(PLEBISCITE ON TUESDAY) 1975 SAIPAN, JUNE 16 (MNS) --- TUESDAY, JUNE 17, THE PEOPLE OF THE NORTHERN MARIANA ISLANDS WILL CAST THEIR HISTORIC VOTES TO DECIDE WHETHER THEY WILL SEPARATE FROM THE REST OF MICRONESIA AND BECOME A COMMONVEALTH OF THE UNITED STATES. SOME 5,379 PEOPLE HAVE REGISTERED TO VOTE.

UNITED NATIONS REPRESENTATIVES ARE PRESENTLY ON SAIPAN OBSERVING THE CAMPAIGN AND THE VOTE, AND HAVE HELD MEETINGS WITH PRO AND ANTI COVENANT GROUPS AS WELL AS WITH THE PLEBISCITE COMMISSIONER AND HIS STAFF; THE PLEBISCITE ADVISORY COMMITTEE

AND THE VOTER REGISTRATION BOARD. POLITICAL OBSERVERS PREDICT THAT 70 PERCENT OF THE PEOPLE WILL VOTE IN FAVOR DESPITE ORGANIZED MOVEMENTS OPPOSING

COMMONVE ALTH.

IN A MEETING WITH THE UNITED CAROLINIAN ASSOCIATION (UCA), FRIDAY (JUNE 14), UNITED NATIONS REPRESENTATIVES TOLD THE UCA THAT NOTHING CAN BE DONE TO POSTPONE THE NORTHERN MARIANAS

CHAIRMAN JAMES MUREAY OF THE UNITED KINGDOM TOLD A CROWD PLEBISCITE. OF ABOUT 150 AT THE MEETING HALL IN GARAPAN VILLAGE THAT THE MISSION CANNOT ASK THAT THE ELECTION BE POSTPONED BECAUSE THEIR (UN) ONE WEEK VISIT IS "TO OBSERVE" AND "NOT INTERFERE WITH" THE PLEBISCITE.

UCA MEMBERS CHARGED THAT THE "LACK OF POLITICAL EDUCATION" REQUIRED THE POSTPONING THE PLEBISCITE.

SUNDAY (JUNE 15) ABOUT 250 CARS PARADED THROUGH THE ROADS OF SAIPAN URGING SUPPORT FOR THE U.S. COMMONWEALTH COVENANT PROPOSAL. THE MOTORCADE, ORGANIZED BY FRIENDS OF COMMONWEALTH GROUP, PARADED THROUGH SAIPAN VILLAGES FOR MORE THAN FOUR HOURS.

ABOUT 300 YARDS FROM WHERE THE PROCOVENANT GROUP WERE ASSEMBLING THEIR CARS FOR THE MOTORCADE, THE "FRIENDS FOR BETTER COMMONWEALTH" GROUP HELD THEIR RALLY. ANTICOVENANT SPEAKERS CONGRESSMAN OSCAR C. RASA AND COUNCILMAN DINO JONES SPOKE AT THE RALLY MAINTAINING THEIR POSITION TO VOTE AGAINST THE COVENANT.

IT IS EXPECTED THAT SEVERAL PRO AND ANTICOVENANT GROUPS WILL APPEAR ON TELEVISION AND RADIO MONDAY NIGHT, ONE DAY BEFORE THE PLEBISCITE IN A LAST DITCH EFFORT TO GAIN SUPPORT FOR THEIR POSITIONS. THE POLLS WILL BE OPEN TUESDAY MORNING AT SEVEN AND WILL BE CLOSED AT SEVEN P.M. CHATHAWAY SWORN IN)

WASHINGTON, JUNE 16 (MNS) --- STANLEY K. HATHAWAY, FORMER GOVERNOR OF WYOMING. WAS SWORN IN FRIDAY AS SECRETARY OF THE INTERIOR. ENDING A 43-DAY STRETCH IN WHICH THE DEPARTMENT LACKED A CABINET-LEVEL LEADER, ACCORDING TO UNITED PRESS INTERNATIONAL (UPI).

PRESIDENT FORD ATTENDED THE CEREMONY AT THE INTERIOR DEPARTMENT AND PLEDGED THAT "I WILL GIVE HIM TOTAL SUPPORT... WE'RE GOING TO WORK TOGETHER FOR THE PRESERVATION OF THE NATION'S AMAZING NATURAL RESOURCES."

HATHAWAY, WHO WAS OPPOSED BY ENVIRONMENTAL GROUPS AND GET A PROLONGED GRILLING IN HIS SENATE CONFIRMATION HEARINGS, WAS GIVEN A ROYAL WELCOME WITH THE RED-JACKETED MARINE BAND PLAYING POPULAR MEDLEYS NEAR THE FLOWER-DECKED STAGE, UPI INDICATED.

OUTLINING HIS VIEW OF THE DEPARTMENT'S ROLE, HATHAWAY SAID, "WE CANNOT RELY ON CONSERVATION ALONE TO PROVIDE THE ENERGY SECURITY WE NEED TO SUSTAIN OUR ECONOMY AND OUR WAY OF LIFE.

"WE MUST DEVELOP, IN A PRUDENT AND RATIONAL MANNER, MORE OF CUR DOMESTIC ENERGY RESOURCES." UPI CONCLUDED.

(REMENGES AU CALLS SPECIAL SESSION)

KOROR, JUNE 16 (MNS) --- PALAU DISTRICT ADMINISTRATOR THOMAS D. REMENGESAU ISSUED A PROCLAMATION THIS WEEK CALLING FOR A SPECIAL SESSION OF THE FITH PALAU DISTRICT LEGISLATURE TO BE HELD FOR FOUR DAYS BEGINNING TUESDAY (JUNE 17), ACCORDING TO PALAU PUBLIC INFORMATION OFFICER DAVID NGIRMIDOL.

THE LEGISLATURE WILL MEET TO CONSIDER THE TWO DRAFT CONSTITUTIONS RECENTLY COMPLETED BY THE PALAU CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION, A LEGISLATION FOR DISTRICT-WIDE REFERENDUM, LAND, AND OTHER AREAS WHICH MAY BE DEEMED URGENT AND APPROPRIATE.

THIS WILL BE THE LAST SESSION OF THE FIFTH PALAU LEGISLATURE BEFORE THE ELECTION FOR NEW MEMBERSHIP SCHEDULED TO BE HELD IN SEPTEMBER OF THIS YEAR.

(ALL USERS: PLEASE CREDIT CONGRESS OF MICRONESIA) (MICRONESIAN DELEGATION RETURNED)

SAIPAN, JUNE 16 (CONGRESS RELEASE)---THE MICRONESIAN DELEGATION TO THE UNITED NATIONS LAW OF THE SEA CONFERENCE RECENTLY RETURNED FROM GENEVA, SWITZERLAND FOLLOWING THE THIRD SESSION OF THE CONFERENCE.

ACCORDING TO CONGRESSMAN CHARLES DOMNICK, CHAIRMAN OF THE MICRONESIAN DELEGATION, THE GOAL OF THE CONFERENCE COMPOSED OF NEARLY 150 NATIONS AND A NUMBER OF OBSERVER COUNTRIES INCLUDING MICRONESIA IS TO PRODUCE A TREATY TO BE SIGNED BY ALL NATIONS SETTING OUT AS PRECISELY AS POSSIBLE NEW INTERNATIONAL LAW REGARDING THE SEA.

THE CONFERENCE PRODUCED A STATEMENT, WHICH HAS NOT YET BEEN FINALIZED OR FORMALLY ADOPTED WHICH PROVIDES THAT ALL COASTAL STATES, INCLUDING ISLAND STATES WOULD BE GRANTED A 200 MILE EXLUSIVE ECONOMIC ZONE.

THE 200 MILE JURISDICTION WOULD COVER ALL RESOURCES INCLUDING THOSE OF GREATEST IMPORTANCE TO MICRONESIA SUCH AS TUNA, PETROLIUM, AND SEA-BED MANGANESE NODULES. HE SAID, HOWEVER, THAT THERE WERE EFFORTS BY A NUMBER OF COUNTRIES IN THE CONFERENCE TO DENY OR REDUCE THE SIZE OF THE ZONE AS APPLIED TO SMALL ISLANDS.

DOMNICK SAID THIS EFFORT WAS STRONGLY OPPOSED BY THE MICRONESIAN DELEGATION. HE NOTED THAT THE EFFORT TO ACQUIRE FAIR AND EQUAL APPLICATION OF THE 200 MILE ZONE CONCEPT TO ISLAND STATES WAS SUCCESSFUL IN THAT THE ONLY EXCEPTION TO THE 200 MILE ZONE CONCEPT CONTAINED IN THE SINGLE NEGOTIATING STATEMENT RESULTS IN ROCKY ELEVATIONS INCAPABLE OF SUSTAINING "HUMAN HABITATION OR ECONOMIC LIFE" BEING DENIED AN ECONOMIC ZONE.

HE SAID THIS EXCEPTION DOES EFFECT MICRONESIA IN THAT TWO OR THREE ISLANDS IN THE NORTHERN MOST PART OF THE MARIANAS MIGHT BE CONSIDERED ROCKY ELEVATIONS, AND THEREFORE DENIED A ZONE.

A PROPOSAL WAS ALSO SUBMITTED IN THE CONFERENCE BY A NUMBER OF AFRICAN STATES WHICH IF INCLUDED IN THE TREATY WOULD DENY AN ECONOMIC ZONE TO ANY ENTITY UNDER FOREIGN DOMINATION SUCH AS THE CASE OF MICRONESIA TODAY, ACCORDING TO DOMNICK.

HE SAID THIS WAS MOTIVATED BY A DESIRE TO ENCOURAGE INDEPENDENCE MOVEMENTS AND BY A FEELING BY A NUMBER OF LESS DEVELOPED STATES THAT A COLONIAL POWER SHOULD NOT BE PERMITTED TO ACQUIRE THE RESOURCE RIGHTS OF ITS COLONIES.

DOMNICK SAID THAT BECAUSE OF NICRONESIA'S RELATIONSHIP WITH THE UNITED STATES, THIS PROPOSAL WOULD HAVE RESULTED IN A DENIAL OF AN ECONOMIC ZONE FOR MICRONESIA DURING THE COURSE OF THE TRUSTEESHIP AND THEREAFTER, DEPENDING UPON THE OUTCOME OF THE POLITICAL STATUS NEGOTIATIONS.

THE AFRICAN PROPOSAL, HOWEVER, WAS MODIFIED SO AS TO PROVIDE THAT THE INHABITANTS OF ENTITIES UNDER FOREIGN DOMINATION BE

PERMITTED TO OWN AND EXERCISE THE RESOURCE RIGHTS IN THEIR ECONOMIC ZONE, ACCORDING TO DOMNICK.

DOMNICK SAID THERE WAS AN AGREEMENT AT THE END OF THE CONFERENCE THAT ANOTHER FULL SUBSTANTIVE SESSION SHOULD BE HELD NEXT YEAR IN AN ATTEMPT TO CONCLUDE A TREATY. HE SAID IT DOES SEEMS LIKELY THAT THERE WILL BE A NEGOTIATED TREATY COMPLETED NEXT YEAR AND THAT IT WILL BE FAVORABLE ON ALL ISSUES OF MAJOR IMPORTANCE TO MICRONESIA, HE NOTED HOWEVER, THAT IT IS POSSIBLE THAT THE ATTEMPT TO FORMULATE A COMMON VIEW IN THE FORM OF A TREATY MAY FAIL IF THE TREND TOWARD THE PASSAGE OF DIVERSE NATIONAL LEGISLATION CONTINUES.

THE NEXT SESSION OF THE UNITED NATIONS LAW OF THE SEA CONFERENCE WILL BE HELD IN NEW YORK NEXT YEAR AROUND MARCH. MEMBERS OF THE MICRONESIAN DELEGATION BESIDES CHAIRMAN CHARLES DOMNICK ARE: SENATOR NICK BOSSY, VICE-CHAIRMAN; CONGRESSMAN LUKE TMAN, MEMBER; AND CUNGRESSMAN RESIO MOSES, MEMBER. THE DELEGATION WAS ACCOMPANIED BY ANDON. AMARAICH, SPECIAL CONSULTANT TO THE CHAIRMAN; FREDRICK RAMP, COUNSEL AND FREDERICK S. WYLE, SPECIAL COUNSEL.
