

## POLITICAL STATUS ACCEPTS INVITATION

SAIPAN, (MNS)---The Marianas Political Status Commission has accepted an invitation to meet with the Guam Political Status Commission Thursday (July 5) on Guam, according to Senator Edward Pangelinan, Chairman of the Marianas Commission.
