SAIPAN, JAN. 30 (MNS) --- THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DIVISION, DEPARTMENT OF RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT, REPORTS THAT ONE APPLICATION FOR A BUSINESS PERMIT WAS RECEIVED DURING THE PAST WEEK AND THAT ONE APPLICATION FOR A PERMIT RENEWAL HAS BEEN TURNED DOWN BY THE MARIANAS DISTRICT ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT BOARD. THE NEW BUSINESS PERMIT APPLICATION RECEIVED WAS FOR THE ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES LTD., A FIRM WHICH IS OWNED BY PEDRO A. TENORIO OF SAIPAN AND FROILAN C. TENORIO FROM THE UNITED STATES.

THE FIRM WILL ENGAGE IN COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL OF ALL TYPES OF SOLID WASTE NATERIALS, INCLUDING DOMESTIC RUBBISH, GARBAGE, COMMERCIAL SOLID WASTES, INDUSTRIAL SOLID WASTES AND

CONSTRUCTION WASTES. ACCORDING TO THE BUSINESS APPLICATION, THE MAIN OBJECTIVE OF THIS PARTICULAR FIRM IS TO PROVIDE UNIQUE SERVICES IN THE HOPE THAT ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH PROBLEMS RESULTING FROM SOLID WASTES MAY BE CONTROLLED IN THE MARIANAS DISTRICT.

IN ANOTHER ACTION, OFFICIALS OF TRASEN OF MICRONESIA, WHICH HAD A PERMIT TO DO BUSINESS AS AN ARCHITECTURE AND ENGINEERING FIRM IN THE MARIANAS, WERE INFORMED THAT THE MARIANAS BOARD HAD TURNED DOWN ITS APPLICATION FOR RENEWAL OF THE PERMIT. THE MARIANAS BOARD RECOMMENDED AGAINST RENEWAL BECAUSE TRASEN OF MICRONESIA DID NOT MAKE USE OF ITS ORIGINAL PERMIT. (NEW FISHERIES BOATS)

SAIPAN, JAN. 30 (MNS)---THE DIRECTOR OF RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT, WYMAN X. ZACHARY, HAS ANNOUNCED THE RECEIPT OF TWO MOULDED GLASS 26-FOOT WHALEBOATS BY THE MARINE RESOURCES DIVISION FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE'S NATIONAL OCEANIC AND ATMOSPHERIC ADMINISTRATION'S NATIONAL MARINE FISHERIES SERVICE LABORATORY IN HONOLULU.

THESE TWO BOATS ARE POWERED BY 25 HP DIESEL ENGINES AND ARE CONSIDERED VERY SEAWORTHY AND RUGGED. BOTH WERE TRANSPORTED AT NO COST TO THE TRUST TERRITORY ON BOARD THE U.S.S. HORNE FROM HONOLULU TO GUAM BY THE U.S. NAVY AS PART OF ITS OPERATION HANDCLASP PEOPLETO-PEOPLE PROGRAM. THESE BOATS WILL BE SHIPPED TO YAP AND THEN TO ULITHI FOR USE IN ON-GOING FISHERIES PROGRAMS WHICH ARE NOW UNDER THE DIRECTION OF MIKE MCCOY, THE DISTRICT FISHERIES SPECIALIST.

ONE OF THE VESSELS WAS RECEIVED IN OPERATING CONDITION, WHILE THE SECOND WILL BE SENT TO SAIPAN FOR OVERHAUL PRIOR TO SHIPMENT TO THE DISTRICT. IT IS EXPECTED THAT THESE BOATS WILL FIND WIDE USE IN THE YAP DISTRICT IN HELPING WITH THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE OUTER ISLAND FISHERIES AND CONSERVATION OF MARINE STOCKS.
