(NITIJELA ADOPTS ANTI-CON CON, CONGRESS MEASURES)

MAJURO, APRIL 17 (MMS) --- THE MEMBHALL ISLANDS DISTRICT

LEGISLATURE, THE DETIJELA, HAS ADOPTED RESOLUTIONS OPPOSING

MARCHALLESE PARTICIPATION IN THE UPCOMING MICRONESIAN

CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION, AND OPPOSING FURTHER PARTICIPATION

BY THE MARSHALLS IN THE CONCRESS OF MICRONESIA.

THE DRAMATIC ACTIONS CAME SHORTLY BEFORE MIDNIGHT MONDAY NIGHT (APRIL 15) AT THE CONCLUSION OF A ONE-DAY SPECIAL SESSION OF THE MITIJELA CALLED BY THE DISTRICT ADMINISTRATOR EXCLUSIVELY FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSIDERING THE TWO RESOLUTIONS.

BOTH MEASURES HAD BEEN INTRODUCED AND DEBATED DURING THE LEGISLATURE'S REGULAR SESSION, A 30-DAY MEETING WHICH ENDED APRIL 9. FOLLOWING THAT SESSION THE NITIJELA'S LEADERSHIP ASKED FOR AND WAS GRANTED AN ADDITIONAL FOUR-DAY SPECIAL SESSION, DURING WHICH FURTHER PUBLIC HEARINGS WERE HELD IN BOTH MAJURO AND EBEYE ON THE CONTRAVERSIAL RESOLUTIONS. THAT SPECIAL SESSION ENDED LAST SATURDAY WITH THE WORK ON THE RESOLUTIONS STILL PENDING. REQUIRING ANOTHER, ONE-DAY SPECIAL SESSION MONDAY.

THE VOTE ON THE MEASURE EXPRESSIVE OPOSITION TO ANY FURTHER PARTICIPATION IN THE CONTRESS OF DICRONESIA WAS CLOSE, WITH ELEVEN IN FAVOR OF ADOPTING AND TEN OPPOSED. THE OTHER RESOLUTION, INDICATING THAT THE NITIFILA FEELS THE MARSHALL S SHOULD NOT PARTICIPATE IN THE CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION, WAS ADOPTED BY ABOUT A THREE-GUARTERS MAJORITY OF THE MITIFILA, ACCORDING TO DISTRICT PUBLIC AFFAIRS OFFICER TONY DEBRUE.

THE CONVENTION MEASURE IS NITIUELA RESOLUTION 57. IT POINTS OUT THAT THE NITIUELA, IS ADOPTILS RESOLUTION 18 EARLIER IN ITS 21ST REGULAR SESSION THIS YEAR, HAS "COMMITTED ITSELF TO THE PROPOSITION OF SEPARATE NEGOTIATIONS FOR THE FUTURE POLITICAL STATUS OF THE DARSHALL ISLANDS," AND THAT THE OTHER DISTRICTS HIGHT "NISCOUSTRUE" THE HOTIVES OF THE MANSHALLS IN SEEKING SEPARATE STATUS TAIRS IF THE MARSHALLS WERE TO PARTICIPATE IN THE CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION.

THEREFORE THE RESCLUTION DECLARES THAT IT WOULD BE "UNVISE AND INDIED INAPPROPRIATE FOR THE HERSHALL ISLANDS DISTRICT TO SEND DILEMATES, "HETHER ELECTED OR APPOINTED, TO THE CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION FOR MICROMUSIA,"

NITIUELA RECOLUTION 72 IS THE REASURE UNION EXPRESSES THE SENSE OF THE DISTRICT LEGISLATURE UITH DEFIND TO FURTHER WARSHALLESE PARTICIPATION ON THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA. THIS HEASURE POINTS OUT THAT THE CONGRESS HAS "TURNED A DEAT EAR ON THE EXPRESSED WISHES OF THE WARSHALLEDE PEOPLE WITH REGARD TO REVENUE SHARING," AND ALSO POINTS TO RESOLUTION 18, PASSED DANLER BY THE MITIJELA, WITH THE INDICATION THAT FURTHER PARTICIPATION IN THE CONGRESS FOLLOWING THIS DECLARATION OF INTENTION TO SEEK SEPARATE STATUS TALKS WOULD "...PERMET UNMAIN BUT FORULAR ATTACKS ON THE SINCERITY OF THE MARSHALLS IN IXS RESOLVE TO ACRIEVE A SEPARATE STATUS."

THE RESOLUTION THEREFORE CONCLUDES: "...THAT THE NITIJELA EXPRESSES ITS UNALTERABLE RESOLVE TO EXCERISE WHATEVER INFLUENCE IT HAS IN DISASSOCIATING THE PEOPLE OF THE MARSHALLS DISTRICT FROM ANY FURTHER PARTICIPATION IN THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA."

DURING PUBLIC HEARINGS ON THE MEASURES THERE WAS EXTENSIVE DEBATE ON BOTH SIDES, WITH SOME SPEAKERS STRONGLY URGING ADOPTION OF THE RESOLUTIONS AND OTHERS EQUALLY STRONGLY OPPOSED TO THEM. FORMER CONGRESS OF MECRONESIA SENATOR ISAAC LANUI, FOR EXAMPLE, SPOKE AGAINST THE MEASURES, COMMENTING THAT THE MARSHALLS HAS

"KOTHERS TO LOSE" BY PARTICIPATING IN THE CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION.

REPRESENTATIVE EXPAP SILK, THE CO-CHAIRNAN OF THE COMBRESS
OF MICROBESIA JOINT COMMITTEE ON FUTURE STATUS, NADE WHAT PUBLIC AFFAIRS OFFICER DITUE DESCRIBED AS AN "ENOTIONAL, ELEVENTH-HOUR APPEAL" TO THE NITIDELA TO KILL THE HEASURES. HE POINTED OUT THAT THE COMBRESS DOES MANY THINGS WHICH BELIFIT THE MARSHALLS, AND

THE STRONGEST BACKER OF THE TWO RESOLUTIONS WAS IROLI NAMO HERMIOS, WHO SAID IN THE PUBLIC HEARING THAT THE ONLY WAY THE MARSHALLS CAN SUCCED IN ITS SEPARATE STATUS DESIRES IS FOR THE DISTRICT TO "CEASE ALL CONDECTIONS" WITH THE COMBRESS OF HICRONESIA THAT WIGHT INDICATE INSTRUDICTITY ON THE PART OF WARSHALLESE LEADERS.

LEGISLATOR HERHIGS ALSO EXPRESSED SERIOUS RESERVATIONS ABOUT THE CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION LAW, SAYING THE ELECTION DISTRICTS WERE DRAWN HITHOUT REPERD TO TRADITIONAL DIVISIONS OF AUTHORITY IN THE MARSHALLS, AND THAT TWO ISLANDS IN THE MARSHALLS WERE LEFT OUT ALTOGETHER. HE ALSO SAID THE LACK OF A VOTE IN THE CONVENTION FOR THE REPRESENTATIVES OF THE TRADITIONAL LEADERSHIP IS AN "INSULT" TO HYCROHESTA'S TRADITIONAL LEADERS AND "AN ATTEMPT TO UNDERWINE THE AUTHORITY" OF THE TRADITIONAL LEADERSHIP.

DURING THE PINAL PUBLIC HEARING AND WEETING OF THE NITIJELA ON MONDAY THE CHALLERS, WHICH ARE LUCATED ON THE THIRD FLOOR OF MAJURO'S NIECO BUILDILÍ, VERE DESCRIBED AS "JAN-PACKED" BY ONE

OBSERVER (SEE FOLLOWING STORY),

AS THE MARSHALL ISLANDS PURSUE THEIR GOAL OF SEPARATE STATUS NEGOTIATIONS, THE NEXT STEP IS EXPLOTED TO BE THE NAMING OF THE MENDERS OF THE LEWLY CREATING MARSHALLS POLITICAL STATUS COMMISSION. DESRUM SAID AM ANMONMORMENT COMCERNING THESE MAMES IS EXPECTED TO BE NADE IN HAJURO BEFORE THE END OF THIS WEEK.

(SEVERAL THURRES WHEN CEILING COLLAPSES)

MAJURO, APRIL 17 (UMS) --- SEVERAL PEOPLE WERE MURT TUESDAY EVENING CAPREL 17) IN HAJURO WHEN THE SECOND FLOOR CEILING IN THE MIECO HOTEL COLLAPSED DURING A RECEPTION. HOST RECEIVED OHLY MINOR INJURIES, WITH ONLY TWO REQUIRING HOSPITALIZATION, ACCORDING TO DISTRICT PUBLIC AFFAIRS OFFICER TONY DEBRUM.

ABOUT 200 PEOPLE WERE IN THE HOTEL'S RESTAURANT AND LOUNGE ON THE LAGOON SIDE OF THE BUILDING, ATTENDING A RECEPTION IN HONOR OF THE MARSHALLS DISTRICT LEGISLATURE, THE NITIJELA, WHEN THE INCIDENT OCCURRED. DEBRUH SAID THERE WERE SOME "PRETTY BIG CHUNKS" OF PLASTER AND CONCRETE FALLING, BUT FORTUNATELY MOST OF THE GUESTS WERE STANDING IN LINE AT THE BUFFET TABLE AT THE TIME. HAD THEY BEEN MORE SCATTERED THROUGHOUT THE ROOM THERE MIGHT HAVE BEEN MORE INJURIES, HE COMMENTED.

POLICE INMEDIATELY ORDERED THE EVACUATION OF THE THREE-STORY BUILDING . WHICH IS MAJURO'S LARGEST. WEDNESDAY DISTRICT OFFICIALS WERE INSPECTING THE STRUCTURE TO DETERMINE WHETHER THE BUILDING VILL HAVE TO BE CONDEMNED. THE MIECO BUILDING HOUSES A 10-ROOM HOTEL, BAR, RESTAURANT AND NIGHTCLUB, AS VELL AS A RETAIL STORE, SEVERAL BUSINESS OFFICES, A WAREHOUSE AND, ON THE THIRD FLOOR, THE MEETING CHAMBERS AND OFFICES OF THE NITIJELA, WHICH HAD JUST COMPLETED A SPECIAL SESSION THE NIGHT BEFORE.

(MIECO TRADITIONAL CONFERENCE PROGRESS)

PONAPE, APRIL 17 (HMS) --- THE SECOND WEEK OF THE MICRONESIAN TRADITIONAL LEADERS CONFERENCE GOT UNDERWAY IN KOLONIA. PONAPE. MONDAY (APRIL 15) WITH THE CODITION OF TWO HIGH CHIEFS FROM YAP DISTRICY, ANDREW ROBOHAW FROM TOHIL AND ALFONSO RANGANBAY OF RUUL MUDICIPALITY. IN SHORT REMARKS TO THE CONFEREES. CHIEF ROBGHAN SAID HE HOPTO THE COMPERENCE WOLLD HELP TO LEAD THEIR CHILDREN TO A BETTER LIFE, HE ADDED THAT THE MEETINGS WOULD FIND WHAT WOULD BE BEST FOR ALL LEADERS AND THEIR PEOPLE.

DISTRICT ADMINISTRATOR LEO A, FALGAN BRIEFLY VELCOMD THE YAPESE LEADERS AND ASKED IF THE CONFENSES YOULD LIKE TO HEET WITH THE HIGH COMMISSIONER INFORMED THE TRIDITIONAL LEADERS OF HIS DEGIRE TO NEET WITH THEM IN A DISPATCH TO PONAPE (RIDAY (APRIL 18). THE HIGH CONHIESTOWN VILL WEET WITH THE TRADITIONAL LEADERS THEN HIS PLANE GODS THROUGH FORAPE.

HALVORSCU JOHNNY, PONAPE RADIO STATION MANAGER INDICATED.

THE SISSION RESULED WITH FURTHER DISCUSSIONS ON THE

CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION. DISCUSSIONS OF THIS ISSUE WERE

CLOSED TO THE PUBLIC THURSDAY AND FRIDAY OF LAST WEEK. A

SECOND COMMITTEE WAS FORMED TO FURTHER ANALYZE THE

CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION LAW AND TO PRESENT PROPOSAL IN THE

EVALUATION SESSIONS SCHEDULED FOR THURSDAY AND FRIDAY (APRIL

18 & 19) RESPECTIVELY. NELSERS OF THIS COMMITTEE INCLUDED

THREE DELEGATES, ONE FROM EACH DISTRICT'S TRADITIONAL LEADERS.

DURING HONDAY MORNING'S SESSION, KINDOKY JOSEPH, WHO CHAIRED THE HEETING, SURNED UP SEVERAL MOTIONS. ANDROTHEN ARE: THAT THE COTING AGE AND THE AGE OF POTENTIAL CANDIDATES, BOTH 13 YEARS, SHOULD BE NO LESS THAN THIRTY YEARS OF AGE; THAT THE LENGTH OF THE CONVENTION (NINETY-DAYS) SHOULD BE EXTENDED UNTIL A DRAFT CONSTITUTION IS COMPLETED; THAT THE TRADITIONAL LEADERS, TWO FROM EACH DISTRICT, SHOULD HAVE THE RIGHT TO VOTE WHICH THEY DO NOT PRESENTLY HAVE IN THE CONVENTION; THAT THE DATE FOR THE ELECTION OF DELEGATES, CURRENTLY SCHEDULED FOR JUNE 4, 1974, SHOULD BE POSTFONED IN ORDER TO EDUCATE THE

PUBLIC TO VOTE INTELLIGENTLY; AND FINALLY THAT THE STEPS FOR ADOPTION OF A DRAFT CONSTITUTION SHOULD BE IN THE DOLLOWING ORDER: THE CONVENTION, THE HIGH COMMISSIONER, COMBRESS OF MICRONESIA, AND A POPULAR REFERENDUM. THE LAW MOW PROVIDES THAT THE REFERENDUM PRECEDE THE APPROVAL OF THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA. FAND THE FINAL ELEMENT WAS THAT THE CONSTITUTION BE DRAFTED INDEPENDENTLY OF THE DRAFT COMPACT CURRENTLY UNDER NEGOTIATION BETWEEN TEH CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA JOINT COMMITTEE ON FUTURE STATUS AND THE UNITED STATES.

THOSE MOTIONS WERE PASSED UNANIMOUSLY BY THE CONFERES.
THE MOTION WHICH SEEKS A LATER ELECTION DATE FOR THE CONVENTION
DELEGATES WAS PARTLY THE RESULT OFA LETTER SENT TO THE
TRADITIONAL LEADERS, THE HIGH COMMISSIONER, AND THE CONGRESS
OF MICROMESIA PRESIDENT BY A GROUP IN THE KITTI MUNICIPALITY
CALLED "PWIN EN PALIER" (ORGANIZATION OF THE SOUTH SIDE). THE
KITTI GROUP SPECIFICALLY COMPLAINED THAT THERE WAS NOT ENOUGH
EDUCATION ABOUT THE CONVENTION AND REQUESTED THAT AN ATTEMPT
BE MADE TO DELAY THE ELECTION ON SUCH AN IMPORTANT ISSUE. THAT
PARTICULAR GROUP IS COMPOSED OF APPROXIMATELY EIGHT HUNDRED KITTI
RESIDENTS WHO BELONG TO VARIOUS CATHOLIC, PROTESTANT, AND OTHER

SAMUEL MADLEY, MANMWARKI OF METELANIAWW MUNICIPALITY, SAMUEL MADLEY, MANMWARKI OF METELANIAWW MUNICIPALITY, MOTHING THAT CHRISTIANITY ARRIVED LONG AGO AND THAT THE PROTESTANT AND CATHOLIC RELIGIONS ARE THE STRONGEST IN MICRONESIA, EXPRESSED CONCERN OVER THE CONTINUED INFLUX OF MISSIONARIES OF VARIOUS SECTS OF CHRISTIANITY. CITIMS RECENT DISRUPTIONS OF FAMILY RELATIONSHIPS DUE TO CONVERSIONS, HE ASKED THE OTHER TRADITIONAL LEADERS TO REQUEST THAT THE CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION CONSIDER THIS MATTER IN THEIR PROCEEDINGS. THIS MOTION ALSO PASSED.

DURING THE AFTERNOON SESSION, DISCUSSION SHIFTED TO THE DUESTION OF FUTURE POLITICAL STATUS WITH YAP CHIEF ROSOMAN PRESIDING. TAKESY YU MADLEY CRITICIZED THE CURRENT EDUCATION FOR SELF GOVERNMENT PROGRAMS FOR WHAT HE CALLED "LIMITED ACTIVITIES." TO DATE," HE SADI, "THE EDUCATION FOR SELF COVERNMENT PROGRAM HAS BEEN PRINCIPALLY THE RADIO IN SHORT BROADCASTS WHICH PROVIDE DESIRES. THOUGH MANY PEOPLE HAVE RADIOS I DOUBT VERY MUCH THAT THEY HAD AMPLE EXPOSURE TO

THE ISSUES."

PENSULD LAURENCE, A MEMBER OF THE PONAPE DISTRICT TASK
FORCE HILLDERS ON POHAPE, THEY HAVE FEW HATERIALS WITH WHICH TO
WORK. HE LAD RECEIVED ONLY 150 BOOKS ON ESG AND LAS ASKED FOR

ANOTHER THOUSNAD COPIES. HE MENTIONED THAT TWO MEETINGS HAD BEEN CONDUCTED ON PONAPE AND MORE WERE PLANNED IN ADDITION TO FIELD TRIPS TO THE OFTER ISLANDS AND MUNICIPALITIES. HE POINTED OUT THAT THE GROUP HE HAD BUILD TO SHITTE HATERIALS AND ANSVER COLLITIONS AS THE YEAR. HE WORK WOULD BE CARRIED OUT HOT ONLY BY RADIO ERO/DEAUTS BUT MISO BY DISCUSSIONS, WRITTEN INFORMATION, AND PERSONAL CONTACTS OF MEMBERS OF THE ESS TASK FORCE IN POHAPE. HE ADDED THAT THE ESG INFORMATION COMES FROM THE COMERESS OF MICROMESIA. THE U.S. DELEGATION TO THE MICROWESIAM STATUSTALKS, AND THE JOINT COMMITTEE ON FUTURE POLITICAL STATUS. THE ESG PROGRAM BEGAN

AFTER THE RECENT SESSION OF THE COMBRESS OF MICRONESIA. IT REACHED PONAPE JUST BEFORE THE TRADITIONAL LEADERS CONFERENCE

BEGAN.

YASAUO YAMADA, FROM NETT MUNICIPALITY CRITICIZED THE ESG PROGRAM AS MERELY DEFINING TERMS SUCH AS FREE ASSOCIATION, INDEPENDENCE, AND COMMONUEALTH. TRUK MAYOR FUJITA BOSSY ASKED IF THE TASK FORCE CAN ANSWER QUESTIONS AND NOTED THAT SOME MEMBERS OF THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA COMMITTEE ON FUTURE STATUS DID NOT ANSWER QUESTIONS FULLY WHEN THEY TRAVELLED THROUGHOUT THE DISTRICTS EXPLAINING THE CARIOUS ALTERNATIVES OF MICRONESIA'S FUTURE. PENSILE LAWRENCE ANSWERED BY SAYING THE TASK FORCE IS LIMITED TO PROVIDING INFORMATION WHICH EXISTED IN THEIR MATERIALS. ISKIA SONI, LEGISLATIVE LIAISON OFFICER FOR TRUK WHO IS AN INTERPRETER FOR TRUK'S TRADITIONAL LEADERS, SAID THAT A FIELD STAFF EXISTS IN TRUK TO ANSWER QUESTIONS IN DETAIL BUT NOTED THAT IT COULD ONLY SUCCEED WITH ADEQUATE FINANCIAL SUPPORT. .

NICK BOSSY, ADVISOR TO MAYOR FUJITA BOSSY, CRITICIZED THE ESG PROGRAM FOR BEGIN LIMITED TO DEFINITIONS WHICH IN ENGLISH ARE TOO COMPLICATED FOR EVEN EDUCATED ADULTS TO UNDERSTAND. HE ALSO SAID THAT THE ADVANTAGES AND DISADVANTAGES OF EACH FORM OF POLITICAL STATUS SHOULD BE INCLUDED SO THAT THE PEOPLE OF MICRONESIA WOULD UNDERSTAND THEIR RESPONSIBILITIES IN EACH

CIRCUMSTANCE.

SUSHMU AIZAVA, MAGISTRATE OF TOL, EXPLAINED THAT POLITICAL EDUCATION IS ALVAYS APPROACHED FROM A PARTICULAR POINT OF VIEW. THE ESS PROGRAM COMING FROM THE GOVERNMENT USES THE GOVERNMENT'S APPRAISAL OF THE JAPANESE ADMINISTRATIONS WHICH NOW CAUSES HIM TO FAVOR INDEPENDENCE FOR MICRONESIA. ALL LEADERS, WHETER COMBRESSMEN, LEGISLATORS, OR TRADITIONAL LEADERS, HAVE A RESPONSIBILITY TO SERVE THE PEOPLE OF HICRONESIA IN ALL DECISION HAKING, AIZAWA SAID.

JOHNNY MOSES, NANMWARKI OF UH MUNICIPALITY, STATED THAT WHEN HE VISITED THE UNITED STATES, SOME AMERICANS WARNED HIM NOT TO ACCEPT ANY POLITICAL STATUS UNDER THE UNITED STATES. HE POINTED OUT THAT UNDER THE UNITED STATES ADMINISTRATION,

MICRONESIANS CANNET DO WHAT THEY WISH AT PRESENT .

SAMUEL HADLEY, NAMINARKI OF METELANTHAN, DESCRIBED HOW TRADITIONAL AUTHORITY WAS DECREASED STEADILY SINCE THE EARLIEST CONTACTS IN THE NINETEENTH CENTURY AND UNDER FOUR PERIODS OF SPANISH, GERMAN, JAPANESE, AND AMERICAN ADMINISTRATION. HE ADDED THAT THE ONLY IMPROVEMENT HE HAS SEEN UNDER THE U.S. ADMINISTRATION WAS IN THE AREA OF EDUCATION. HE NOTED THAT THE JAPANESE DID BETTER IN LAW ENFORCEMENT.

BENITO PETER, HANMUARKI OF KITTI MUNICIPALITY POINTED OUT THAT THE UNITED STATES HAS ALREADY DIVIDED MICRONESIA BY CONDUCTING SEPARATE STATUS NEGOTIATION WITH THE MARIANAS DISTRICT. HE URGED THE CONFERRES TO FIND OTHER ALTERNATIVES WHICH THE UNITED STATES HAS NOT YET PROPOSED.

- JOHNNY HADLEY NOTED THAT MICRONESIA IS ONE OF THE LAST PLACES IN THE PACIFIC MOVING TOWARD INDEPENDENCE. "WITHOUT ECONOMIC POWER, MICRONESIA CANNOT BE INDEPENDENT, "HADLEY SAID. HE CHARGED THAT THE UMBLED STATES HAS NOT FOSTERED ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT WHICH MOULD TAKE THE POWER OF MONEY FROM THE SEAT OF GOVERNMENT. THAT POWER HAS ONLY BEEN SHIFTED TO THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA IN SWILL PART. HE URGED THAT THE CONGRESS DIRECT MORE FUNDS TOWARD ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.

THE TRADITIONAL LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE CONTINUES THROUGH THE END OF THE WEEK.
