BY TITLE 61 (HB 6-219). THE BILL HAS BEEN EXTENSIVELY AMENDED BY THE JUDICIARY AND GOVERNMENTAL RELATIONS COMMITTEE HEADED. BY REP. POLYCARP BASILIUS OF PALAU DISTRICT. THE COMMITTZE I AMENDED THE BILL INCORPORATING THE "DIVERGENT VIEWS OF THE MEMBERS OF THE EXECUTIVE BRANCH" ASHWELL AS VIEWS OF COMMITTEE MEMBERS.

THE PRESENT MINPMUM WAGE IS \$.61 PZR HOUR. THE BILL HWS BEEND
AMEMOED TO INCREASE IT TO \$1.05 AN HOUR.

IM A DEBATE ON THE BILL, CONG. SWSAUD HWRUD URGED THE HOUSE MEMBERS TO BS "VERY CAUTPOUS" IN PASSING SUCH MEASURE. HE SAID THAT HE DID NOT AGREE WITH THE PROPOSED PAY INCREASES FOR GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES REASONING THAT IT WILL MAKE MICRONESIA "MORE DEPENDENT ON THE UNITED STATES IN THE FUTURE." THE TRUK CONGRESSMAN VOICED HIS CONCERN IN THE "UNWARRANTEDHPREFERZNTIAL TREATMENT" TO SEVZRAL EMPLOYEES IN THE TOVERNMENT. HIS VOLLEAGUE, REP. RAY SETIK POINTED OUT THAT THE PROPOSED INCREASE; IN SALARIES TOTALED \$1.6 MILLION AND ASKED WHERE CAN THE MONEY BE FOUND TO ACCOMMODATE THE INCREASES.

MARSHALLS CONGRESSMAN CHARLES DOMNICK ALSO SPOKE AGAINST
THE BILL SAYING THAT THE INCREASE WILL HAVE A "LONG-RANGE EFFECT"
ON OUR ECONOMY" AND THAT THE MINIMUM WAGE OF \$10.00 AN HOUR
WOULD RESULTED IN AN INCREASE OF UNEMPLOYMENT IN MICRONESIA.
HE EXPRESSED THAT THE CONCERN INCREASE WOULD FURTHER RESULT IN
MORE MICRONESIANS LOOSING THEIR JOBS TO OUTSIDERS WHO ARE MORE
OUALIFIED IN SOME OF THE JOBS AND URGED THAT CONGRESS TO GO BACK

TO THE PROPOSED \$.80 AN HOUR. FURTHER, DOMNICK ASSERTED, THE PAY INCREASE MIGHT ALSO RESULT IN REDUCTION-IN-FORCE OF GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES.

REP. OSCAR RASA OF THE MARIANAS STRONGLY URGED THE HOUSE TO PASS THE BILL. HE SHARPLY CRITICIZED THE CONGRESS FOR

JUSTIFYING STRONGLY THE SUPPORT OF SALARY INCREASES AND OFFICE: EXPENSES OF THE MEMBERS OF CONGRESS. "NOW WHEN IT COMES TO RAISING GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES SALARIES, REPORT AFTER REPORT HAS: BEEN SUBMITTED OPPOSING THE MEASURE," RASA SAID. HE FURTHER SAID THAT IF THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA SHOULD BE ABOLISHED TO AID THE POOR PEOPLE, "LET IT BE DONE."

REP. JOAB SIGRAH OF PONAPE INFORMED THE CONGRESS: THAT THE GOVERNMENT MIGHT CUT OFF SOME CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS, INCREASES AND RECOMMENDED TO DEFER ACTION FOR MORE STUDIES.

THE MEASURE PASSED WITH REPS. BIGLER, SETIK, DOMNICK, SIGRAH AND ALBERT DISSENTING. THE BILL WILL NOW BE TRANSMITTED TO THE SENATE FOR FURTHER ACTION.
