SAIPAN (COM)-Thirteen members of the Congress of Micronesia (COM) filed a complaint Monday against Trust Territory Attorney, Gencral richard I. Miyamoto in the TT Fligh Court on Saipan.
All but one of the plaintiffs are members of COM's Joint Conmittee on Future Status.
The complaint seeks to compel three employes of the TT Resources and Development Department to provide the status committee with documents' relating to testimony they gave in Washington, D.C. about TT public lands.

The three'are Kozo:Yamada, Máy nard Neas and Emmett Rice, all employes of the department's Division of Lands and Surveys. They testified before the Office of Micronesian Status Negotiations in Washington.

Yamada, Neàs and Rice were subpoenaed In July to testify before a subcommittee of the COM's Joint Committee on Future Status. Their refusal to answer questions about their Washington testimony, the 13 plaintiff's contend, constitutes contempt of the Congress of Misronesia.

The complaint also charges that TT Attorney General Miyamoto was prejudiced in his handling of the matter, since he acted as legal counsel for the three Resources and Develonment employes and refused to piusecute them,

Miyamoto has contended that there was no contempt of Congress. The 13 plaintiffs seek to have a special prosecutor appointed to prosecute Yamada, Neas, and Rice.
