SAIPAN, JAN. 13 (MNS) --- THE FIRST REGULAR SESSION OF THE SIXTH CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA CONVENED MONDAY (JAN. 13), BEGINNING A 50-DAY SESSION WHICH IS SCHEDULED TO END MARCH 3. THE HOUSES WERE CALLED TO ORDER BY SENATOR TOSINO NAKAYAMA IN THE SENATE AND BY REPRESENTATIVE RAYMOND SETIK IN THE HOUSE, WHO ACTED AS A TEMPORARY CHAIRMAN UNTIL THE ELECTION OF A SPEAKER, BEFORE PACKED GALLERIES OF WITNESSES. THE SENATE'S SESSION WAS BRIEF.

IN THE HOUSE, THE SESSION WAS LARGELY CEREMONIAL, WITH THE SWEARING IN OF ALL BUT THREE MEMBERS BY THE TRUST TERRITORY CHIEF JUSTICE HAROLD BURNETT, THE ELECTION OF OFFICERS AND COMMITTEE CHAIRMEN, AND THE ADOPTION OF THE CREDENTIALS COMMITTEE REPORT.

CREDENTIALS CHALLENGES TOOK UP MOST OF THE DSY'S WORK IN THE HOUSE. AT THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE CREDENTIALS COMMITTEE, WHICH CONSISTED OF CONGRESSMEN LUKE TMAN, CHAIRMAN, JOSE P. MAFNAS (MARIANAS) AND JOAB SIGRAH (PONAPE), THREE MEMBERS WERE NOT SEATED.

THEY ARE EDGAR EDWARDS FROM PONAPE REPRESENTATIVE DISTRICT 14. CHIRO ALBERT AND LAMBERT AAFIN FROM REPRESENTATIVE DISTRICTS 17 AND 18 RESPECTIVELY, IN TRUK DISTRICT.

THE CREDENTIALS COMMITTEE RECOMMENDED THE APPOINTMENT OF A "SPECIAL COMMITTEE ON CREDENTIALS" TO FURTHER INVESTIGATE THE CREDENTIALS OF THE THREE MEMBER-ELECT AND REPORT ITS FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE HOUSE WITHIN THREE DAYS.

THE PETITIONS CONTESTING THE RESULTS OF CONGRESSHOMAN CARMEN M. BIGLER FROM THE MARSHALLS AND CONGRESSMEN KUNIWO NAKAMURA, ISIDORD RUDIMCH, AND POLYCARP BASILIUS, ALL FROM PALAU, WERE ALSO RECEIVED AND EXAMINED.

IN THE CASE OF THE PETITION FILED CONTESTING THE SEAT OF CONGRESSHOMAN CARMEN M. BIGLER, THE COMMITTEE HEARD TESTIMONY AND REVIEWED DOCUMENTS SUBMITTED.

IN THE CASE OF THE PETITION RECEIVED CONTESTING THE ELECTION IN PALAU DISTRICT, "NO PERSON WAS AVAILABLE OR

REDUESTED TO APPEAR BEFORE THE CREDENTIALS COMMITTEE IN SUPPORT OF THE PETITION."

"IN EACH OF THESE FOUR REPRESENTATIVE DISTRICTS, YOUR COMMITTEE FOUND THAT VIOLATIONS OF ELECTION LAW AND REGULATIONS WERE REPORTED; HOWEVER, THESE COMPLAINTS WERE NOT SUBSTANTIATED AND PETITIONERS FAILED TO DEMONSTRATE THAT THE ELECTION IRREGULARITIES WERE OF SUFFICIENT CHARACTER SUCH THAT DIFFERENT RESULTS WOULD OCCUR FROM NEW ELECTIONS," THE GREDENTIALS COMMITTEE REPORT POINTED OUT.

IT FURTHER STATED THAT "MINOR IRREGULARITIES OF DEFICIENCIES ARE NOT CAUSE TO OVERTURN THE WILL OF THE PEOPLE EXPRESSED AT THE POLLS."

THE PETITIONS CHALLENGING EHT ELECTION RESULTS OF CONGRESSMEN-ELECT LAMBERT AAFIN AND CHIRO ALBERT HAVE BEEN FILED BECAUSE THE "COMPLEXITY OF THE ISSUES PRESENTED REQUIRES

"SIMILARLY, THE FAILURE TO RECOMMEND SEATING THE MEMBERS ELECT FROM THE 14TH REPRESENTATIVE DISTRICT IN PONAPE DISTRICT (EDGAR EDWARDS) IS A RESULT OF YOUR COMMITTEE'S DESIRE TO FURTHER RESEARCH LEGAL QUESTIONS RELATING TO THE MATTER," THE REPORT CONCLUDED.

IN OTHER HOUSE ACTIVITIES, INCUMBENT SPEAKER BETHWEL HANRY (PONAPE) WAS RE-ELECTED SPEAKER, CONGRESSMAN EKPAP SILK (MARSHALLS) WAS ELECTED VICE-SPEAKER AND CONGRESSMAN LUKE M. TMAN (YAP) WAS ELECTED FLOOR LEADER.

THE ELECTION OF VARIOUS COMMITTEE CHAIRMEN WAS ALSO CONDUCTED. THEY ARE: CONGRESSMAN RAYMOND SETIK (TRUK), APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE; SASAUD HARUD (TRUK), RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE; JOAB SIGRAH, (PONAPE), EDUCATION COMMITTEE; POLYCARP BASILIUS (PALAU), JUDICIARY AND GOVERNMENTAL RELATIONS COMMITTEE; RESID MOSES, (PONAPE), WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE; AND KUNIWO NAKAMURA (PALAU), COMMITTEE ON HEALTH AND SOCIAL MATTERS.
