## How to Telephone Alf Bergesen or David Schiele on Saipan

Saipan is in the same time zone as Sydney and Canberra -- with the consequent need to place calls in the late afternoon or evening out time. All calls should be made through the DOD "autovon" defense communications system, as follows:

- -- Call 695-9801 (Washington "Navy Switch")
- -- Ask for "Guam Operator" and for priority or immediate precedence.
- -- When you have Guam, ask for "Saipan Switch," priority or Immediate.
- -- When you have Saipan, ask for Mr. Schiele or Mr. Bergesen. Until they have become well known, you may have to identify them as the Department of State officer who replaced Mary Vance Trent, etc.

Priortiy calls are often "preempted" by higher precedence calls, i.e. the connection will be suddenly broken, The only thing to do is to call again, or use a higher precedence. The moral to this story is to get through all of the important talk as soon as possible and leave gossip to the end.
