(HICOM DISAPPROVES HB 3)
SAIPAN, FEB. 22 (MNS) --- TRUST TERRITORY HIGH COMMISSIONER:
EDWARD E. JOHNSTON HAS DISAPPROVED A BILL PASSED EARLIER: THIS:

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MONTH BY THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA THAT WAS DESIGNED TO CURB THE PRACTICE OF NON-CITIZENS USING A MICRONESIAN SPOUSE OR ADOPTED CHILD AS A "FRONT" TO AVOID COMPLIANCE WITH FOREIGN BUSINESS PERMIT REGULATIONS (HB 3).

THE ACTION CAME FRIDAY AFTERNOON (FEB. 22), ON THE FINAL DAY OF THE TEN-DAY PERIOD GIVEN TO THE HICOM TO REVIEW AND ACT ON THE BILL. OF THE TWO BILLS OFFICIALLY TRANSMITTED TO THE SIGNED INTO LAW, AND THE OTHER DISAPPROVED.

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IN A LETTER TO THE CONGRESSIONAL LEADERSHIP EXPLAINING HIS ACTIONS, HIGH COMMISSIONER JOHNSTON SAYS: "WE FEEL THAT THIS ACT IS DISORIMINATORY AGAINST MICRONESIANS WHO HAVE MARRIED OR BEEN ADOPTED BY NON-TRUST TERRITORY CITIZENS AND ARE NOW BEING SUBJECTED TO RULES UND REGULATIONS NOT IN EFFECT AT THE TIME OF THEIR MARRIAGE AND/OR ADOPTION. IN OUR OPINION, IT IS UNFAIR AND UNJUST TO SUBMIT THESE MICRONESIAN CITIZENS TO ECONOMIC REGULATIONS AND DISCRIMINATORY PRACTICES WHICH DO NOT APPLY TO THEIR FELLOW CITIZENS. WE ARE, IN FACT, ADVISED BY THE ATTORNEY GENERAL'S OFFICE THAT THIS LAW, IF ENACTED, COULD WELL BE SET ASIDE BY THE COURTS AS BEINV ILLEGAL WHEN REVIEWED FROM THE STANDPOINT OF 'SQUAL PROTECTION OF THE LAW!"

THE HICOM SAYS THE ADMINISTRATION ALSO FOUND OBJECTIONABLE A PORTION OF THE PROPOSED LAW WHICH DEFINES ANY CORPORATION, CMMPANY OR ASSOCIATION IN WHICH A PERSON NOT A TT CITIZEN OWNS ANY INTEREST AS A "NONCITIZEN"FOR PURPOSES OF THE ACT, WTHIS. PROVISION WOULD TEND TO ACT ADVERSELY AGAINST THIRD PARTY MICRONESIAN CORPORATION WITHOUT THEIR HAVING ANY REGRESS, W THE HICOM LETTER STATES.

THE DISAPPROVAL LETTER CONCLUDES: "THE EXECUTIVE BRANCH

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OF THE TRUST TERRITORY GOVERNMENT FULLY RECOGNIZES THAT A
PROBLEM BOES EXIST IN THE AREA OF ECONOMIC ACTIVITY TOWARD WHICH
THIS BILL WAS DIRECTED. WE FEEL, HOWEVER, THAT THERE ARE
BETTER WAYS TO SOLVE THE PROBLEM WITHOUT HAVING TO DISCRIMINATE
IN ANY MANNER AGAINST MICRONESIAN CITIZENS."



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UNDER TERMS OF SECRETARIAL ORDER 2918, THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA MAY NOW RECONSIDER THE VETOED BILL IF IT CHOOSES TO DO SO, AND IF RE-PASSED BY A TWO-THIRDS MAJORITY OF BOTH HOUSES, THE LEGISLATION WOULD BE RETURNED ONCE AGAIN TO THE HIGH COMMISSIONER. SHOULD HE STILL DISAPPROVE OF THE BILL, A FINAL DECISION ON ITS DISPOSITION WOULD BE UP TO THE SECRETARY OF THE INTERIOR.

(SENATORS VOTE VETO OVERRIDE)

SAIPAN, FEB. 22 (MNS) --- THE SENATE TOOK AN HISTORIC VOTE TO OVERRIDE A VETO OF THE HIGH COMMISSIONER FRIDAY (FEB. 22), IN ONE OF THE PRINCIPAL ACTIONS OF THE 40TH DAY OF THE CURRENT CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA SESSION ON SAIPAN.

ACTING ON RECOMMENDATION OF ITS COMMITTEE ON RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT, CHAIRED BY SENATOR AMATA KABUA (MARSHALLS), THE SENATORS VOTED UNANIMOUSLY TO REPASS U BILL RELATING TO

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ADMIRALTY AND MARITIME AFFAIRS (SB 94). BASICALLY, THE BILL:
ESTABLISHED A PROCEDURE TO MAKE MICRONESIA A COUNTRY OF REGISTRY
FOR SHIPS, AND WAS DISIGNED BOTH TO GENERATE SUBSTANTIAL REVENUE
FOR THE TERRITORY, AND TO ENCOURAGE THE FORMATION OF
MICRONESIAN COMMERCIAL SHIPPING COMPUNIES.

THE BILL PASSED DURING THE FIRST REGULAR SESSION OF THE FIFTH CONGRESS, ON FEBRUARY 26, 1973. IT WAS DISAPPROVED BY THE HIGH COMMISSIONER ON APRIL 20 OF THAT YEAR, LARGELY ON THE GROUNDS THAT REPIDLY MOVING DEVELOPMENTS IN INTERNATIONAL SHIPPING LAW MADE ENACTMENT OF THE LEGISLATION UNWISE AT THAT PARTICULAR STAGE.

POINTING OUT THAT THE BILL WAS THE RESULT OF A JOINT EFFORT OF THE CONGRESS AND THE ADMINISTRATION, AND WAS SUPPORTED BY THE DIVISION OF TRANSPORTATION, THE R AND D COMMITTEE REPORT FURTHER POINTS OUT THAT THE ADMINISTRATION HAD AMPLE OPPORTUNITY TO MAKE ANY OBJECTIONS IT MIGHT HAVE KNOWN DURING THE COURSE! OF CONSIDERATION OF THE BILL, AND DID NOT DO SO. THE MEASURE NOW GOES TO THE HOUSE, WHERE A TWO-THIRDS MAJORITY WILL ALSO! BE NEEDED IN ORDER TO SEND THE LEGISLATION BACK TO THE HIGH! COMMISSIONER.



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ONCE THE HICOM RECEIVES A BILL THAT HAS BEEN RE-PASSED OVER HIS VETO, HE HAS TWENTY DAYS IN WHICH TO RECONSIDER THE MEASURE. IF HE FINDS HE STILL CANNOT APPROVE OF IT, HE SENDS THE BILL ON TO SECRETARY OF THE INTERIOR ROGERS C.B. MORTON, WHO HAS ANOTHER SIXTY DAYS TO CONSIDER THE LEGISLATION. IF THE INTERIOR SECRETARY APPROVES OF IT, IT BECOMES LAW. IF HE DOES NO, THE BILL DOES NOT BECOME LAW AND NO FURTHER LEGISLATIVE ACTION ON THE MEASURE BY THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA IS POSSIBLE.

IN OTHER CONGRESSIONAL ACTION AS THE LAWMAKERS COMPLETED.
THE SIXTH FULL WEEK OF THEIR SESSION, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.
PASSED AND SENT TO THE HIGH COMMISSIONER THE FOURTH BILL TO COME OUT OF THE SESSION. IT IS A MEASURE TO REQUIRE THE APPROVAL OF DISTRICT PLANNING COMMISSIONS BEFORE ANY PUBLIC OR PRIVATE LAND CAN BE LEASED TO A NMN-CITIZEN (HB 135). PRESENTLY THE LAW REQUIRES ONLY THAT THE ADVICE AND OPINIONS OF THE PLANNING COMMISSIONS BE SOUGHT IN SUCH MATTERS, BUT HHERE IS NO REQUIREMENT THAT THEIR RECOMMENDATIONS BE FOLLOWED. THE BILL, INTRODUCED BY REPARSENTATIVE HERMAN GUERRERO (MARIANAS), IS AN OUTGROWTH OF A SITUATION ON SAIPAN, WHERE LAND FOR A HOTEL PROJECT WAS LEASED DESPITE THE OBJECTIONS OF THS PLANNING.

PAGE 07 RUNGSAA558B UNCLAS COMMISSION INVOLVED. THE MARIANAS CONGRESSMAN WAS A PRINCIPAL PLAINTIFF IN A LAWSUIT WHICH SOUGHT TO HALT CONSTRUCTION OF THAT HOTEL, THE SAIPAN CONTINENTAL.

THE HOUSE AND SENATE EACH PASSED ONE ADDITIONAL BILL ON SECOND READING DURING THEIR FRIDAY AFTERNOON SESSIONS, AND SENT THE MEASURES TO THE OTHER CHAMBER FOR FURTHEC CONSIDERATION. PASSED IN THE SENATE WAS A BILL CARRIES A SENATE DRAFT WHICH MUST NOW BE ADOPTED BY THE HOUSE BEFORE THE MEASURE CAN BE SENT TO THE HICOM. HOUSE MEMBERS PASSED A \$50,000 DOLLAR APPROPRIATION BILL TO DEFRAY EXPENSES OF THS CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA GENERAL ELECTION ON NOVEMBER 5, THIS YEAR (SB 221). THE HOUSE HAS REDUCED THE AMOUNT OF THE APPROPRIATION FROM \$60,000 TO \$50,000, SO THIS BILL, TOO, MUST BE RETURNED FOR FURTHER ACTION BEFORE IT CAN BE SENT TO THE HICOM.

UNCLAS SECTION 02 OF 03 ADOPTED, AND SENT TO THE SENATE, THEY ARE: A MEASURE ADKING THE SECRETARY OF INTERIOR TO AMEND SECRETARIAL ORDER 2902 TO REQUIRE THE APPROVAL OF THE CONGRESS BEFORE ANY FRANCHISE AGREEMENT FOR AIR OR SEA TRANSPORTION MAY BE ENTERED INTO (HJR 97); A MEASURE ASKING THAT FEDERAL FUNDS BE INCLUDED IN THE FY 1975 GUDGET TO BEGIN CONSTRUCTION OF THE NEW CAMPUS

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OF THE COMMUNITY DOLLEGE OF MICRONESIA IN PONAPE (HJR 93); AND A RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE DIRECTOR OF RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT TO ESTABLISH AN AGRICULTURAL SUBSTATION ON FEFEN ISLAND, IN THE TRUK LAGOON (HJR 55).

IN THE SENATE, THE ONLY UCTION ON FRIDAY'S RESOLUTION CALENDAR WAS ADOPTION OF A JOINT RESOLUTION EXPRESSING SYMPATHY AND CONDOLENCES TO THE FAMILY OF THE LATE LEWI DAVID OF PONAPE, WHO PASSED AWAY RECENTLY 'SJR 103). DAVID WAS THE ADOPTIVE

IN THE SENATE THE PRIMARY ACTION FRIDAY WAS A LENGTHY FLOOR DEBATE ON CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF THE BILL RELATING TO THE TRUST TERRITORY SALARY PLAN (SB 276). ACTION ON THIS BILL HAD BEEN DEFERRED, IN THE ONLY ACTIVITY AT THE THURSDAY AFTERNOODN SESSION OF THE SENATE, AND FRIDAY THS SENATORS DEFERRED ACTION ON THE MEASURE AGAIN, THIS TIME UNTIL MONDAY.

THE BILL IS SORT OF AN OMNIBUS BILL, COVERING SEVERAL ASPECTS OF GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEE SALARIES AND REGULATIONS. AMONG ITS PROVISIONS, AS AMSNDED IN SENATE COMMITTEE, ARE SECTIONS. TO REDUCE THE MUXIMUM SALARY THAT MAY BE PAID TO MICRONESIAN GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES, TO PRUVIDE FOR CONGRESS ADVICE AND CONSENT ON THE POSITIONS OF CERTAIN DIVISION CHIEFS, TO PROVIDE FOR ROTATION OF DISTRICT ADMINISTRATORS AMONG ALL THE DISTRICTS, TO EXTEND THE PRESENT SALARY PLAN --THE MAIN PURPOSE OF THE BILL -- AND TO REDUCE THE NUMBER OF PAID HOLIDAYS TO WHICH GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES ARE ENTITLED TO FOUR, NEW YEAR'S DAY, MICRONESIA DAYN UNITED NATIONS DAY, AND CHRISTMAS DAY.

IT WAS THIS LATTER PROVISION THAT GERATED MOST OF THE COMMENT ON THE FLOOR, MARIANAS SENATOR OLYMPIO BORJA SAID HE

REMAINS UNCHANGED, SENATOR ANDON AMARAICH (TRUK), WHOSE

THE BILL, REPLIED "HAT MOSH OF THE HOLIDAYS PRESENTLY CELEBRATED
IN MICRONESIA, SUCH AS COLUMBUS DAY AND INDEPENDENCE DAY, HAVE

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LITTLE OR MO RELEVANCE TO MICRONFSIA, SENATOR AMBILOS IEMSI (PONAPE) SAID HE THINKS THE FOUR HOLIDAYS PROVIDED IN THE BILL ARE "SUFFICIENT".

OTHER FLOOR COMMENT ON THE BILL CONCERNED THE LEVELS OF GOVERNMENT SALARIES, WHETHER OR NOT THE SALARY REDUCTIONS IN THE BILL APPLY TO CONGRESS EMPLOYEES AS WELL AS TO EMPLOYEES OF THS EXECUTIVE BRANCH (THEY DO NOT), AND WHETHER THE CONGRESS SHOULD FORMULATE SOME COMPREHENSIVE, BASIC POLICY WITH REGARD TO SALARY LEVELS AND OTHER TYPES OF COMPENSATION, FINALLY, IT WAS DETERMINED THAT CONSIDERABLY MORE THINKING ON THIS BILL WILL BE NECESSARY, AND ACTION ON IT WAS DEFERRED, SENATOR LAZARUS SALII (PALAU), SUGGESTED THAT THE SENATE MEET AS A COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE, PROPABLY POLLOWING THE SESSION ON SUNDAY, TO RESOLVE THEIR DIFFERENCES ON THE SALARY BILL.

IN THS HOUSE, FORU BILLS AND FOUR JOINT RESOLUTIONS WERE INTRODUCED. THE NEW BILLS ARE: A BILL TO MAKE CHANGES IN THE TT CODE CONCERNING THE NATIONALITY FO CHILDREN BORN OUTSIDE THE TT TO PARENTS ONE OF WHOM IS A CITIZEN OF THE TRUST TERRITORY, (HB 328); A MEASURE PROPOSING TO REDUCE THE FEE FOR ISSUANCE OF TDENTIFICATION CARDS UNDER THE TT WEAPONS CANTROL ACT, (HB 329); AN APPROPRIATION MEASURE IN THE AMOUNT FO \$522,000 FOR VARIOUS PURPOSES FOR THE MARIANAS DISTRICT, (HB 330); AND A MEASURE TO APPROPRIATE \$1,465,000 FOR PUBLIC IMPROVEMEN PROJECTS, PROGRAMS, AND SERVICES FOR TRUK DISTRICT, (BH 331).
