

Act. We believe such issues would appropriately be included in the Impact Statement now being prepared for the proposed base on Tinian.

3. Tanapag Harbor. The Commission will agree to joint use of the harbor under civilian control. The Commission will also agree to enter into appropriate covenants to restrict the civilian use and development of 320 acres adjacent to the harbor so as to be consistent with its possible future military use. The 320 acres would not be sold or leased to the United States and title would remain in a public land corporation or the future Marianas government. When the United States required these 320 acres for military purposes, the Marianas government would make the land available or the United States could acquire the land under those federal eminent domain procedures

that would be applicable in the Marianas. *The Commission may consider its position in light of your presentation this morning on the use of this land*

4. Isley Field. The Commission will agree to the joint use of Isley Field under civilian control. The Commission will also agree to lease to the United States 250 acres of land located near the south end of Isley Field. With respect to the remaining 250 acres requested by the United States, the Commission will agree to enter into covenants restricting civilian use along the same lines as those proposed for Tanapag Harbor. *as a park*

5. Tinian.

a) The Commission will not agree to sell or lease any land on Tinian that is not required for military
