The American Society of International Law and the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace are jointly establishing a Working Group on Micronesia. On behalf of the President of the Society, William D. Rogers, and the President of the Endowment, Thomas L. Hughes, we would like to invite you to join this group.

The Working Group will be an interdisciplinary and expert group of about twelve persons. It will consider a wide range of the problems confronting the future of Micronesia, including those aspects concerned with strategic interest in the islands, United States and international legal aspects, the role of the United Nations, and the impact of "alternative futures".


