SAIPAN, JULY 8 (MNS) 22THE FIRST TRUST TERRITORY KIDNEY TREATMENT CENTER OPENED IN THE MARSHALLS LAST WEEK, ACCORDING TO A REPORT IN GUAM'S PACIFIC DAILY

NEWS.

WITH THE ASSISTANCE OF HONOLULU'S ST. FRANCIS HOSPITAL, THE REPORT SAID, THREE ARTIFICIAL KIDNEY MACHINES HAVE BEGUN OPERATION. THEY ARE BEING USED BY TWO MARSHALLESE WOMEN, AMJUR LABAUN AND ELDIA TIMOTHY. BOTH LEARNED SELF-DIALYSIS, THE USE OF THE ARTIFICIAL KIDNEY MACHINES, AT ST. FRANCIS HOSPITAL.

HEMODIALYSIS, THE REPORT POINTED OUT, IS THE PROCESS OF CLEANSING THE BLOOD WITH AN ARTIFICIAL KIDNEY WHEN ONE'S OWN DISEASED KIDNEYS HAVE FAILED.

THE PATIENTS ARE BEING ASSISTED BY HEMIKO BINGHAM, A REGISTERED NURSE FROM MAJURO TRAINED AT ST. FRANCIS. THE DIALYSIS MACHINES WILL BE SERVICED BY LESSOP MOTELLANG. HE STUDIED HEMODIALYSIS MAINTENANCE IN HAWAII, THE REPORT SAID.

DR. ARNOLD SIEMSEN, DIRECTOR OF THE INSTITUTE OF RENAL DISEASES AT ST. FRANCIS HOSPITAL, HELPED ESTABLISH THE MAJURO CENTER. "ANYTHING WE CAN DO TO PLACE PATIENTS WITH, OR IN PROXIMITY-TO, THEIR FAMILIES," HE SAID. "IS TO THEIR ADVANTAGE."

TWO MORE MICRONESIANS, DR. SIEMSEN SAID, ARE LEARNING TO DIALYZE THEMSELVES AT ST. FRANCIS. THEY WILL USE THE MAJURO CENTER WHEN THEY COMPLETE THEIR TRAINING.

THE DIALYSIS PATIENTS, THE ARTICLE SAID, ARE AWAITING POSSIBLE KIDNEY TRANSPLANTS, USING ORGANS FROM LIVING RELATED DONORS OR FROM DECEASED PERSONS.

(BOWLES APPOINTED TO CLAIMS COMMISSION)

SAIPAN, JULY 8 (MNS) --- THE CHAIRMAN OF THE FOREIGN CLAIMS SETTLEMENT COMMISSION, J. RAYMOND BELL, ANNOUNCED THAT ROBERT BOWLES HAS BEEN APPOINTED TO SERVE AS A COMMISSIONER ON THE MICRONESIAN CLAIMS COMMISSION.

BOWLES, FORMER DEPUTY TRUST TERRITORY ATTORNEY GENERAL, HAS SERVED AS CHIEF COUNSEL TO THE COMMISSION SINCE JULY, 1972. THE NEW APPOINTMENT BECAME EFFECTIVE JULY 3. BOWLES WILL REMAIN AS CHIEF COUNSEL UNTIL A SUCCESSOR TO THAT POSITION IS ANNOUNCED.

HIS APPOINTMENT BRINGS TO FIVE THE NUMBER OF COMMISSIONERS NOW SERVING ON THE COMMISSION. OTHER COMMISSIONERS ARE JOHN RULMAL OF YAP, JOSE CABRERA OF SAIPAN, WALLACE WITKOWSKI, AND COMMISSION CHAIRMAN BEN GREER.

GREER, WHO WAS NOTIFIED DURING MAY THAT HIS CONTRACT WOULD NOT BE RENEWED, WILL BE LEAVING SAIPAN NEXT WEEK. HIS SUCCESSOR HAS NOT BEEN NAMED. IT IS EXPECTED, HOWEVER, THAT WITKOWSKI, THE COMMISSION'S VICE-CHAIRMAN, WILL SERVE AS ACTING CHAIRMAN UNTIL GREER'S REPLACEMENT IS APPOINTED.

SAIPAN, JULY 8 (MNS) --- HIGH COMMISSIONER EDWARD E.
JOHNSTON ANNOUNCED FRIDAY (JULY 5) THE APPOINTMENT OF NEIMAN
CRALEY AS ACCORDINATOR BETWEEN THE EXECUTIVE BRANCH AND
THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA FOR ALL MATTERS RELATING TO THE

ON OCTOBER 24.
