4/71 to ¹⁹⁷⁴ Present - Director, Northwest Administrative Service Office, National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, Seattle, WA 98109. Directs a staff of 70 in a regional administrative service office for operations in 14 western states and the Pacific, including Alaska and Hawaii. NOAA organization elements include National Marine Fisheries Service, National Ocean Survey, Environmental Research Laboratories, and National Weather Service. Responsible for recruiting, training, and personnel management program for 1500 employees; contracting, purchasing of supplies and equipment, and property management for multi-million dollar operations at 6 major research laboratories and one marine base with 11 research ships; and for providing budget analysis and financial management services for program managers and 3 Regional Directors. Represents NOAA in relations with other Federal, state, and local officials, the public and news media. Grade GS-15. Salary \$29,099 to \$32,280.

5 months - Special Assistant to Assistant Administrator for Administration, NOAA, Rockville, MD. The Assistant Administrator directed a staff of over 600 employees engaged in providing Personnel Management, Budgeting, Financial Management, Management Systems, Office Services (space management, communications, transportation, etc.) and computer services for a 12,000 man Federal bureau with over \$300 million program. My chief assignment was to assure an orderly amalgamation of the complete administrative operations and organization of the former Bureau of Commercial Fisheries into the new NOAA under the President's Reorganization Plan #4 effective 10/3/70. Salary \$29,099.

4½ years - Assistant Director for Administration, Bureau of Commercial Fisheries, Washington, D. C. Directed the administrative operations of a major Bureau of the Federal Government, including Budget and Finance, Personnel, Procurement, Property Management, Management Analysis, and ADP coordination. Personally testified before Congressional Committees and the Office of Management and Budget. Bureau had 28 major research labs, 30 ocean-going vessels, grant programs in all 50 states, Samoa, Guam, and Puerto Rico, administered loan programs, and the operations of the towns of St. Paul and St. George in Pribilof Islands, including some industrial operations. I frequently served as Acting Director of the Bureau. Salary \$27,463 per annum.

1½ years - Director, Budget and Finance for the government of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands (called Micronesia) with headquarters at Saipan, Marianas Islands. Administered by the U. S. under a U. N. Charter, the T.T. Government was responsible for providing all medical facilities (Doctors, clinics, and hospitals), schools, utilities, radio broadcast stations, communications, road systems, transportation (air and sea), housing developments, economic development, etc. for area equal in size to U. S. continent but mostly water with 2,000 islands and a population speaking several different languages. Served all 3 branches of government, supervising 70 employees at headquarters and indirectly supervised tax collection, disbursements, and finance operations in 6 district offices (including hospital accounting, utilities sales, etc.). Served as Treasurer of Copra Stabilization Board and several other Boards and Commissions. Salary \$20,010 per annum.

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4½ years - Employed by Hercules, Inc., Salt Lake City, UT (3 yrs.) and Cumberland, MD (1½ yr.). First employed to establish new department of Contract Admin. (sales) at Utah plant mfg. solid propellant motor for Polaris and Minutemen Missiles. Conducted contract relations with customers, negotiated sales contracts and monitored work in plant which grew rapidly to 6,000 employees. Later assigned to Planning & Budgeting department in effort to strengthen cost proposals and reporting to customer. In June 1963 transferred to Cumberland, MD, to activate a contracts admin. (sales) organization, and participated in developing other administrative functions. Worked with Sales Manager in developing new sales proposals. Salary (end) \$16,210 yr.

4 years - Bureau of Reclamation, Salt Lake City, UT. A new position of Regional Finance Officer was established for purpose of organizing a professional accounting staff to provide complete centralized accounting for new billion dollar Colorado River Storage Project. One year later promoted to Regional Admin. Officer, responsible for admin. operations of Region with 15 projects in 7 states, constructing and operating large dams, power plants, and irrigation works. Annual appropriations peaked at \$100 million. Supervised over 100 professional and clerical employees in financial management, personnel management, property management, procurement, program planning and scheduling, budgeting, ADP, photography, offset color printing plant, etc. Included hospital operation (through contracts) and developing police protection, zoning restrictions, protective covenants, etc. for town of Page, AZ, built in a desert area where no town existed before. Town also operated to provide housing for employees. Salary (end) \$12,730 per year.

4 years - Assistant Finance Officer and Finance Officer, Bureau of Reclamation, Ephrata, WA. Responsible for complete accounting program for Grand Coulee Dam and Power Plants, world's largest pumping plant and irrigation works for ultimately irrigating one million acres, and operation of government town of Coulee Dam, WA. Also included purchase and resale program for land valued in the millions of dollars. Accounts structure patterned after Uniform System of Accounts prescribed for utilities. Payrolled 1500 employees scattered over wide area. Salary (end) \$9,205 (Grade GS-13).

3 years - Programs and Finance Officer for multi-million dollar Hungry Horse Dam and Power Plant, Hungry Horse, MT. This project was used as proving ground for innovative budgeting, accounting, and administrative procedures modifications instituted by the Bureau. I received "Outstanding" performance rating. 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BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH ON JOHN M. PATTON, JR.

Mr. John M. Patton, Jr. was born in Gouldbusk, Texas, August 28, 1916, and attended Valley Business College in Harlingen, Texas, and Texas Christian University (evening college) in Fort Worth, Texas. He entered government service in 1934 with the U.S. Forest Service. In 1935 he transferred to the Soil Conservation Service as an Administrative Clerk, and in 1940 moved to the U.S. Department of the Interior, Bureau of Reclamation as a Personnel Clerk at Friant Dam, California. This began a 20-year career with Interior in which Mr. Patton progressed to increasingly responsible administrative positions. His assignments included Finance Officer for the Shasta Dam and Power Plant Project in California; Budget and Finance Officer, Hungry Horse Dam and Power Plant in Montana; and Finance Officer for Columbia Basin Project (Grand Coulee Dam and Power Plant) in the State of Washington.

He was Regional Administrative Officer for the Bureau of Reclamation, Salt Lake City, Utah, when he left government service to work with private industry.

From 1960 to 1965 he worked with private industry as Superintendent of the Contracts Administration Department of the Hercules Powder Co. in Salt Lake City, Utah, and in Cumberland, Maryland. Mr. Patton returned to the Department of the Interior in March 1965, to the position of Director, Budget and Finance with the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands in Saipan, Marianas Islands. In July 1966, he was selected for the position of Assistant Director for Administration, Bureau of Commercial Fisheries, Washington, D.C., which position he held until the creation of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration on October 3, 1970. Mr. Patton became Special Assistant to the NOAA Assistant Administrator for Administration. In April 1971 he was appointed Director, Northwest Administrative Service Office of NOAA with headquarters in Seattle, Washington, which position he now holds.

He is a member of the American Society for Public Administration, the Federal Government Accountants Association, the American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics and is a former member of the Society for Personnel Administration.

He has been an officer in the Kiwanis Club, serving as Director of the Salt Lake City Club, is a 32nd Degree Mason and was listed in Marquis Who's Who in the West, 7th Edition, 1960 and in the first edition of Marquis Who's Who in the Government. He is one of three United States members of the United States-Canadian International Fisheries Commissions Pension Society. He is NOAA's representative on the Seattle Federal Executive Board.

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2 WHEREAS, John M. Patton last year became a Director of Budget and
3 Finance at a time when the expenditure of Federal funds in the Trust
4 Territory was gradually being increased from $7\frac{1}{2}$ million to $17\frac{1}{2}$ million
5 dollars with a projected plan for successive increases to an even
6 higher level of expenditure; and

7 WHEREAS, the said John M. Patton fully appreciating the future
8 fiscal needs of the Trust Territory took immediate steps to realign
9 the fiscal organizational pattern of the Department of Budget and
10 Finance of the Trust Territory so as to meet the anticipated increase
11 in fiscal activities and functions of the said Department of Budget and
12 Finance; and

13 WHEREAS, due primarily to his tireless efforts, foresights, self-
14 less devotion and dedication to duties, the said John M. Patton
15 rightfully earned respect and recognition among his friends and
16 colleagues within and without the Trust Territory Government; and

17 WHEREAS, it is the sense of this Congress that John M. Patton's
18 contribution towards a more responsible and better government for the
19 Trust Territory should not go unnoticed, prior to his departure from
20 the Trust Territory; now, therefore,

21 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Congress of
22 Micronesia, Second Regular Session, 1966, that this House by this means
23 express appreciation and commendation to John M. Patton for his tireless
24 efforts and contribution to the Trust Territory as Director of Budget
25 and Finance; and

1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Speaker be directed to cause
2 the presentation of this Resolution to Mr. John M. Patton in a manner
3 commensurate with the sense of appreciation of this House and that
4 certified copies of this Resolution be sent to the High Commissioner,
5 the Director of the Bureau of Fisheries, and to the Secretary of the
6 Interior.
