(OIL SPILL DANGER TOLD)
SAIPAN, AUGUST 29 (MNS) 72 TT HEADQUARTERS HEALTH SERVICES

OFFICIALS ARE CONCERNED ABOUT THE IMMINENT DANGER OF OIL SPILLS FROM THE 954-TON KOREAN FISHING VESSEL THAT RAN AGROUND ON THE REEF OF NGULU ATOLL, YAP DISTRICT EARLIER THIS MONTH.

ACCORDING TO WILLIAM BREWER, MICROBIOLOGIST, DIVISION OF ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH, DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH SERVICES, THE FISHING BOAT WAS CARRYING 168 TONS OF DIESEL FUEL AND FOUR TONS OF LUBE OIL.

"THE OIL SPILL CONTINGENCY PLAN FOR THE TRUST TERRITORY,"
BREWER SAID, "IS WRITTEN IN SUCH A WAY THAT THE COAST GUARD
WILL COME AND RENDER ASSISTANCE PROVIDED THAT THERE IS IMMINENT
DANGER OF AN OIL SPILL."

THE U.S. COAST GUARD, HOWEVER, HAS NOT RESPONDED TO INQUIRIES FROM THE HEALTH SERVICES DEPARTMENT AS TO WHETHER THEY'RE GOING TO REMOVE THE OIL FROM THE SHIP, HE SAID.

ACCORDING TO BREWER, THE TT ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION BOARD IS TRYING TO COORDINATE THE JOB, BUT THE COAST GUARD HAS THE EQUIPMENT, RESPONSIBILITY AND SPECIALISTS TO DO IT.

INFORMATION FROM YAP INDICATES THAT A BARGE IS AVAILABLE

TO BE USED BY THE COAST GUARD TO TRANSFER THE OIL.

A STAR KIST AGENT FROM VAN CAMP IN PALAU IS SENDING A SALVAGE EXPERT TO SURVEY IF THE SHIP CAN BE SALVAGED OR REFLOATED.

THE KOREAN FISHING BOAT WENT AGROUND ON NGULU ATOLL ON AUGUST 15. THE VESSEL, THE F/V PAINMACHI NO. 2, WAS CARRYING A CREW OF 18.

(PALAUAN HISTORY BOOK COMPLETED)

PALAU, AUGUST 29 (MNS) --- A FOUR-YEAR PROJECT TO COMPILE IN A SINGLE TEXT THE HISTORY OF THE ISLANDS AND PEOPLE OF PALAU HAS BEEN COMPLETED BY THE PALAU COMMUNITY ACTION AGENCY.

UNDER THE DIRECTION OF KATHERINE KESOLEI, THE PROJECT INVOLVED COMPILATION OF MATERIALS DEALING WITH PALAU'S HISTORY FROM MANY SOURCES, AND REPRESENTS THE PERSPECTIVE OF THE FOREIGN VISITORS TO THE ISLANDS WHO WROTE ARTICLES, JOUNALS, LOGS BOOKS OR STUDIES ABOUT THEIR EXPERIENCES. THE PROJECT WAS TO SYNTHESIZE AND COALESCE THESE PUBLISHED WORKS INTO A SINGLE VOLUME. PLANS TO COMPLEMENT THE WORK WITH A HISTORY OF PALAU OBTAINED ENTIRELY FROM NATIVE PALAUANS-THEIR FEELINGS, THOUGHTS AND RECOLLECTIONS OF THEIR HISTORY.

MS. KESOLEI WAS ON SAIPAN THIS VEEK, MAKING ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE PUBLICATION OF THE BOOK. THE TEXT BEGINS WITH A DISCUSSION OF MATERIAL AND NON-MATERIAL CULTURES OF TRADITIONAL PALAU, AND THEN COVERS IN CHRONOLOGICAL ORDER THE 18TH CENTURY DISCOVERY AND 19TH CENTURY WHALING AND TRADING PERIODS, AND THE SPANISH, GERMAN, JAPANESE AND AMERICAN TIMES. A FINAL CHAPTER DEALS WITH THE FUTURE STATUS QUESTION AS IT RELATES TO PALAU.

"OUR HOPE WAS TO CREATE SOME MATERIALS RELEVANT TO
THE HISTORY AND CULTURE OF PALAU TO BE USED IN THE SCHOOLS,"
MS. KESOLEI SAID. "THE BOOK IS A PRODUCT OF THE EFFORTS
OF SEVERAL PEOPLE, CHIEF AMONG THEM PEACE CORPS VOLUNTEER
MICHAEL YARBOROUGH, FATHER FRANCES HEZEL OF XAVIER HIGH
SCHOOL IN TRUK, AND FATHER FELIX YOACH OF PALAU."
MS. KESOLEI ALSO MENTIONED ESPECIALLY THE CONTRIBUTION OF
PROFESSOR JAMES RITCHIE OF NEW ZEALAND'S WAIKATO
UNIVERSITY. A CONSULTANT TO THE PROJECT.

DETAILS ON PUBLICATION OF THE BOOK ARE NOT YET COMPLETE, BUT "A HISTORY OF PALAU" SHOULD BE SOON AVAILABLE TO THE SCHOOL CHILDREN OF PALAU AND OTHERS INTERESTED IN THIS MICRONESIAN DISTRICT AND HER PEOPLE.
