SAIPAN – The official word from the U.S. delegation to the Marianas status talks on a proposed military takeover of Tinian Island is "no comment" - the same phrase they use when asked about what transpired in the closed sessions of the talks held here yesterday on the future of these islands north of Guam.


The revelation of a report suggesting the Navy and Air Force take over all of Tinian - or as an alternative move the residents of San Jose, the lone village, to the opposite end of the island - is known by Ambassador Franklin Haydn Williams, President Nixon's personal representative, a State Department spokesman said yesterday.

But he added that Williams is still sick from an ailment that struck Tuesday – and therefore has "no comment." (Continued on page 2)
