Dear Mr. Cruz:

Pursuant to Resolution #8-73 of the Tinian Municipal Council and
to Resolution #9-1973 of the first regular session, Fourth Mariana
Islands District Legislature, I am pleased to advise you that the
Bank of Hawaii is desirous of providing banking service to the
people of Tinian and that we initially propose to offer twice a
week service out of our Saipan Branch until the volume of business
warrants opening a branch on a full time scale. We note that
our air schedule between Saipan and Tinian is available Monday,
Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. Our intent would be to provide
services on two out of these four days which you would feel are
most appropriate for the people of Tinian.

I understand a suggestion was made that the bank location be main-
tained within or adjacent to the existing Municipal Building. In
response to this suggestion and I intend to visit Tinian and
discuss with you on August 1st to work out a mutually agreeable arrangement.

As our understanding that because of the present talks with the
country, we may have to wait for a business license to be issued
until Washington approves same. Once the aforesaid matters are
resolved, we would hope to commence within a reasonable time there-
after.

We will look forward to meeting with you and other members of the
Council when I visit San Jose.
