Honorable Mr. Johnston:

This letter is to request your Office to put an immediate stop or ceasing removal of the World War II Japanese remains in the Trust Territory, Micronesia; until all the Micronesians claimants are being paid for their War Claims. I suggest you should call on the Congress of Micronesia, the Japanese Government Defense and Foreign Offices as of this action.

I feel pretty sure that my people, the Micronesians agreed with me on this subject, although, no public confirmation has been adopted.

The conflicts and unfairness to each individual Micronesia Claimant of what he or she requested is still awaiting and depends on each individual case. So, I feel any residual property or remains of the World War II, either American or Japanese should not remove from the Land of the Micronesians until their claims are resolved in a fair and square manner.

I, personally happy to see that each Micronesian Claimant receive a fair pay-off of his deceased relatives and damaged properties by the aggressive actions of the United States and the Japanese.

I am in high hope and appreciate your Honor to look into this matter urgently and immediately.
