BONANZA PRESUMABLY AWAITING TINIAN WHEN HE SAID: "THE FARMERS CAN HARDLY WAIT FOR THE DAY WHEN THE U.S. MILITARY TRUCKS: WILL! BACK UP TO THEIR GXTES, PAY FOR THE PRODUCE, AND TAKE IT AWAY. A MARKET AT THE DOOR AND NO DISTRIBUTION PROBLEM!" REGARDING THE MILITARY, CHONG MENTIONED ONLY ONE RESERVATION: HE SAID THERE WAS: SOME CORCERN ABOUT THE POSSIBILITY OF ESTABLISHMENT OF AN AMMUNITION WHARE SUCH AS HAD BEEN ENVISAGED FOR SELLA BAY ON: GUAM.

PLANS FOR TINIAN. HE SAID PEOPLE OF TINIAN ARE COMPLETELY WITH SAIPANESE ON DESIRE FOR CLOSE AND PERMANENT ASSOCIATION: WITH U.S. HE TOOK OBVIOUS PRIDE IN REPORTING A NEWLY-ORGANIZED FARMERS! COOPERATIVE WITH 44 MEMBERS WHO WERE WORKING TO INCREASE THEIR PRODUCTION NOW THAT THEY HAVE THEIR CIVIC ACTION TEAM-CONSTRUCTED IRREGATION SYSTEM. I ALSO LEARNED THAT A NUMBER OF APPLICATIONS FOR HOMESTEADING LANDS ON THE ISLAND HAVE BEEN FORWARDED TO: THE DISTAD IN SAIPAN FOR ACTION; CHONG AND LIZAMA POINTED OUT THAT SUCH APPLICA-TIONS ARE RELATIVELY EASY TO PROCESS SINCE, GIVEN THE RECENT ARRIVAL OF THE PRESENT CHAMGERO POPULATION, NOW NUMBERING SOME 850, THERE ARE NO CONFLICTING CLAIMS OR TRADITIONAL! LAND DISPUTES TO BE SETTLED. (CHAMORROS RETURNED TO TINIAN IN 1948 FROM A LONG PERIOD OF LIVING IN YAP.) IN ANSWER TO MY INQUIRY AS TO WHO HAD DONE THE FIELD WORK WHEN THE JAPANESE RAN TINIAN! AS: PART OF THEIR! SUGAR PLANTATIONS IN THE MARIANAS, I WAS TOLD THAT THEY HAD IMPORTED OKINAWAN AND KOREAN CABOR+)

4. CHONG SAID THE REPORTS OF THE EXPECTED COMING OF THE MILITARY HAVE BROUGHT NUMEROUS VISITORS TO TINIAN, MOSTLY BUSINESSMEN SEEKING CONTACTS WITH AN EYE TO FUTURE CONTRACTS. THESE ARE AMERICANS, HE

QUERIED ABOUT JAPANESE VISITORS, OF WHOM! I HAD NOTED! A YOUNG! COUPLE BOARDING THE PLANE FOR GUAM, CHONG! SAID ONLY A FEW COME, AND THEIR PRINCIPAL INTEREST IS WAR REMAINS.

5. MOST CONSPICOUS FCONOMIC VENTURE ON TINIAN IS THAT KNOWN WIDELY IN THE TT AS KEN JONES! RANCH. JONES HAS UNDER LEASE FROM TT ACCORDING

TO CHONG, SOME: 8,000 CRES OF PUBLIC LAND: WITH A CURRENT APPLICATION TO EXTEND HIS PASTURAGE ONTO MILITARY RETENTION LAND. (CHONG THOUGHT THE APPLICATION HAD BEEN MADE TO THE U.S. AIR FORCE.) CHONG OBSERVED THAT JONES! PRESENT HOLDING IS APPROXIMATELY ONE-THIRD OF THE ISLAND, AND THAT THE OTHER TWO-THIRDS IS ABOUT EQUALLY DIVIDED BETWEEN: PRIVATE HOLDINGS AND MILITARY RETENTION AREAS. ON HIS LEASED LAND. JONES HAS SOME 4,00 BEEF CAVILE AND 2,000 HOGS. I SAW HIS NEW SHAUGH-TER HOUSE AND FREEZING FACILITY UNDER CONSTRUCTION, UTILIZING A PARTIALLY-DESTROYED HEAVY CONCRETE STRUCTURE THAT HAD ONCE BEEN A POWER HOUSE IN JAPANESE TIMES. SOME BEEF WAS BEING PROCESSED AT TIME OF MY VISIT.

6. ACCORDING TO CHONG, JONES ALSO HAS PLANS TO ERECT A 100-ROOM HOTEL.

7. WITH REGARD TO SCHOOLING, CHONG SAID THAT LIKE ALMOST EVERY ISLAND TINIAN WOULD LIKE TO HAVE IVS OWN HIGH SCHOOL, BUT RECOGNIZED THAT THIS WOULDN'T BE FEASIBLE. ITS SCHOOL TEHREFORE TAKES STUDENTS THROUGH

NINTH GRADE, AND TINTAN'S 35 HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS: ARE ENROLLED ON SAIPAN AND GUAM.

8. BACK ON SAIPAN, A SIX-MINUTE FLIGHT BY ARE PACTFIC'S NEW HAVILAND, I MET WITH THE TINIAM DELEGATION WHICH (WITH COUNSEL) MIKE WHITE; HAD COME TO DISCUSS WITH IT OFFICIALS THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A COCONUT OIL EXTRACTION OPERATION ON TINIAM. (IT GOING SLOW ON THIS ONE). THIS GROUP CONSISTED OF MAYOR ANTONIO BORNA, PRINCIPAL AND VERY FORCE

FUL SPOKESMAN, SPEAKER MENDIOLA AND TWO OTHER MEMBERS OF THE TINIAN MUNICIPAL COUNCIL, CONGRESSMAN FELIPE ATALIG, AND MARIANAS: POLITICAL STATUS COMMISSION MEMBER HERMAN MANGLONA. THEY SPOKE APPRECIATIVELY OF AMR. WILLIAMS! VISIT TO TINIAN AND GAVE THE IMPRESSION, LIKE THOSE I HAD MET ON THEIR ISLAND, THAT THEY COUND HARDLY WAIT FOR THE U.S. MILITARY TO COME AND BRING INSTANT

TO ALL THE REMARKS AND QUERIES AS TO THE COMING OF THE U.S. MILITARY TO TINIAN, I SAID YIMING AND DETAILS WERE YET TO BE WORKED OUT, AND THAT THE GENERAL SUBJECT WOULD BE PART OF THE STATUS NEGOTIATIONS BETWEEN THE U.S. DELEGATION AND THE MARIANAS STATUS COMMISSION. I TOLD THEM I WOULD SEE TO IT THAT THEIR VIEWS WERE TRANSMITTED TO AMB. WILLIAMS.

10 COMMENT: THE PEOPLE OF TINIAN CLEARLY ENVISAGE A ROLE FOR THEMSELVES
IN RELATION TO THE EAGERLY AWAITED U.S. MILITARY PRESENCE ON THEIR ISLAND. THEIR EXPECTATION OF A SHARED USE OF THE ISLAND ACCORDS, INSOFAR AS I HAVE EVIDENCE, WITH THE GENERAL ASSUMPTION IN THE REST OF THE DISTRICT.
