U.N. Asks Dates For Territories

UNITED NATIONS, (UPI)-- The General Assembly Friday called on Britain, France and the United States to set specific timetables to bring independence to Pacific island territories still under their administration.

The assembly plenary voted 110 to none, with 19 abstentions, to approve a resolution dealing with American Samoa, Gilbert and Ellice Islands, Guam, New Hebrides, Pitcairn, Seychelles and Solomon Island.

The resolution "calls upon the administering powers concerned to take all necessary steps without further delay, to establish in consultations with the freely elected representatives a specific time table for the free exercise by the peoples of the territories of their right to self-determination and independence."

The measure also expresses "deep concern about the adverse effects of continued nuclear atmospheric testing (by France) in the South Pacific on the life, welfare and environment of the peoples of non-selfgoverning territories situated therein."

Dean Is Named 'Man Of The Year'

BARCELONA, Spain (AP)- John Dean, ousted as White House counsel in the wake of the Watergate scandal, was named "Man of the Year" by the weekly Spanish news magazine Mundo.

Dean beat out Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger, Argentine President Juan D. Peron and Dutch soccer star Johann Cruyff as the top news maker of the year, the magazine announced Thursday.
