Dear Mr. Ambassador:

Recent election results in the Mariana Islands District, while still unofficial, have caused a great deal of confusion and apprehension concerning future Marianas Political Status Commission negotiations with the United States Government. As we are elected representatives of the people of Tinian, we wish to go on record that we strongly support the workd of the Marianas Political Status Commission and the positions it had taking from its inception of status talks to the present.

We are very pleased with the progress made by the Mariams Political Status Commission sinc its creation in 1971 by our District Legislature. It has done an excellent job in ensuring that our future relationship with the United States will be a fair and honorable arrangement for both sides. But we are afraid that misinterpretations of recent election results will serve to jeopardize the interests of our people. For that reason we wish to advice you of our continued support of the positions adopted by the Mariamas Political Status Commission and our edorsement of its position as the true representative of the Mariamas people in their negotiations with the United States Government.

We believe that the United States' requests for land on Timian and Saipan are reasonable and should be honored. After all, negotiations are not one sided declarations of a single party or interest group. Negotiations are the compromised and considered judgements of several competing interest groups. We feel that the Unites States Delegation and the Marianas Political Status Commission have shared this basic principle of a negotiated understanding. Let us not now this basic principle of a negotiated understanding. Let us not now in any way repudiate the results of these forthright negotiations and slow the progress toward a popularly supported Commonwealth Status for the Mariana Islands.

We sincerely hope that during your December 1974 talks with the Mariams Political Status Commission, both sides will be able to sign the Status Agreement.

Cob bless America and the future new Covernment of the Marianas.

A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING THE SUPPORT OF THE TINIAN MUNICIPAL COUNCIL RELATIVE TO THE UNITED STATES LAND REQUIREMENTS ON TINIAN AND OTHER MATTERS

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TINIAN MUNICIPAL COUNCIL:

WHEREAS, on December 11, 1974, a special meeting was called by the Mayor of Tinian and the Speaker of the Tinian Municipal Council for the purpose of being briefed by the two Tinian Representatives on the Marianas Political Status Commission, and

WHEREAS, during that meeting the Tinian Representatives on the Status Commission brought to the attention of the official leaders in that meeting relative to the most current information in the Marianas status negotiations, and

WHEREAS, upon consideration of all relevant information presented by the two Representatives, the Tinian Municipal officials realized the significant benefits that would accrue to the people of Tinian in the new political relationship that is being negotiated by the Marianas Political Status Commission, and

WHEREAS, the Mayor of Tinian in expressing his support toward the status negotiations made a request to the two Representatives of Equation on the Marianas Political Status Commission that the people of Tinian, in view of the extensive land to be used in Tinian for United States national defense, should be given the opportunity to receive at least three per cent of the total returns from the United States payments,
