SAIPAN, FEBRUARY 12 (CONGRESS RELEASE)---INFORMING THE
CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA THAT THE SIGNING OF THE COVENANT FOR
THE PROPOSED COMMONWEALTH OF THE MARIANA ISLANDS MAY BE
SIGNED BY THE END OF THIS WEEK, MARIANAS REPRESENTATIVE OSCAR
C. RASA OFFERED WHAT HE CALL "FRIENDLY ADVISE" TO THE OTHER
FIVE DISTRICTS OF MICRONESIA, IN A SPEECH IN THE HOUSE OF

RASA, A MEMBER OF THE MARIANAS POLITICAL STATUS COMMISSION,
SAID ALTHOUGH SOME OF HIS CONSTITUENTS HAVE EXPRESSED SERIOUS
CONCERNED THAT THE VOTE TO APPROVE OR DISAPPROVE THE COMMONWEALTH
COVENANT WHICH HAS NOT YET BEEN TRANSLATED INTO THE LOCAL
LANGUAGE IN THE MARIANAS IS COMING TOO SOON AND "THERE IS SO
LITTLE TIME FOR POLITICAL EDUCATION BEFORE THEY CAST THEIR
VOTES."

RASA ADVISED: "DON'T BE RUSHED INTO AN AGREEMENT, EVEN
IF YOU ASK FOR IT FIRST. SOMETIMES THE OTHER SIDE CAN USE
YOUR REQUEST AGAINST YOUR OWN BEST INTERESTS, BY PUSHING
HARDER THAN YOU WANT, OR BY USING YOUR REQUEST TO JUSTIFY
DOING SOMETHING YOU DON'T WANT."

RASA ALSO CITED THE WORK OF THE CONGRESS' JOINT COMMITTEE
ON FUTURE STATUS, WHICH HE IS ALSO A MEMBER INDICATING THAT
IN ITS SEVEN YEARS OF EXISTENCE IT "HAS THOROUGHLY STUDIED
STATUS ALTERNATIVES...AND REJECTED ONE ALTERNATIVE THAT IS
UNACCEPTABLE, AND...HAS BEEN MANDATED TO SEEK A THIRD
ALTERNATIVE IN THE EVENT THAT THE MAIN CHOICE CANNOT BE
NEGOTIATED." ACCORDING TO RASA, THE JOINT COMMITTEE "...HAS
TRIED TO LEAD THE PEOPLE OF MICRONESIA AND AT THE SAME TIME

"TO BE THE BEST POLITICAL ARRANGEMENT" RASA PRAISED THE JOINT COMMITTEE ON FUTURE STATUS FOR PROTECTING THE "RIGHTS AND INTERESTS" OF THE MICRONESIAN PEOPLE DURING ITS LONG NEGOTIATIONS.

CONGRESSMAN RASA URGED HIS COLLEAGUES NOT TO BE "FOOLED BY LABELS" AND SAID: "THE QUESTION IS NOT WHETHER THE REST OF MICRONESIA WILL BE UNDER FREE ASSOCIATION, OR COMMONWEALTH, OR WILL BE INDEPENDENT. WHAT IS REALLY AT STAKE IS WHAT KIND OF RELATIONSHIP IS PROVIDED FOR UNDER THE LABEL...DETAILS AND ARRANGEMENT..."

AMONG OTHER THINGS, RASA URGED HIS COLLEAGUES "NOT TO LOOK TO OTHER ISLAND COMMUNITIES LIKE GUAM TO SERVE AS AN EXAMPLE TOWARD WHICH TO STRIVE... IN SOLVING IT POLITICAL GOALS NOT RATHER ON THE COMMUNALITY OF SOCIAL AND ECONOMIC PROBLEMS AND RESOURCES" IN THEIR DISTRICTS.

RASA SAID HE HAS THE "HIGHEST" REGARDS FOR THE WORK OF THE JOINT COMMITTEE FOR PUBLISHING THE AGREEMENTS IT HAS REACHED SO FAR WITH THE U.S. INTO THE NINE MAJOR LANGUAGES OF

MICRONESIA THUS GIVING THE PEOPLE THE OPPORTUNITY TO READ AND UNDERSTAND WHAT IS IT THAT THEY WILL BE CASTING THEIR BALLOTS ON.

RASA INDICATED THAT DESPITE WHAT WILL EVENTUALLY TAKE PLACE FOR THE MARIANAS DISTRICT IN THE NEXT SEVERAL DAYS HE HOPES THAT THE REST OF MICRONESIA "DOES STAY TOGETHER" NOT FOR THE SAKE OF HOW IT HAS BEEN ADMINISTERED UNDER THE TRUSTSHIP, BUT BECAUSE, IN HIS WORDS: "...IN UNITY THERE IS STRENGTH."

CONGRESSMAN RASA URGED HIS COLLEAGUES TO "LOOK" BEFORE THEY "LEAP" TO MAKE SURE EVERY "COMMON MAN" UNDERSTANDS HIS "PREFERENCES AND OBLIGATIONS" AND REALIZES THE "LIMITATIONS OR DISADVANTAGES" UNDER ANY PROPOSED STATUS AGREEMENT.

THE YOUNG MARIANAS CONGRESSMAN CLOSED HIS REMARKS WITH A PARAPHASE FROM THE BIBLE: "WHAT DOES IT PROFIT A MAN TO GAIN THE ENTIRE WORLD, IF IN SO DOING HE LOSES HIS SOUL?" HE ASKED.

"IN THIS CASE," HE CONTINUED, "I URGE MY COLLEAGUES TO REMEMBER THAT THERE IS A DIFFERENCE BETWEEN 'CHANGE' AND

SMITAN, FEBRUARY 12 (MNS)---THE THIRD HOUSE BILL TO BE SENT TO THE IT HIGH COMMISSIONER FOR ACTION PASSED THE SENATE OF THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA (VOM) WEDNESDAY (FEB. 12). THE INTENT OF THE BILL IS TO MAKE AN ACROSS-~~THE~~BOARD INCREASE IN SOCIAL SECURITY BENEFITS INCLUDING AN INCREASE IN THE MINIMUM BENEFIT FROM \$20 PER MONTH TO \$24 PER MONTH, (HB 6-1).

THE SENATE ALSO PASSED TWO NATURALIZATION BILLS ON SECOND READING AND ADOPTED THREE SENATE JOINT RESOLUTIONS. MARIANAS SEN. OLYMPIO T. BORJA SPOKE IN FAVOR OF A RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE U.S. CONGRESS TO ALLOW THE MICRONESIA DEVELOPMENT BANK (MOB) TO ADMINISTER AND MANAGE FUNDS FROM THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT LOAN FUND (EDLF). (SEE FOLLOWING STORY.)

IN DEBATE ON THE RESOLUTION SEN. OHN MANGEFEL OF YAP COMMENTED THAT, "WE'RE ASKING A NON-EXISTENT BANK TO MANAGE THE EDLF MONEY. FIRST I'D LIKE TO SEE THE BANK IN OPERATION."

MARIANAS SEN. PEDRO A. TENOKIU PROPOSED AN AMENDMENT TO THE RESOLUTION STATING, THE MOB, "WHEN ESTABLISHED," WOULD MANAGE THE FUNDS. WITH THAT AMENDMENT THE RESOLUTION PASSED WITH NO OPPOSITION.

THE U.S. GOVERNMENT TO SEEK AGREEMENTS WITH OTHER NATIONS OF THE PACIFIC BASIN WHEREBY FISHING VESSELS FROM THOSE COUNTRIES COULD BE PENALIZED FOR VIOLATING U.S. WATERS, (SJR 6-12).

SEVERAL RESOLUTIONS DEALING WITH THE PROPOSED UPCOMING COMMEMORATION OF THE TENTH ANNIVERSARY OF THE CREATING OF THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA WERE INTRODUCED AND PLACED ON THE RESOLUTION CALENDAR FOR IMMEDIATE ACTION BY THE SENATE. PONAPE SENATOR PLY OLTOR, HOWEVER, OBJECTED TO THE OBSERVANCE, WHICH IS SCHEDULED TO TAKE PLACE FROM FEB. 15-17, BECAUSE HE STATED, "WE SHOULD NOT BE IN ANY RUSH TO COMMEMORATE OURSELVES."

SENATOR OLTOR DECLARED, "OTHER PEOPLE ARE LEGISLATING FOR US FROM THE OFF," AND SAID THAT THE COM IS A "COMIC" LEGISLATIVE BODY.

HE ALSO OBJECTED TO THE DATE OF THE COMMEMORATION, SINCE, HE SAID, THAT AS HE REMEMBERS THE CONGRESSMEN WERE SWORN IN DURING JULY 1966. "THE PRESIDING OFFICERS OF CONGRESS MAY HAVE HAVE

A SPEECH BY MARIANAS REPRESENTATIVE OSCAR C. RASA CONCERNING THE SIGNING OF THE COVENANT BETWEEN THE MARIANAS POLITICAL STATUS COMMISSION AND THE UNITED AND THE UNITED STATES DELEGATION HIGHLIGHTED THE SESSION OF THE HOUSE (SEE PRECEDING STORY).

IN OTHER FLOOR ACTIVITY, A BILL WHICH WOULD REQUIRE OCCUPANTS OF HOUSES OR LIVING UNITS PROVIDED BY THE TRUST TERRITORY GOVERNMENT TO PAY FAIR RENTAL CHARGES FOR SUCH

PRIVILEGES SPARKED A LONG DEBATE. MARIANAS CONGRESSMAN HERMAN R. GUERRERO CHARGED THAT THE PRESENT PRACTICE WHEREBY EMPLOYEES FROM THE OTHER DISTRICTS WHO ARE STAYING ON SAIPAN, FOR EXAMPLE, ARE GIVEN FREE GOVERNMENT HOUSING WHILE THE LOCAL RESIDENTS ARE NOT IS "DISCRIMINATORY." MARSHALLS REP. CHARLES DOMNICK COUNTERED THAT IT IS NOT DISCRIMINATORY BECAUSE IF NO OTHER MICRONESIAN CAN FILL THE JOB VACANCY WHICH HAS EXISTED IN ONE PARTICULAR DISTRICT, AND A MICRONESIAN CAN BE FOUND FROM THE OTHER DISTRICT, THAT IS THE TIME WHEN THAT PARTICULAR EMPLOYEE SHOULD BE GIVEN GOVERNMENT HOUSING. HE FURTHER SPOKE AGAINST THE MEASURE BECAUSE IT APPLIES TO MICRONESIAN EMPLOYEES MOVING FROM ONE DISTRICT TO THE OTHER AND NOT JUST TO EXPATRIATE EMPLOYEES.

CONG. DOMNICK POINTED OUT THAT HE DOESN'T "SEE THE LOGIC" AS TO WHY GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES WOULD BE CHARGED RENT FOR HOUSING. HE SAID THAT THERE ARE NOT ENOUGH QUALIFIED MICRONESIANS TO TAKE OVER THE POSITIONS WHICH MANY EXPATRIATE EMPLOYEES ARE PRESENTLY HOLDING.

TRUK REPRESENTATIVE LAMBERT AAFIN WARNED THAT IF THE CONGRESS PASSED SUCH A MEASURE, MANY MICRONESIAN EMPLOYEES FROM THE OTHER DISTRICTS WOULD NOT RENEW THEIR CONTRACTS.

THE BILLS ARE: AMENDING CERTAIN SECTIONS OF PUBLIC LAW 5-88 RELATING TO THE BANK OF MICRONESIA, (SB 6-130); PROVIDING FOR THE CONTROL OF PRICES WITHIN THE TT, (SB 6-131); A REQUIREMENT TO OPEN MEETINGS OF PUBLIC BODIES, MEANING ANY ADMINISTRATIVE, ADVISORY, EXECUTIVE, JUDICIAL, LEGISLATIVE OR ANY ENTITY CREATED

TRUK, FEBRUARY 12 (MNS) - A VISIT BY MEMBERS OF THE PACIFIC ISLANDS DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION (PIDC) TO THE ISLAND OF TOL ALMOST TURNED INTO A TRAGEDY WHEN A BOAT CARRYING THE WIFE OF THE GOVERNOR OF GUAM MRS. RICARDO J. BORDALLO AND FOUR OTHER WOMEN FROM TRUK OVERTURNED BETWEEN THE ISLANDS OF FEFAN AND DUBLON.

ACCORDING TO MRS. MARIA STOLO, WHOSE HUSBAND WORKS AT TRUK CONTINENTAL HOTEL, A GLASS BOTTOM BOAT OWNED BY THE CONTINENTAL HOTEL WHICH WAS CARRYING THEM FROM TOL ISLAND BACK TO MOEN BEGAN TO ENCOUNTER HEAVY WAVES 30 MINUTES AFTER LEAVING TOL.

LOOSE AND WATER WAS SEEPING EACH TIME A BIG WAVE HITS THE BOAT," MRS. STOLP REPORTED.

"FINALLY, BETWEEN THE ISLANDS OF FEFAN AND DUBLON THE GLASS BOTTOM WAS TORN LOOSE AND THE INSIDE OF THE BOAT WAS INUNDATED WITH WATER. I TOLD EVERYBODY TO RUN TO THE FRONT OF THE BOAT. THE BOAT WAS SINKING FAST AND THE NEXT WAVE WASHED EVERYONE OVRBOARD EXCEPT ME BECAUSE I WAS CAUGHT IN THE CABIN. THE NEXT THING I KNEW, I WAS IN THE WATER AND THE BOAT WAS OVERTURNED OVER ME. THE ONLY WAY OF ESCAPE WAS THE NOW EMPTY BOAT BOTTOM WHERE THE GLASS WAS AND I PUT MY ARM THROUGH IT AND YELLED FOR HELP. THE OTHER WOMEN SAW MY ARM AND PULL ME OUT THROUGH THAT HOLE." MRS. STOLP RELATED.

THE LADIES AND THEIR PROPRIETOR HELD ON TO THE SIDE OF THE BOAT UNTIL RESCUED 20 MINUTES LATER BY A GOVERNMENT BOAT. THE LADIES RETURNED TO THE TRUK CONTINENTAL HOTEL COLD, A LITTLE BIT SHOCKED BUT OTHERWISE SAFE AND SOUND.
