

boundary road also will be made available for future contingency use by the U.S. forces. As at Tanapag harbor this land will be made available to the future Government of the Northern Marianas for use or lease for industrial or agricultural purposes compatible with possible future military use.

4. Tinian. Approximately 17,475 acres (6,993 hectares) will be made available for the development of a joint service military base in accordance with the plans newly presented by the United States. These plans reduced the acreage required by approximately 1,200 acres (485 hectares) and eliminated the necessity for relocating San Jose Village. The United States will carefully reevaluate its military land needs in the area south and east of the northeastern portion of the proposed runway in order to make as much of this land as possible immediately available to the Government of the Northern Marianas under a land use arrangement for agricultural and other purposes compatible with planned military activities.

Joint use arrangements for both the new West Field and the rehabilitated San Jose harbor, with free access to both, will be developed. The rehabilitated harbor will be under the civilian control of the Marianas Government except during times of national emergency. Consistent with military requirements, land will be made available under a land use arrangement in the San Jose harbor area for civilian harbor-oriented activities. In addition, there will be maximum civilian use of land within the base itself for agricultural, fishing, recreational and other purposes including access through the base area to northern beaches compatible with the
