I. GENERAL DESCRIPTION:

The primary responsibility of the Marianas District Public Works Department is the carrying out of a complete program of operations and maintenance of government physical plants and facilities; roads; airfields, and harbors; maintenance of government equipment; providing public transportation when not available through private sources; and of providing of services to the general public as authorized.

The Public Works Department is also involved in construction work which is funded as force account projects, and in coordinating with local organization, these projects carried out through the medium of local contractors.

During periods of emergencies and disasters (such as frequently occurring typhoons and other storms) the Public Works Department play a major role in disaster controls and recovery.

Training has taken on a much greater dimension following the decision to limit expatriate hire. An acceleration of on-site training, and where the required expertise for training is not available within current work force, to send abroad incumbents to acquire the necessary training.

Docking facilities also fall within this department; which includes; assigning berthing space to vessels; clearing incoming and outgoing vessels; assisting ships in the harbor as necessary, using World War II LCM's and LCU boat; checking all navigational aids and reporting to U. S. Coast Guard any discrepancies or trouble spots; provides inspections services to small craft; issues registrations and licenses to vessels registered in the District; maintains and operates one LCU and two LCM boats; as logistic support vessels to Tinian and Rota, and to the Northern Islands on occasions. This department also maintain daily operation and maintenance service of airport on an interim basis.
