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AN ACT

Calling a constitutional convention for Micronesia; prescribing its powers, duties and functions appropriating money therefor; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA:

- 1 Section 1. Constitutional Convention. There is hereby
- 2 created a constitutional convention in and for the Trust Territory
- 3 of the Pacific Islands. The convention shall be known as the
- 4 Micronesian Constitutional Convention.
- 5 Section 2. Delegates. The convention shall consist of
- 6 sixty (60) delegates, all of whom shall be Trust Territory
- 7 citizens, selected as follows:
- 8 (1) Each district's delegation to the Congress of Micro-
- 9 nesia shall select one delegate from among its membership. Selec-
- 10 tion of such delegates shall be made not later than June 30, 1974,
- 11 and shall be made in writing by the district Congressional delegation
- 12 to the President of the Senate of the Congress of Micronesia.
- 13 (2) Forty-two delegates shall be elected from the following
- 14 delegate districts, as follows:
- 15 (a) Mariana Islands District, four delegates, elected
- from the following delegate districts, each electing
- the following delegates:
- District No. 1, consisting of the municipalities
- of Tinian and Rota, and Municipal District No. 6 as
- 20 defined by municipal ordinance of the Municipality of
- 21 Saipan, as of the effective date of this act, electing
- 22 one delegate;

1		District No. 2, consisting of the
2	•	Municipal Districts No. 1, 2, 3, and 4 of Saipan,
3		clecting one delegate;
4	•	District No. 3, consisting of Municipal Districts
5		No. 7 and 11 as defined by municipal ordinance of the

13		electing one delegate.
14		(b) Marshall Islands District, nine delegates, elected
15		from the following delegate districts, each electing
16		the following delegates;
17		District No. 1, consisting of the municipalities of
18		Majuro Atoll, electing one delegate;
19		District No. 2, consisting of the municipalities of
20		Arno and Mili, electing one delegate;
21		District No. 3, consisting of the municipalities of
22		Wotje, Maloclap, Erikub and Aur, electing one delegate;
23		District No. 4, consisting of the municipalities
24		of Ebon and Namorik, electing one delegate;
25		District No. 5 consisting of the municipalities

1	electing one delegate.
2	(d) Ponape District, nine delegates, elected from
3	the following delegate districts, each electing the
4	following delegates:
5	District No. 1, consisting of Kusaie Island,
6	electing two delegates;
7	District No. 2, consisting of the municipalities
8	of Kolonia Town and Pingelap, electing one delegate;
9	District No. 3, consisting of the municipalities
10	of Mokil, Kapingamarangi, Nukuor and Ngatik, electing on
11	delegate;
12	District No. 4, consisting of the municipality
13	of Uh, electing one delegate;
14	District No. 5, consisting of the municipality
15	of Metelanihm, electing one delegate;
16	District No. 6, consisting of the municipality of
17	Kiti, electing one delegate;
18	District No. 7, consisting of the municipality of

22	(e) Truk District, twelve delegates, elected from
23	the following delegate districts, each electing the
24	following delegates:
25	District No. 1, consisting of the municipality of

2	(d) Ponape District, nine delegates, elected from
3	the following delegate districts, each electing the
4	following delegates:
5	District No. 1, consisting of Kusaie Island,
6	electing two delegates;
7	District No. 2, consisting of the municipalities
8	of Kolonia Town and Pingelap, electing one delegate;
9	District No. 3, consisting of the municipalities
10	of Mokil, Kapingamarangi, Nukuor and Ngatik, electing one
11	delegate;
12	District No. 4, consisting of the municipality
13	of Uh, electing one delegate;
14	District No. 5, consisting of the municipality
15	of Metelanihm, electing one delegate;
16	District No. 6, consisting of the municipality of
17	Kiti, electing one delegate;
18	District No. 7, consisting of the municipality of
19	Sokehs, electing one delegate.
20	District No. 8, consisting of the municipality of
21	Net, electing one delegate.
22	(e) Truk District, twelve delegates, elected from
23	the following delegate districts, each electing the
24	following delegates:
25	District No. 1, consisting of the municipality of

1	Moen, electing two delegates;
2	District No. 2, consisting of the municipality
3	of Dublon, electing one delegate;
4	District No. 3, consisting of the municipality
5	of Uman, electing one delegate;
6	District No. 4, consisting of the municipalities
7	of Parem, Tsis, and Fefan, electing one delegate;
8	District No. 5, consisting of the municipalities
9	of Tol, Polle, Wonei and Pata, electing two delegates;
10	District No. 6, consisting of the municipalities
11	of Udot, Fela-Beguets, Eot, and Romalum, electing
12	one delegate;
13	District No. 7, consisting of all the municipalities
14	of the Mortlock Islands, electing three delegates;
15	District No. 8, consisting of all the municipalities
16	in the Hall Islands, Namonouito Atoll and the Western
17	Islands, electing one delegate.
18	(f) Yap District, three delegates, elected from the
19	following delegate districts, each electing the following
20	delegates:
21	District No. 1, consisting of all the municipalities
22	in the Yap Islands Proper, electing two delegates;
23	District No. 2, consisting of all the remaining
24	municipalities of Yap District, electing one delegate.
25	(3)(a) The remaining twelve delegates shall be

selected as follows: The recognized paramount and traditional chiefs of each administrative district shall meet and select from among their members two nonvoting delegates to the convention.

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- (b) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (a) of this Subsection, any district which does not have traditional chiefs shall be entitled to select two nonvoting delegates to the Convention: PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that the district legislature shall select one such member, and the District Administrator shall select the other. In making selections under the provisions of this paragraph, the appointing authority shall ensure that ethnic minority groups not otherwise represented on the district's delegation to the convention shall be represented insofar as practical.
- (c) Appointments made under the provisions of this
 Subsection shall be made not later than June 30, 1974,
 and shall be transmitted in writing by the presiding officer
 of the district legislature, in the case of district
 legislature appointees, or the District Administrator, in
 the case of his appointees, to the President of the Senate
 of the Congress of Micronesia. The District Administrator
 shall also transmit to the President of the Senate of the
 Congress of Micronesia the names of the nonvoting delegates
 selected by the paramount and traditional leaders of the

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- district concerned.
- 2 Section 3. <u>Elections</u>. The delegates to be elected under Section 3 2, Subsection (2) of this act shall be elected as follows:
- (1) All citizens of the Trust Territory who have the qualifications

 5 of voters for members of the House of Representatives of the Congress of

 6 Micronesia are hereby eligible to vote for and choose delegates to the

 7 Convention Registration to vote for members of the Congress of Micronesia
- 7 Convention. Registration to vote for members of the Congress of Micronesia
- 8 shall also be registration to vote for delegates to the Convention.
 9 (2) The election of delegates shall be held on the first Tuesday
- 10 following the first Monday in June, 1974.
- 11 (3) Any person who is eighteen years of age or older, has
 12 fulfilled the residence requirements in the representative district for
- 13 registration as a voter, as set forth in Title 43 of the Trust Territory
- 14 Code, is not currently under a judgment of mental incompetency or insanity,
- 15 and is not currently under parole, probation, or sentence for any felony for
- 16 which he has been convicted by any court of the Trust Territory or any court
- 17 within the jurisdiction of the United States, shall be eligible for election
- 18 as a delegate from that representative district.
- 19 (4) The name of any candidate for election as a delegate shall
- 20 be printed on an official ballot to be used at the election for choosing
- 21 candidates only if at least twenty days prior to such election a nomination
- 22 paper shall have been filed in the office of the Election Commissioner of
- 23 the administrative district concerned in his behalf nominating him as a
- 24 candidate for a delegate from the particular delegate district concerned, and

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- l signed by not less than twenty-five qualified voters of the delegate
- 2 district involved. There shall be deposited with each nomination
- 3 paper a fee of ten dollars. Such nomination fee shall be paid
- 4 over to the Treasurer of the Trust Territory as a local revenue
- 5 general realization, available for appropriation by the Congress
- 6 of Micronesia. No such nomination paper shall contain any
- 7 reference to, or designate any political party, and the ballots
- 8 used at such election shall not contain any reference to or
- 9 designation of the political party or affiliation of any candidate.
- 10 The names of the candidates in each delegate district
- 11 shall be on separate ballots. Except as herein provided, the
- 12 ballots for election of the delegates shall be in substantially
- 13 the same form as those for the general election for members of
- 14 the Congress of Micronesia. The Election Commissioner shall,
- 15 upon receipt of the nomination paper, indorse thereon the day,
- 16 hour and minute that such nomination paper is received.
- 17 (5) In case of a tie vote at the election for delegates,
- 18 the candidates so tied shall draw lots under the supervision of
- 19 the Election Commissioner of the administrative district concerned
- 20 to determire which of them shall be selected as delegates.
- 21 (6) Each person voting for delegates shall be permitted
- 22 to vote for the number of delegates to which the delegate district
- 23 in which he votes is entitled, and the candidate or candidates
- 24 receiving the highest number of votes from each delegate district
- 25 shall be the delegates to the Convention from that delegate district.

- 1 The candidates not elected shall be designated as alternates in
- 2 the order in which their vote totals appear.
- 3 (7) Except as otherwise specifically provided by this
- 4 act, the election for such delegates shall be conducted, the
- 5 returns made, the results ascertained, and the certificates of
- 6 persons elected to be delegates to such Convention issued in the
- 7 same manner as is prescribed by Title 43 of the Trust Territory
- 8 Code relating to elections for members of the Congress of
- 9 Micronesia.
- 10 (8) The Convention shall be the sole judge of the
- 11 elections, returns, and qualifications of delegates.
- 12 Section 4. Vacancies. (1) Vacancies for any delegate
- 13 appointed by a district delegation to the Congress of Micronesia
- 14 shall be filled by appointment by that district's delegation
- 15 to the Congress of Micronesia. (2) Vacancies for any delegate
- 16 elected from a delegate district shall be filled by the candidate
- 17 receiving the next highest number of votes in the election of
- 18 delegates from the same delegate district. (3) Vacancies for any
- 19 nonvoting delegate appointed under the provisions of Subsection (3)
- 20 of Section 2 of this act shall be filled in the same manner as
- 21 the original appointment.
- 22 Section 5. <u>Pre-Convention Committee</u>.
- 23 (1) There shall be a Pre-Convention Committee, which
- 24 shall consist of seven members, selected as follows:
- 25 (a) Each district's delegation to the Convention,

- 1 consisting of all the delegates selected under the provisions of
- 2 Section 2, shall be called into meeting by the delegate who is
- 3 a member of the Congress of Micronesia. The delegation shall then
- 4 select a delegation chairman from its membership, who shall be
- 5 the district's representative on the Committee. Such selection
- 6 shall be made not later than July 31, 1974, and shall be made in
- 7 writing by the district's delegation to the President of the
- 8 Senate of the Congress of Micronesia.
- 9 (b) The President of the Senate of the Congress
- 10 of Micronesia shall be Chairman of the Pre-Convention Committee.
- 11 (2) The duties of the Pre-Convention Committee shall
- 12 be to facilitate the work of the Convention. To this end, the
- 13 Committee shall ensure that accommodations and facilities for
- 14 the convention are in proper order, and may take such other
- 15 steps as it may deem necessary or appropriate to accomplish this
- 16 purpose.
- 17 (3) Members of the Committee shall be entitled to per
- 18 diem and travel expenses, at standard Trust Territory rates, while
- 19 on the business of the Committee.
- 20 Section 6. Procedure.
- 21 (1) The Constitutional Convention shall convene in
- 22 Saipan, Mariana Islands District and shall continue in session for
- 23 not longer than ninety (90) calendar days. The Pre-Convention
- 24 Committee shall specify the actual date for the convening of the
- 25 convention.

- 1 (2) The President of the Senate of the Congress of
- 2 Micronesia shall act as President of the Convention until
- 3 the Convention shall select a President from among its membership.
- 4 (3) The Convention shall select, from among its
- 5 membership, a President and such additional officers as it may
- 6 deem necessary and appropriate.
- 7 (4) The Convention shall adopt its own rules of
- 8 procedure not inconsistent with this act; PROVIDED, HOWEVER,
- 9 that no question shall be decided affirmatively by the Convention
- 10 except by the affirmative votes of not less than three-fourths of
- 11 the delegates entitled to vote in the Convention, a quorum being
- 12 present; and that no voting except in person shall be permitted;
- 13 and that abstentions shall not be counted as a vote cast in
- 14 determining the result of any question.
- 15 (5) A quorum shall consist of thirty-six voting delegates,
- 16 unless the Convention by its rules of procedure shall provide for a
- 17 greater number.
- 18 Section 7. Powers of Convention. (1) The President of
- 19 the Constitutional Convention, or the Chairman of any duly
- 20 established Committee thereof, shall have the power and authority
- 21 to issue subpoenas requiring the attendance of witnesses
- 22 or the production of books, documents, or other evidence,
- 23 in any matter related to the purpose of the Constitutional
- 24 Convention.
- 25 Any subpoena or other process issued under the

- 1 authority of the Convention shall run in the name of the Trust
- 2 Territory of the Pacific Islands and shall be addressed to any
- 3 police officer of the Trust Territory or of any administrative
- 4 district. Such subpoena or other process shall be signed by the
- 5 President, shall contain a reference to this Section, and shall
- 6 set forth in general terms the matter or questions with reference
- 7 to which such testimony or other evidence is to be taken.
- 8 Any officer to whom the process described in this
- 9 Subsection is directed, if within his jurisdiction, shall forthwith
- 10 serve or execute the same upon delivery thereof to him, without charge
- 11 or compensation; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that any officer serving or
- 12 executing such subpoena or process shall be compensated for his
- 13 actual expenses, if any, in connection therewith.
- 14 (2) The President or the Chairman of any duly established
- 15 Committee may administer oaths to witnesses in any matter under the
- 16 examination of the Convention.
- 17 Every person who, having been summoned as a
- 18 witness by the Convention to give testimony or to produce
- 19 papers upon any matter under inquiry before the Convention,
- 20 refuses to make oath or affirmation, or to answer any question or
- 21 inquiry, shall be guilty of contempt of the Constitutional
- 22 Convention and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not more
- 23 than one thousand dollars or imprisoned for not more than one
- 24 year, or both.
- 25 (6) Whenever a person violates any of the provisions

- 1 of this Subsection, the President shall certify a statement of such
- 2 facts to the Attorney General of the Trust Territory who (shall prosecute
- 3 the offender in any appropriate court of the Trust Territory.
- 4 (3) The officers and employees of the Trust Territory
- 5 Government and each district government shall cooperate with the
- 6 Convention by furnishing such information as may be called for in
- 7 connection with research activities of the Convention.
- 8 Section 8. Duties. The Convention shall draft a Constitu-
- 9 tion for the future government of the state of Micronesia. Such
- 10 Constitution shall make adequate provision for the exercise of
- 11 legislative, judicial, and executive functions, and shall
- 12 guarantee to all the citizens of Micronesia a form of government
- 13 which permits the free democratic expression of their views. It
- 14 shall provide for an effective date, and shall require approval
- 15 by a popular referendum as specified in this act. When said
- 16 Constitution shall be drafted as aforesaid, the Convention shall
- 17 notify the High Commissioner that it has completed its deliberations.
- 18 Upon receipt of such notification, the High Commissioner shall transmit
- 19 a copy of the constitution adopted by the Convention to the Congress of
- 20 Micronesia, and shall call a referendum on the Constitution, authority
- 21 for which is hereby granted to the High Commissioner, subject to
- 22 the provisions of Section 11 of this act. Prior to his calling
- 23 of the referendum on the Constitution, the High Commissioner
- 24 shall translate or cause to be translated the Constitution
- 25 framed by the Convention from English to the predominant

- 1 languages of Yap, Palau, Ponape and the Marshalls, the Marianas,
- 2 Kapingamarangi, Kusaie, Ulithi, and Truk.
- 3 Section 9. Staff Support. The Convention and Pre-Convention
- 4 Committee shall be assisted in its tasks by:
- 5 (1) The Staff of the Congress of Micronesia, which
- 6 shall provide such administrative and technical assistance as
- 7 may be necessary;
- 8 (2) Such other staff as the Convention or Committee
- 9 may deem necessary toward the performance of its tasks, within
- 10 the limits of the funds made available to it by this act and
- 11 by other acts.
- 12 Section 10. Compensation of Delegates.
- 13 (1) Delegates to the Convention shall not be employed
- 14 for gain or profit while serving as delegates, but may take
- 15 leave without pay from their regular employment during their
- 16 service as delegates.
- 17 (2) Delegates shall be entitled to all necessary travel
- 18 expenses, and to per diem at standard Trust Territory rates, while
- 19 on the business of the Convention or a committee thereof.
- 20 (3) Delegates shall be paid at the rate of twenty-five
- 21 (\$25.00) dollars per day while on the business of the Convention
- 22 or a committee thereof; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, delegates who are members
- 23 of the Congress of Micronesia, selected under the provisions of
- 24 Subsection (1) of Section 2 of this act, shall not be entitled to
- 25 be paid twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) per day but shall be entitled

2 2 of this Section. Section 11. Conduct of Referendum. 3 (1) Except as otherwise provided in this Section, the 5 provisions of Title 43 of the Trust Territory Code regarding 6 election of members to the Congress of Micronesia shall apply 7 to the referendum authorized by Section 8 of this act. (2) The referendum shall be held on the date the High 8 9 Commissioner shall specify. (3) The Referendum Ballot shall appear substantially 10 11 as follows: "CONSTITUTIONAL REFERENDUM 12 13 Do you approve of the Constitution of Micronesia, as adopted by 14 the Micronesian Constitutional Convention? YES NO (4) Notwithstanding the provisions of Subsection 15 16 (3) of this Section, any voter so requesting shall be provided 17 with a ballot printed in the vernacular commonly in use in the 18 district in which he votes, instead of in English. The Election 19 Commissioner shall be responsible for the accurate translation 20 of the English language into each such vernacular. (5) The Election Commissioner shall certify the results 21 22 of the referendum to the High Commissioner, who shall transmit 23 such certifications to the Presiding Officers of the Congress of 24 Micronesia as soon as practicable after their receipt. (6) No recounts shall be permitted, unless the Congress of 25

l to receive travel expenses and per diem as provided under Subsection

1 Micronesia so authorizes. The Congress shall be the sole judge of 2 the referendum and the results thereof.

- 3 Section 12. Appropriation.
- 4 (1) The High Commissioner is authorized and directed
- 5 to obligate such sums as may have been appropriated for the
- 6 purposes of the Micronesian Constitutional Convention as part of
- 7 United States Annual Grant Fund appropriations to the President
- 8 of the Senate as Chairman of the Pre-Convention Committee, prior
- 9 to June 30, 1974.
- 10 (2) There is appropriated out of the General Fund
- 11 of the Congress of Micronesia the sum of \$100,000 for the purposes
- 12 of the Micronesian Constitutional Convention, which appropriation
- 13 shall include such sums as may be necessary to provide for such
- 14 functions as are provided for in this act for which sums have
- 15 not been appropriated, or have not been appropriated in sufficient
- 16 quantity, by the United States Congress as part of the Annual
- 17 Grant to the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands.
- 18 (3) As used in this Section, the term "Micronesian
- 19 Constitutional Convention" shall include the Convention, the
- 20 election of delegates thereto, the holding of a referendum on
- 21 the Constitution adopted by the said Convention, the meetings of
- 22 all Committees of the Convention, and any other activity provided
- 23 for in this act which is associated with the functions of the
- 24 Convention.
- 25 (4) The sums appropriated by this act shall remain

1	available for the purposes specified herein until June 30, 1975,
2	at which time any sums remaining unexpended and unencumbered
3	shall revert to the General Fund to the extent that sums have
4	been appropriated out of the General Fund for such purposes,
5	or shall otherwise lapse in accordance with applicable provisions
6	of United States law, to the extent that amounts appropriated
7	by the United States have not been expended or obligated for
8	expenditure on such date.
9	(5) The President of the Convention shall, not later
10	than August 30, 1975, transmit to the Congress of Micronesia and
11	to the High Commissioner a complete report showing the status
12	of all funds appropriated or obligated by this act. The Trust
13	Territory Government shall provide all assistance which may be
14	necessary to the President of the Convention in the preparation
15	of this Report.
16	Section 13. Effective date. This act shall take effect upon
17	its approval by the High Commissioner, or upon its becoming law
18	without such approval.
