Land

A summary of the tentative agreements reached on land requirements follows:

- 1. Farallon de Medinilla. This island consisting of 229 acres (93 hectares) will continue to be made available to the United States as a target area. Maximum safety precautions will be enforced by the United States.
- 2. Tanapag Harbor area. Approximately 197 acres (78 hectares) in the southern portion of the Tanapag harbor area, now under military retention, will be made available for future contingency use by the United States. Most of this land will be used by the United States for the development of an American Memorial Park which will be used as a recreation area by the people of the Marianas. Preliminary plans for the park call for cleared beaches, an amphitheatre, a family picnic area, an aboretum, a swimming pool and other athletic facilities in addition to a monument. Land in the Tanapag harbor area not used for the Memorial Park or for military purposes will be made available to the future Government of the Northern Marianas for possible sub-lease for civilian harbor-related activities. There are no current plans for military use of this area. Subject to the limitations imposed by any future military use, the United States has agreed to permit maximum feasible joint use of any land and facilities which are developed for military purposes.
- 3. Isely Field area. Approximately 482 acres (193 hectares) south of and adjacent to the southern runway of Isely Field and within the south
