Camacho Bound For Washington

Gov. Camacho will leave tonight for Washington to discuss with federal officials GovGuam's \$55 million request for additional schools, sewers and water sources.

He also is expected to meet with Sens. Henry Jackson (D-Washington) and Bennett Johnston (D-Louisiana) concerning energy matters and legislation on submerged land: According to Lt. Gov. Kurt S. Moylan, Camacho also will inquire about 1974 oil supplies and prices for Guam.

He will speak to Jackson, who voted against a submerged late bill for Guam five years ago, in an attempt to enlist his support for the submerged land bill just passed unanimously by the U.S. House of Representatives.

The Governor will discuss high freight rates from the U.S. to Guam and Guam's role in the Asia Development Bank with Interior Secretary Rogers C. B. Morton.

According to Moylan, Camacho will seek Guam's membership in the bank or some acceptable alternative.

The Governor will meet with federal officials to discuss the law of the sea and federal land easements.

Moylan said that possible rollbacks in oil prices for Guam will be a topic of discussion when the Governor meets with Dr. John Dunlap, chairman of the Cost of Living Council.
