CLOAN APPLICABLE MUST COMPLY WITH LAMD

SAIPAN. SEPI. 13 CONST APPLICANTS FOR LOAMS FROM THE
ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT LOAM FUND OF THE TRUST TERRITORY WILL . HAVE THEIR APPLICATIONS RETURNED UNLESS THEY HAVE COMPLIED WITH TERMS OF PUBLIC LAW 5-85, ACCORDING TO EDLF BOARD CHAIRWAN EUSEBIO RECHUCHER.

RECHUCHER SAID FOLLOWING A MEETING OF THE BOARD THIS WEEK THAT BOTH CORFORATIONS AND INDIVIDUALS WHO FALL UNDER THE TERMS OF THAT PARTICULAR LAW WILL HAVE TO COMPLY IF THEY MOPE TO PRIAIN A LOAT. HE SAID THE BOARD "HAS-NO CHOICE" BUT TO REQUIRE COMPLIANCE WITH THIS LAW, EVEN THOUGH MARY PEOPLE DISAGREE WITH IT.

THE LAW! PASSED EARLY THIS YEAR BY THE COMBRESS OF MICROMESIA ATTER IT HAD DEEN VETOED ONCE BY THE HIGH COMMISSIONER, REQUIRES HICHORESIAN CIVIZEND UPO ARE MARRIED TO, ON ADOPTED BY, NON-CITIZENS TO COMPLY WITH PROVISIONS OF THE FOREIGN INVESTMENT PERMIT ACT IN ORDER TO DO BUSINESS IN THE IT. THE LAW ALSO REQUIRES CORPORATIONS TO COMPLY WITH THE LAW IF ANY OF THEIR STOCKHOLDERS FALL INTO THOSE TWO CATEGORIES.

RECHUGHER SAID HE IS "VERY CONCERNED" BECAUSE SOME CORPORATIONS "ITH EDLY LOANS MAY HAVE STOCKHOLDERS WHO ARE MARRIED TO NON-CITIZENS, OR ADOPTED BY MON-CITIZENS, YET MAY NOT RELIZE THAT THE LAW YOU REQUIRES THEW TO HAVE A FOREIGN BUSINESS PERHIT.

ONLY ABOUT TEN APPLICATIONS UNDER PUBLIC LAW 5-85 HAVE BEEN RECLIVED SO FAR, ACCORDING TO THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENTS DIVISION OF THE RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT. MOST HAVE COME FROM INDIVIDUALS, ALTHOUGH A FEW COMPANIES HAVE

FORMER CONGRESS OF MICROMESIA MEMBER CARLOS SHODA BECAME THE FIRST MICRONESIAN MAN TO FILE UNDER THE LAW THIS WEEK. SHODA, WHOSE WIFE, LOLKE, IS A H.S. CITIZEN, SAID WE "RELUCTANTLY" FILED FOR A FOREIGN BUSINESS PERMIT FOR HIS HOUSE RENTAL BUSINESS ON SAIPAN, EVEN THOUGH HE THINKS THE LAW IS DISCRIMINATORY. "I FEEL THIS LAW IS DEPRIVING ME OF MY CONSTITUTIONAL RIGHTS," HE TOLD MAS.

SHODA ADDED THAT HE WOULD BE INTERESTED IN JOINING OTHER CITIZENS IN LEGAL ACTION TO CHALLENGE THE LAW, ALTHOUGH HE HAS NOT YET DONE SO.

NUMEROUS MICRONESIAN CITIZENS WHO ARE AFFECTED BY THE AND WHO ARE ENGAGED IN BUSINESSES IN THE TT, STILL HAVE NOT FILED THEIR APPLICATIONS EVEN THOUGH THE LAW HAS BEEN IN EFFECT NOW FOR SEVERAL WEEKS. THEY HAVE UNTIL OCTOBER 250 TO FILE, OR HE IN VICLATION OF THE LAW IF THEY CONTINUE TO RUT THEIR BUSINESSES WITHOUT THE REQUIRED PERMIT.

(HICOM SIGNS ONE MORE BILL)

SAIPAN, SEPTEMBER 13 (MNS) --- TRUOT TURRITORY HIGH COMMISSIONER EDWARD E. JOHNSTON HAS SIGNED AMOTHER OF THE BILLS FROM THE SUMMER SPECIAL SESSION OF THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA INTO LAV.

IN A CEREMONY IN HIS OFFICE ATTENDED BY MARIANAS CONDRESSMAN FELIPE O. ATALIA AND OTHER DISTRICT OFFICIALS, THE HICOM AFFIXED HIS SIGNATURE TO HOUSE BILL 360. WHICH . EARMARKS \$357,000 FOR VARIOUS PUBLIC PROJECTS IN THE MARIANAS DISTRICT. THE BILL NOW BECOMES PUBLIC LAW 5-108.

MICROMISIAN NEWS SERVICE REPORTED EARLIER THIS WEEK THAT THE MARIANAS FUNDING BILL HAD ALREADY BEEN SIGNED. THIS WAS IN ERROR. THE FUNDING BILL SIGNED AS PART OF THE GROUP OF FIFTEEN BILLS THESDAY CSEPT. 100 WHICH MAS INCORRECTLY

REPORTED AS THE MARIANAR BILL WAS AUTUALLY A PILL APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR THE HEALTH SCHOOLES DIPARTMENT (MB 347). THAT PILL IS NOW PUBLIC LAY 5-10%.

MMS HAS ALSO LEARNED THAT THE PALAU DISTRICT PROBLEM BILL, APPROPRIATING \$356,000 FOR VARIOUS PROJECTS IN THAT DISTRICT, MAS SIGNED INTO LAW EARLIER THIS WEEK AS PUBLIC LAW 5-103.

THERE ARE NOW FOUR BILLS REMAINING UNDER CONSIDERATION BY THE OFFICE OF THE HIGH COUNISSIONER, TWO OF THEW MUST BE ACTED UPON ON OR BEFORE SEPTEMBER 22: THE OTHER TWO OW OCTOBER 3.

(NISHIO ON TOURISM IN MICROWESIA)

SAIPAN, SEPT. 13 (MMS) --- THE CHATRMAN OF THE JAPAN ASSOCIATION OF TRAVEL AGENTS HAVE WARRED THAT IT TOWNST FACILITIES IN WICROMESIA ARE BUILT BEYOND CAPACITY, THE AREA WILL SEE AN "OVER-FLOW" OF VISITORS THAT WILL CAUSE MORE DESTRUCTION TO THE NATURAL ENVIRONMENT.

TOSHIO NISHIO, WHO IS ALSO EXECUTIVE ADVISOR FOR THE JAPAN TRAVEL BEREAU INCORPORATED, SAID THAT "SUCH SIFREO-TYPED AND HIGHLY ARTIFICIAL DEVELOPMENT WILL CAUGE IRREVERSABLE DAMAGE TO THE NATURAL ENVIRONMENT AND THIS MUST BE PREVENTED AT ALL COST.

"I STRONGLY DESIRE," HE CONTINUED, "THAT THE TOURISM WILL BE SO DEVELOPED AS TO CONTRIBUTE TO THE PROMOTICE OF THE ECONOMY AND CULTURE OF THE MICRONESIAN CONTRIBUT. AND THAT AN IDEAL SYSTEM WILL BE ESTABLISHED SO THAT THE JAPANESE TOURISTS ARE HEARTILY WELCOMED AND WARD MEART TO HEART FRIENDSHIP IS POSSIBLE."

HISHIO SPORE AT THE JAPAN-HAMAII ECONOMIC COMMOIL MEETING HELD ON SAIPAN THURSDAY (SEPT. 12) AT THE CONTINENTAL HOTEL.

NOTING THAT MICRONESIA'S LAND AREA COMPRISES OF THE TOWN SQUARE MILES AND THE POPULATION IS A LITTLE OVER OME HUNDRED THOUSAND, NISHIO SAID THAT THE ABILITY OF MICRONESIA TO ACCOMMODATE TOURISTS ON ONE ISLAND IS "PHYSICALLY AND ECONOMICALLY LIMITED."

HE MENTICNED A REPORT SUBMITTED BY A COMITTEE FROM JAPAN WHICH STUDIED FUTURE TRENDS OF LEISURE LIFE AND A GOVERNMENT PROPOSAL TO RECOMMEND A FIVE-DAY WORK WITH AND A LONGER VACATION SYSTEM. THE SYSTEM, WHICH CALLS FOR PAID VACATIONS, WILL INCREASE JAPANESE TOURISTS OVERSEAS AND THEY WILL STAY LONGER IN ONE RESORT, HE SAID.

THE SO-CALLED "ONE-DESTINATION TOURS" WHICH THE GOVERNMENT BUSINESSMEN, "FROM THE VIEWFOINT OF MICROMESIA AS A POTENTIAL RESORT TO BE DEVELOPED AND JAPAN AS ITS MAJOR MARKET, I THINK THAT MICROMESIA WILL BE CHOSEN AS AMOST SUITABLE PLACE FOR THE "OME-DESTINATION TOUR" FROM JAPAN." HE ADDED THAT HE HOPES MICROMESIA WILL DEVELOP INTO A NEW AND UNIQUE RESORT DIFFERENT FROM OTHER AREAS LIKE HAMAII AND TAHITI. "NO ONE, I AM SURE, EXPECTS A SECOND VERSION OF WAIKIKI IN MICROMESIA," HE SAID.

CONCLUDING HIS REMARKS, NISHIO SAID THAT AT A MEETING HELD IN TIKYO ON MICRONESIA IN JULY, THE CONFERES CONCLUDED THAT "MICRONESIA, WHICH IS POLITICALLY CONJECTED WITH THE USA, WILL BE INFLUENCED BY JAPAN ECONOMICALLY, AND THAT THE JAPANESE TOURIST FLOW TO GUAM AT PRESENT WILL EXPAND TO SAIPAN, TRUK AND PALAU."

AT BIKINI, RONGELAP AND BTIRNI IN THE UNDERGLES,
"THE AEC HAS A RESEARCH VESSEL ROSED AT MYLICIDE IN THAT

VISIT, QUITE FREQUENTLY, ENEMETAX, BIRINI AND THE OTHER
ATOLLS."

RAY, WHO SUPERVISED THE RESEARCH EFFORT DURING LATE 1972 AND EARLY 1973 UMICH FRODUCED THE REDIOLOGICAL SURVEY OF ENEWETAK, ALSO EXPLAINED THE RESTRICTIONS THAT WILL APPLY TO SOME OF THE ISLANDS IN THE ATOLL WHEN THE PEOPLE RETURN, ESPECIALLY EMPED; WHERE THE PEOPLE HAD ADPED TO BE ABLE TO

ESTABLISH A SETTLÉMENT.

"THE PRINCIPLE CONCERN THERE," RAY SAID, "IS NOT WITH THE EXPOSURE OF PEOPLE TO RADIATION THAT EXISTS ON THE ISLAND, SO MUCH AS IT IS A CONCERN FOR THE FOOD CHAIN THAT PEOPLE LIVING ON ENJEBY MIGHT HAVE. THE DIET THAT THEY DIGHT HAVE FROM PLANTS AND ANIMALS INDIGEROUS TO THE ISLAND, THE UPTARE OF RADIOACTIVITY INTO THE HUMAL BEING THROUGH BOTH THE PLANTS AND THE FOOD ANIMALS. "GULD BE REYORD THE STANDARDS THAT WE BELIEVE ARE APPROPRIATE.

"THIS IS A MATTER THAT WILL BE SAMDIED CONTINUALLY DURING THE CLEANUP AND AFTER PESETTLE BUT. AND WE KNOW THAT THERE ARE THINGS THAT WE CAN DO TO ACELIORATE THAT SITUATION," RAY CONTINUED. "WE KNOW THAT WITH THE COOPERATION, ASSISTANCE AND ADVICE OF THE PESTAL-FOR EXAMPLE THEIR DIET CAN BE MODIFIED. THENES CAN WE DOWN IN THE WAY OF AGRICULTURAL EXPERIMENTATION. A CERTAIN AMOUNT OF CLEANUP CAN BE DONE.

"WE HAVE NOT YET EVOLVED A PLAN WHICH WE FILL MANES IT PRUDENT FOR THE RETURN TO THAT ISLAND AT THIS TALE, BUT WE CERTAINLY EXPECT THAT THAT WILL OCCUM BEFORE TOO MANY YEARS," RAY CONCLUDED.

DURING THE WEEKEND MEETINGS, THE PEOPLE OF ENTWETAK LEARNED THAT THEY WILL BE ALLOWED TO RETURN TO LIVE ON THE ISLANDS IN THE SOUTHERN HALF OF THE ATOLL, BUT THAT SEVERAL ISLANDS IN THE NORTH, INCLUDING ENJEBI, CANNOT BE LIVED ON YET

THE ENEWETAK PEOPLE ARE PRESENTLY STUDYING THE DRAFT ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT STATEMENT CONTAINING THESE FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS, WHICH MUST BE FINALIZED AND APPROVED BEFORE THE CLEANUP PROJECT CAN BEGIN.
