This law firm represents the Marianas Political Status Commission in its negotiations with the United States government concerning a new political status for the Mariana Islands District of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands. In connection with these negotiations we are exploring the sort of governmental planning effort which will be required before the new government of the Commonwealth of the Mariana Islands comes into effect. The experience of the Bahamas in preparing for independence may be a highly relevant analogy which would assist the Commission in its work.
