(ALL USERS: PLEASE CREDIT CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA)
(RASA AND OLOPAI REPLY)

SAIPAN, APR. 17 (CONGRESS RELEASE)---RESPONDING TO ALLEGATIONS AND WHAT HE TERMED "PERSONAL" REFERENCES BY MARIANAS SENATOR PEDRO TENORIO, REPRESENTATIVE OSCAR CRUZ RASA SAID IN A STATEMENT THURSDAY, (APR. 17), THAT HE WOULD NOT TAKE PART IN A "PERSONAL BATTLE" WITH THE FRESHMAN SENATOR.

RASA SAID: "THIS IS NOT A PERSONALITY CONTEST, THIS IS NOT A CONGRESSIONAL ELECTION. THIS IS AN EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM TO INFORM THE MARIANAS PEOPLE OF THE ONE AND ONLY POLITICAL STATUS ALTERNATIVE THAT IS BEING OFFERED TO THEM. WE MUST STICK TO THE ISSUES, STICK TO POLITICAL EDUCATION, AND THEREFORE I MUST REFUSE TO TAKE PART IN ANY FIGHTING THAT WILL CONFUSE THE ISSUES NOW BEFORE OUR VOTERS IS THE MARIANAS."

RASA DID SAY, HOWEVER, THAT THE TEN THOUSAND DOLLARS OF UNITY FUNDS GIVEN TO THE MARIANAS BY THE CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA, WAS, IN SENATOR TENORIO'S OWN WORDS WAS "...A HANDFUL OF DOLLARS."

"WHY," ASKED RASA, "IS ANYONE UPSET OVER A 'HANDFUL OF DOLLARS?' I HAVE BEEN INFORMED THAT THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT IS PROVIDING \$50,000 FOR SIMILAR ACTIVITIES BY THE MARIANAS STATUS COMMISSION. WHAT I AM SAYING," EXPLAINED RASA, "IS THAT THOSE WHO FAVOR THE PRESENT COVENANT HAVE A FIVE-TO-ONE OR HUNDRED TO ONE FINANCIAL ADVANTAGE WHEN IT COMES TO POLITICAL EDUCATION. I SAY, LET'S STICK TO THE ISSUES AND EDUCATE OUR PEOPLE," RASA SAID. HE ADDED, "THE WHOLE U.S. GOVERNMENT IS BEHIND THEM - ONLY FEW PEOPLE ARE BEHIND US. WE ARE THE UNDERDOGS, BUT WE WILL KEEP TRYING," RASA SAID.

RECALLING THAT THESE PERSONAL ISSUES WERE MADE PUBLIC FIRST BY TENORIO, HE NOTED THAT NO ONE IS MAD AT PETE TENORIO PERSONALLY, BUT THAT THEY DIFFER GREATLY ON THEIR VIEWS OF THE COVENANT. IT IS UNFORTUNATE THAT PRESENT CIRCUMSTANCES MAY BE THE FOCAL POINT OF COMMENTS AGAINST THE COVENANT.

"LET ME MAKE IT CLEAR THAT WE ARE NOT TAKING AN ALL-NEGATIVE APPROACH. WE ARE FOR A COMMONWEALTH. AND WE ARE AGAINST THIS COVENANT, ONLY INsofar AS WE ARE FOR A BETTER, RENEGOTIATED, COVENANT WHICH WILL GIVE BETTER GUARANTEES AND PROTECTION UNDER A COMMONWEALTH TO ALL OF OUR PEOPLE, INCLUDING ME AND MY FAMILY, AS WELL AS SENATOR TENORIO AND HIS FAMILY. "AND MAY I REMIND SENATOR TENORIO," SAID RASA, "THAT...CONGRESSMAN BURTON'S ANNOUNCEMENT YESTERDAY ABOUT TT WAR CLAIMS PROVES CHANGES CAN BE MADE. THEREFORE, MY POLICY IN THE FUTURE WILL BE TO AVOID LETTING PERSONALITIES GET IN THE WAY OF LARGER ISSUES. IN ORDER TO HELP OUR PEOPLE MAKE A MORE INFORMED CHOICE BY THE TIME OF THE PLEBISCITE ON JUNE 17. IT IS OUR HOPe THAT HISTORY WILL RECORD THAT WE WERE ABLE TO PERSUADE MANY PEOPLE INCLUDING THE GOOD SENATOR HIMSELF, THAT BY VOTING "NO" IN JUNE, THEY WILL BE VOTING FOR A BETTER DRAFT OF THE COVENANT LATER, AND CONSEQUENTLY A BETTER FUTURE FOR OUR CHILDREN AND THEIR TEACHERS, NOT JUST FOR THE NEXT FIVE YEARS, BUT AFTER TERMINATION OF THE TRUSTEESHIP AGREEMENT AS WELL.

ABEL OLOPAI, ANSWERING CHARGES MADE EARLIER THIS WEEK BY SENATOR TENORIO AIMED AT THE UNITED CAROLINIAN ASSOCIATION, ALSO RELEASED A STATEMENT THURSDAY, (APR. 17), AGAIN CLARIFYING THE UCA'S POSITION ON PROVISIONS IN THE COMMONWEALTH COVENANT REGARDING LAND OWNERSHIP IN THE MARIANAS AFTER TERMINATION OF THE TRUSTEESHIP AGREEMENT.

RE-EMPHASIZING THAT LAND OWNERSHIP WILL BE RESTRICTED TO PERSONS OF "MARIANAS DESCENT," OLOPAI SAID: "LEGAL OPINIONS DISAGREE CONCERNING WHETHER OR NOT CAROLINIANS WILL BE PERMITTED TO OWN LAND, SINCE WE ARE DESCENDANTS OF CAROLINE ISLANDERS, AS OUR NAME IMPLIES," SAID OLOPAI.

"WE ARE NOT CONCERNED IF THE MARIANAS STATUS COMMISSION SAYS CAROLINIANS WILL BE INCLUDED UNDER THIS PROVISION," SAID OLOPAI. "OUR ONLY CONCERN IS WHETHER THE WORDS 'CAROLINIANS INCLUDED' ARE CLEARLY SPELLED OUT IN WRITING IN THE COVENANT, IN BLACK-AND-WHITE LETTERS, SO THAT IF CHALLENGES ARE EVER MADE IN A FEDERAL COURT, THERE WILL BE NO DOUBT IN THE MIND OF ANY FEDERAL COURT JUDGE CONCERNING WHO IS INCLUDED AND WHO IS NOT INCLUDED IN THE COVENANT AGREEMENT. IN OTHER WORDS, AS LONG AS THESE WORDS ARE NOT WRITTEN IN THE COVENANT, THERE WILL BE NO WRITTEN GUARANTEES FOR CAROLINIANS. WE MUST HAVE WRITTEN GUARANTEES," OLOPAI EMPHASIZED.

REGARDING STATEMENTS BY TENORIO THAT HE DOES NOT OWE CAROLINIANS "ANY FAVORS" FOR THEIR SUPPORT IN THE LAST ELECTION OLOPAI SAID THE UNITED CAROLINIAN ASSOCIATION BELIEVES CERTAIN PUBLIC OFFICIALS HAVE "FED THE MARIANAS AND CAROLINIAN PEOPLE A STEADY DIET OF FALSE STATEMENTS, UNTRUTHS, AND DISTORTIONS FOR TOO LONG."

EVIDENCE OF THIS, SAID OLOPAI, IS CLEARLY CONTAINED IN THE MOST RECENT ISSUE OF THE SO-CALLED "COVENANT NEWSLETTER," PUBLISHED BY THE MARIANAS STATUS COMMISSION, WHICH IS CO-EDITED BY SENATOR TENORIO. OLOPAI SAID STATEMENTS IN THE COVENANT NEWSLETTER TRANSLATED FROM ENGLISH TO CHAMORRO HAVE EXACT OPPOSITE MEANING, AS IN SECTION 105 WHICH STATES THAT THE U.S. CONGRESS WILL BE ABLE TO MAKE LAWS FOR THE MARIANAS, UNDER COMMONWEALTH. "HOWEVER," SAID OLOPAI, "THE CHAMORRO TRANSLATION SAYS THE U.S. CANNOT MAKE LAWS FOR THE MARIANAS.

"HOWEVER, I WOULD LIKE TO BELIEVE THIS WAS AN HONEST ERROR WHICH WILL BE CORRECTED IN THE NEXT ISSUE OF THE NEWSLETTER," OLOPAI ADDED.

OLOPAI ALSO SAID IN HIS STATEMENT THAT FOR THE EDITORS OF THE NEWSLETTER TO PLACE THEIR OWN PICTURE WITH PRESIDENT FORD ON THE COVER, AND THEN TO WRITE ARTICLES AND PERSONAL ATTACKS THROUGHOUT THE REST OF THE NEWSLETTER, "...IS AN INSULT TO THE DIGNITY OF THE OFFICE OF THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES..." AND BRINGS THE DIGNITY OF THE MARIANAS STATUS COMMISSION ALL-TIME-LOW IN THE EYES OF MARIANAS VOTERS."

OLOPAI ALSO QUESTIONED SENATOR TENORIO'S AUTHORITY THAT THE "MAJORITY OF THE MARIANAS PEOPLE DO NOT BELIEVE IN ASSOCIATION" AS AN ALTERNATIVE STATUS FOR THE MARIANAS.

"JUDGING FROM THE LOW ATTENDANCE IN MARIANAS STATUS COMMISSION'S VILLAGE-TO-VILLAGE MEETINGS," SAID OLOPAI, "I CAN ONLY SPEAK FOR THE HANDFUL OF VOTERS THAT HAVE ATTENDED THOSE MEETINGS."

OLOPAI SAID MEETINGS IN SEVERAL VILLAGES HAVE BEEN CANCELLED DUE TO LACK OF PUBLIC INTEREST IN THE MARIANAS STATUS COMMISSION'S ACTIVITIES.

(TAIWAN FISHING VESSEL SEIZE)

SAIPAN, APRIL 17 (MNS)---A 200-TON TAIWAN FISHING VESSEL WAS CAUGHT INSIDE HELEN REEF WITH 20 CREWMEN ABOARD MONDAY (APRIL 14) BY THE MS MICRONESIA PRINCESS, ACCORDING TO BOYD MACKENZIE, SPECIAL ASSISTANT FOR DISTRICT AFFAIRS.

THE VESSEL, YUNG HO NO. 112, IS OWNED BY THE YUNG HO FISHING COMPANY IN KAONSLUNG, TAIWAN.

MACKENZIE SAID THE VESSEL WILL BE CHARGED WITH ILLEGAL ENTRY INTO TERRITORIAL WATER. HE SAID SEVERAL CREWMEN WERE CAUGHT CUTTING COCONUT TREES ON HELEN ISLAND, AN UNINHABITED ATOLL 370 MILES SOUTHWEST OF KOROR, PALAU DISTRICT CENTER.

THE MICRONESIA PRINCESS WAS ON ITS WAY TO EVACUATE THE 13 CREWMEN OF THE YUNG HO 101 THAT WENT AGROUND ON HELEN REEF LATE LAST MONTH.

THE MICRONESIA PRINCESS AND THE APPREHENDED SHIP ARE EXPECTED TO REACH KOROR SUNDAY EVENING (APRIL 20).

PONAPE, APR. 17 (MNS)---THE SPECIAL EDUCATION SECTION OF THE TRUST TERRITORY DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION IS CURRENTLY SPONSORING A TT-WIDE SPECIAL EDUCATION PLANNING CONFERENCE AT THE COMMUNITY COLLEGE OF MICRONESIA IN KOLONIA, PONAPE. THE WEEK-LONG CONFERENCE WILL END FRIDAY, (APRIL 18).

ACCORDING TO JOHN F. BIDDLE, ACTING DIRECTOR OF CCM, THE GOALS OF THE CONFERENCE INCLUDE: (1), TO DEVELOP DISTRICTS' SPECIAL EDUCATION PLANS COVERING THE NEXT THREE YEARS AND TO ISOLATE PROGRAM ACTIVITIES AND DEVELOP DISTRICTS' PROPOSALS FOR FY 1976; (2), TO DISSEMINATE INFORMATION RELATIVE TO REQUIREMENTS UNDER THE NEW 1974 AMENDMENT TO THE EHA, PL 93-380 STATE PLAN, AND TO ADDRESS OTHER ISSUES RELEVANT TO SPECIAL EDUCATION DEVELOPMENT PROJECTED FOR THE NEXT COUPLE OF YEARS.

(DENTAL CONFERENCE)

SAIPAN, APR. 17 (MNS)---THE EIGHTH ANNUAL DENTAL CONFERENCE IS CURRENTLY UNDERWAY ON SAIPAN, ACCORDING TO DR. NASAO KUMANGAI, TT DIRECTOR OF HEALTH SERVICES.

DEPUTY HIGH COMMISSIONER PETER T. COLEMAN, DELIVERED THE KEYNOTE ADDRESS, OUTLINING A BRIEF HISTORICAL BACKGROUND ON THE TT DENTAL HEALTH SERVICES DEVELOPMENTS. HE RECALLED THAT DURING THE LONG HISTORY OF FOREIGN DOMINATION IN MICRONESIA, DENTAL HEALTH CARE DELIVERY HAS EVOLVED FROM MERE CONSTRUCTION OF HOSPITALS AND HEALTH CARE CENTER TO THAT OF DEVELOPING MICRONESIAN DENTISTS TO DELIVER CARE TO THE INHABITANTS OF THE ISLANDS, THUS REPLACING FOREIGN DOCTORS AND NURSES IN MICRONESIA. AT PRESENT, THERE ARE 81 DENTAL HEALTH PERSONNEL IN MICRONESIA, 24 OF THEM DENTAL OFFICERS AND 28 DENTAL NURSES, ACCORDING TO COLEMAN.

DR. KUMANGAI SAID, THE DENTAL HEALTH DIVISION AT PRESENT IS NOW FOCUSING ON DENTAL HEALTH CARE FOR SCHOOLS WITH A GREAT EMPHASIS ON PREVENTION AND STAFF DEVELOPMENT.

THE CONFEREES ARE DISCUSSING TOPICS RANGING FROM PRENATAL, MATERNAL AND CHILD DENTAL HEALTH; REVIEWING OF DENTAL FORMS IN VARIOUS DISTRICTS, DISCUSSIONS AND EXPERT CONSULTATIONS ON CLINICAL ENDODONTICS, AND PROTHODONTICS, A COMPREHENSIVE STUDY OF OCCLUSAL REHABILITATION AND OTHERS.

FOUR CONSULTANTS ARE ALSO ATTENDING THIS YEAR'S CONFERENCE. THEY INCLUDE: CAPT. C. D. NESTER, U.S. NAVAL DENTAL CLINIC, GUAM; DR. JOHN SPEAK, SOUTH PACIFIC COMMISSION CONSULTANT; DR. EDMUND WONG, PRIVATE DENTIST FROM HAWAII AND STAFF DENTIST DR. ROBERT SHELLWORTH.

SAIPAN, APR. 17 (MNS)---THE COORDINATOR FOR THE PACIFIC CONFERENCE OF LEGISLATORS (PCL) PETE ROBERTO OF GUAM, ARRIVED IN TRUK DISTRICT TUESDAY (APRIL 15) AND MET WITH TRUK DISTRICT ADMINISTRATOR MITARO DAVIS AND THE SPEAKER OF THE TRUK DISTRICT LEGISLATURE KOICHI SANA REGARDING A FUTURE VISIT BY PCL PRESIDENT GUAM SENATOR BEN ADA, TRUK PUBLIC INFORMATION OFFICER NONA RUBEN REPORTS. DURING A MEETING WITH THE TRUK DISTAD, ROBERTO SAID THEY HAVE VISITED THE WESTERN DISTRICTS AND WILL VISIT PONAPE, MAJURO, HONOLULU BEFORE PROCEEDING TO AMERICAN SAMOA TO MAKE PLANS FOR THE UPCOMING 7TH ANNUAL PCL THAT WILL BE HELD ON JULY 21-26 OF THIS YEAR.

THE TOPICS TO DISCUSS FOR THE UPCOMING 7TH ANNUAL PCL CONFERENCE INCLUDE: DRUG ABUSE AND MEANINGFUL LEGISLATIONS; MICRONESIAN MINI-COMMON MARKET AND FOREIGN INVESTMENT; FUTURE POLITICAL STATUS; ENERGY CRISIS, TRANSPORTATION AND COMMUNICATION IN THE PACIFIC; THE LAWYERS' ROLE IN DRAFTING LEGISLATION; FEDERAL AND LOCAL RELATIONSHIP; CULTURAL PRESERVATION; EXTRADITION TREATY; GAMBLING AND OTHERS.

THE PCL COORDINATOR SAID ARTIFACTS AND ARTS AND CRAFTS FROM EACH DISTRICT WILL BE DISPLAYED DURING THE FIVE-DAY CONFERENCE ON GUAM.

SAIPAN, APRIL 17 (CONGRESS RELEASE)---THE APPOINTMENT OF MEMBERS TO THE CREDENTIALS COMMITTEE OF THE MICRONESIAN CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION WERE ANNOUNCED ON SAIPAN THIS WEEK, ACCORDING TO THE OFFICE OF THE PRE-CONVENTION COMMITTEE.

THE COMMITTEE IS COMPOSED OF THREE MEMBERS: TRUK DISTRICT COURT JUDGE SOUKICKI FRITZ, CHAIRMAN; YAP DELEGATE HILARY TACHELIOL, AND MARIANAS DELEGATE DR. FRANCISCO T. PALACIOS.

THE FUNCTION OF THE COMMITTEE, ACCORDING TO CHAIRMAN FRITZ, WILL BE TO REVIEW THE CREDENTIALS OF ALL CONVENTION DELEGATES THAT ARE ELECTED OR APPOINTED, AND MAKE DECISIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS BEFORE THE CONVENTION CONVENES.

IN AN ANNOUNCEMENT THIS WEEK, FRITZ SAID PUBLIC LAW 6-24 REQUIRED THE CREDENTIAL COMMITTEE'S WORK TO BE COMPLETED ON OR BEFORE MAY 15, 1975. ALL DELEGATES, WHETHER ELECTED OR APPOINTED, MUST FILE CREDENTIALS WITH THE COMMITTEE GIVING EVIDENCE OF THEIR STATUS AS CONCON DELEGATES NO LATER THAN APRIL 23, 1975, ACCORDING FRITZ.

FRITZ SAID OBJECTIONS TO THE CREDENTIALS OF ANY DELEGATE MUST BE RECEIVED IN WRITING NO LATER THAN MAY 7, 1975.

"THE IMPORTANCE OF THESE DATES CANNOT BE OVEREMPHASIZED," STATED CHAIRMAN FRITZ, "BECAUSE THE CREDENTIALS COMMITTEE IS REQUIRED BY LAW TO COMPLETE ITS WORK BY MAY 15."

HE SAID CREDENTIALS FROM DELEGATES AND OBJECTIONS TO CREDENTIALS OF DELEGATES OR THE SEATING OF A DELEGATE MUST BE WRITTEN AND ADDRESSED TO THE CHAIRMAN OF THE CREDENTIALS

(COLEMAN PROCLAIMS LAW DAY)

SAIPAN, APR. 17 (MNS)--"MICRONESIA'S GOAL--JUSTICE THROUGH
LAW." THIS IS THE SLOGAN TRUST TERRITORY DEPUTY HIGH COMMISSIONER
PETER T. COLEMAN ANNOUNCED THIS WEEK IN PROCLAIMING LAW DAY
MICRONESIA, WHICH WILL BE ON MAY 1ST THIS YEAR.

IN HIS PROCLAMATION, COLEMAN STATED: "EQUAL JUSTICE UNDER
LAW HAS BEEN A MICRONESIA'S GOAL EVER SINCE THE TRUSTEESHIP
AGREEMENT CAME INTO EFFECT IN 1947. AS IT HAS BEEN STATED, AN
INDEPENDENT JUDICIAL SYSTEM IS 'THE BEST EXPEDIENT WHICH CAN BE
DEvised TO SECURE A STEADY, UPRIGHT AND IMPARTIAL ADMINISTRATION
OF THE LAW.'

"WE MUST ALL SUPPORT AND PARTICIPATE IN THE OPERATIONS OF
GOVERNMENT TO INSURE THE ACHIEVEMENT OF THIS GOAL FOR EVERY
MICRONESIAN IN ALL AREAS OF SOCIAL CONCERN," COLEMAN ADDED.

COLEMAN URGED ALL CITIZENS OF THE TRUST TERRITORY TO
PARTICIPATE IN ITS OBSERVANCE THROUGH COURT VISITATIONS,
APPROPRIATE CEREMONIES, PROGRAMS AND EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES.

IN EMPHASIZING THE IMPORTANCE OF THE OCCASSION, COLEMAN
CALLED UPON EVERY CITIZEN TO "REFLECT ON THE ROLE OF THE RULE
OF LAW IN SAFEGUARDING INDIVIDUAL RIGHTS."

SAIPAN, APR. 17 (MNS)---A WEEK-LONG CONFERENCE/SEMINAR FOR
VOCATIONAL REHABILITATION COORDINATORS FROM THE SIX DISTRICTS
IS BEING HELD ON SAIPAN, ACCORDING TO TT DIRECTOR OF HEALTH
SERVICES, DR. MASAO KUMANGAI. THE DISTRICT COORDINATORS ARE
LEARNING NEW TECHNIQUES IN HEALTH EDUCATION, DEALING WITH UPDATING
AND RE-EVALUATING THE TT VOCATIONAL REHABILITATION MANUAL, SETTING
UP PLANS AND PRIORITIES, AND LEARN NEW METHODS IN CASELOAD
MANAGEMENT.
